A grave scandal has been brought to light in Cairo, which has caused a great sensation in political circles. Three P. shes have been arrested, one of them being no less important a personage than the President of the Legislative Council. They are charged with having been concerned in the traffic in Sudanese slave girls for Egypt. The accused are to be prosecuted for the offence.

I rarely, as you know, take sides in politics. My golden rule has always been to be nothing discriminate, nor to see down aught in malice, and if I overstep in this instance it is from pure patriotism. I have resided in this colony for forty-two years. Li Hung Chang, the Chief Minister of China, has since condemned several officers and soldiers who were concerned in the outrage to be beheaded. He has also ordered that the Mission-house, which was destroyed at the same time, shall be rebuilt, and that a special tax shall be levied on the locality for the benefit of Mr Wylie's family.

It is stated that most of the Ministers will be opposed, and that Mr Greenhill, who ran the Premier so close at the last election, will take the field again, and Mr Oulton, of Kangar, will enter the lists against Mr McColl. Mr Baker will again be met by an opponent in Lowan, and Mr McIntyre at Maldon. There seems no doubt that Mr G. D. Carter will not allow the work for Melbourne. Rumors are already afloat as to the number of private members whose seats will be contested.

To WASH FLANNELS.—In washing flannels (notice particularly), to keep them a good colour, and to prevent their shrinking. Get from the grocer 1 lb. or 2 lb. (according to the size of your washing) of soap parings, which you will get cheap; for 1 lb. of soap parings, put three quarts of water; boil to a jelly with this wash your flannels. Be sure you have plenty of warm water, not too hot; put in a handful of your soap jelly, and mix thoroughly in the warm water. Take the flannels, one at a time, shake all dust out of them first; then squeeze the articles up and down well; rub as little as possible, for rubbing knots the little loops of wool together, and thickens them; wring them in a machine, if you have one; if not, squeeze them well. Dry in the open air, if the weather permits, as quickly as possible. In washing scarlet or blue flannel, put one tablespoonful of spirits of ammonia in the rinsing water.

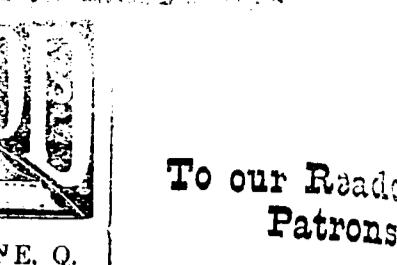
