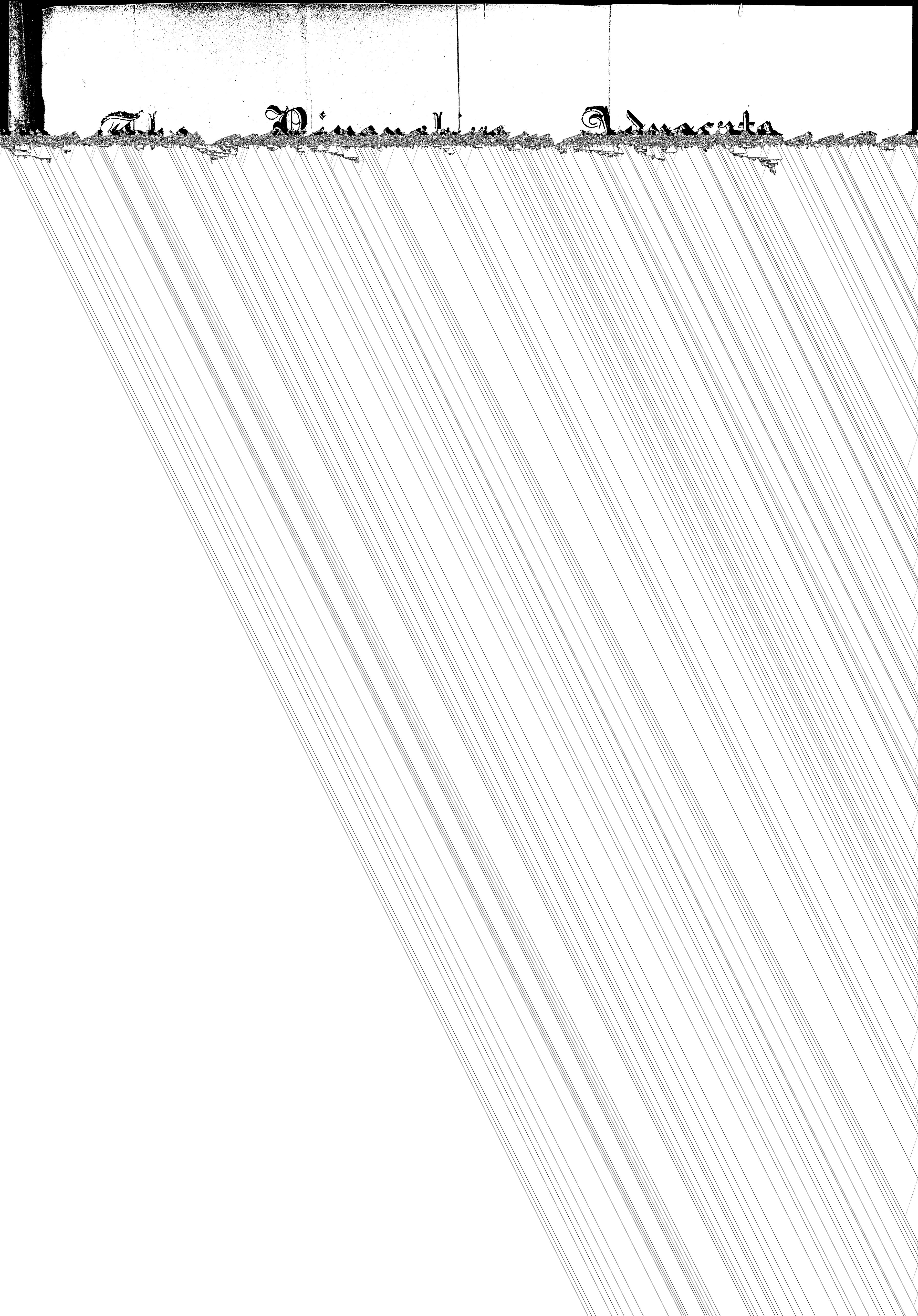

Thus so late as the reign of James the First, our best writers used the verb "to honest" for "to honour." In the older authors, honesty also means honour. Chaucer uses it, as in Latin, for decency or good manners. In the verse of our version of the 14th chapter of Corinthians I says, "Let all things be done decently." "Who'st version gave, 'Be all things done honestly.'" In the last century Dr Sharpe wrote "What is to live honestly? Why everybody it knows the meaning of that phrase is to frame our lives according to the laws of virtue and religion, it is to lead a godly and upright life, and to live righteously, soberly, and honestly in this present world." But when William Temple came nearer to our present ideas when he wrote "The duty and their promise; and it is properly the object of trust; in our language, it goes rather by the name of honesty; though what we call an honest man, the Romans called a good man."

The difficulties which were experienced last summer in making butter at a temperature of over 90 degrees were now removed, as the directors have very wisely added a refrigerator to the plant. This will undoubtedly result in the production of a much better article, and with favorable markets will command better prices. Messrs. Humble and Nicholson, of Beaufort, were the successful tenderers at £150, and this firm supplied a new ammonia ammonia compressor refrigerator, which is capable of cooling 800 cwt. to 32 deg., or making 5 cwt. of ice. The ammonia pump is worked off a counter shaft, driven by the engine, and present used in the factory by a condenser, where the ammonia is pumped through pipes into the freezing coils, where expansion takes place, and the heat is absorbed, the ammonia then passing back to the compressor and repeating its work. In the cooling chamber, which is 16x20x7, there is an accumulator, keeping the room at the same temperature for about 30 hours without working the machine. The cooling chamber which is divided into two compartments, with double walls of pine filled with charcoal, which acts as a non-conductor of heat, so as to reduce to the proper temperature for churning, and in the other the butter is stored and kept in a firm state previous to shipment. The fittings of the refrigerator are made of copper, and Mr. S. J. Williams, who is making a good job of it.

The latest advice from the seat of war in the Far East states that 25,000 Chinese troops are entrenched on the right bank of the Yalu River. The Japanese are encamped on the left or Korean side of the river, and are awaiting the arrival of heavy artillery before making an attack on the Chinese position. A rumor is current at Shanghai that the Japanese have captured Port Arthur, which is situated on the southern extremity of the Manchurian peninsula. The rumor is, however, vague, and at present lacks confirmation. It was reported a few days ago that a Japanese force had been landed at Jassada, and was menacing Port Arthur, which was garrisoned by 10,000 Chinese troops. The Chinese Government has issued an order that all foreigners shall at once leave Peking. Russia is making arrangements to send six cruisers of her "Volunteer fleet" to Vladivostok. This fleet consists of about twelve merchantmen, which in time of war can be easily armed and used as cruisers. It is reported that Japan has rejected the proposals made by China with a view to the termination of the war considering that they are quite inadequate. These proposals were the payment of a war indemnity by China and the recognition of the independence of Korea. The Japanese Government have already announced the terms upon which they are prepared to make peace, namely, the occupation of Korea by Japan until the necessary reforms are effected in that country, the payment of a war indemnity by the Chinese government, and a guarantee that China will abstain from any interference whatever in the administration of Korea. The Times administration of Korea. The Times of the 16th inst. severely criticises the policy of the British Government with regard to the war now raging between China and Japan. It appears that Lord Rosebery has made a proposal to the Powers that joint action should be taken to put an end to the war. The Times states that not a single power is willing to adopt this proposal, and strongly condemns the Government for taking such a course, stigmatising Lord Rosebery's proposal as an "incredible blunder." The Japanese have established outposts on the left bank of that river. A general determination is expressed in China to fight out the quarrel to the bitter end. The government is taking further precautions to strengthen the British naval forces in Chinese waters. Two hundred blue jackets and marines have been sent out to the China squadron by way of Hankow. It was recently reported that Li Hung Chang, the Viceroy of Peh-chih, had been degraded by his superior, the Governor of Hien-shan, for corruption in purchasing a large number of worthless rifles from a German firm. The statement is now authoritatively denied. It is also denied that there is any truth in the report that a serious rebellion had broken out 100 miles from the treaty port of Hankow. The Japanese admit that the statement that an army of 30,000 men left Hiroshima last month on a secret expedition was untrue. They assert that their object in giving currency to the story was to "blow" the enemy. The newspapers express great indignation at the action of the big berillians in refusing to allow war correspondents to accompany their forces. In order to provide additional revenue for carrying on the war, Japan will shortly raise the duties on various imported articles. "Argus."

CALENDAR OF OPERATIONS FOR OCTOBER.

In October, there are most seeds sown than in any other month of the year. Best crops should be put in early, the advantage of such as carrots and parsnips being that when sown they can be stored in dry sand and supply vegetables when other varieties are exhausted.

Spinage—Sow 4 of an inch deep in rows 1 foot apart. The seed may be sown now but better results will be obtained from plants 1 dozen of which are sown in 16, and which come into bearing weeks earlier than the plants raised from seed sown now.
