SECRETARY MORTON'S REPORT.

Report on Free Seeds—American Park and Seed Co.—Exports of Apples. In the annual report of J. Sterling Morton, secretary of agriculture, the following points are considered: During the nine months ending September 30, 1897, the farmers and stock raisers of the United States have sold and exported to Great Britain 905,740 bushels of wheat, valued at \$23,100,000. During the same period of the year 1896 only 182,611 bushels were exported from the United States to Great Britain at a value of \$5,100,000. During the first six months of the year 1897 there were exported to the United Kingdom of Great Britain 112,000,000 bushels of wheat, valued at \$3,000,000,000. This trade is almost entirely in the hands of American farmers.

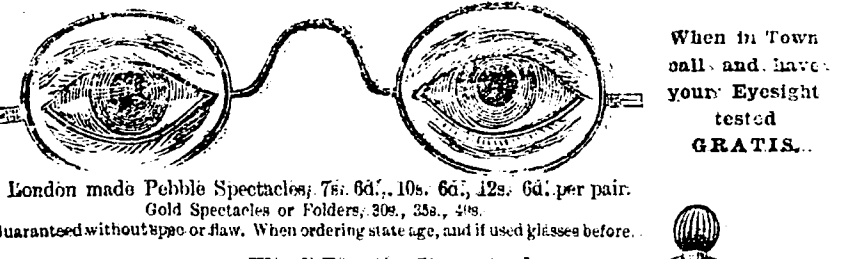
