ABOUT AIRSHIPS. A notable book on flying machines has been written by Sir Hiram Maxim, and will probably be published next month.

It will contain more than 100 photographs and mechanical drawings. The book," said Sir Hiram Maxim, "is the result of 25 years' observation and study, but it is not a text-book. It has been written to read."

Within two years from the present time," he said, "the flying machine industry will have reached a stage where capitalists will be willing to invest money."

"Count Zeppelin will never succeed in making a practical airship on his present lines, and the military people at Aldershot are simply wasting their time."

Nolfi Secunda was made of that material, and it was the first possible balloon that could be made with everything in its favor. It was made to return to its home of departure."

ARE BALD HEADS UNDIGNIFIED? By Our Hairless Contributor.

I read recently that, when a man loses his hair, he loses his dignity. This may be true enough of losing your hair in the cold, but otherwise it strikes me as a most preposterous assertion.

It is true that I myself am bald-headed, but I propose to discuss the matter in no prejudiced spirit, but in the cold, calm light of reason.

In the first place, it is notorious that bald heads and brains are closely allied. Professor Sinclorovski, the eminent Russian scientist, explains this phenomenon by reference to the simple fact that clever men have always thin skulls in which the hairs can take but precarious root. Moreover, the clever man's brain being constantly in a state of great excitement, it rapidly expands and contracts, thus loosening the foundations of the hair; while, owing to the heat evolved during mental exercises, the juices of the hair are dried up, and it dies away.

Would you, sir or madam, like to be employed by a doctor with a mop of hair, or by a woman with a cloud of curls? 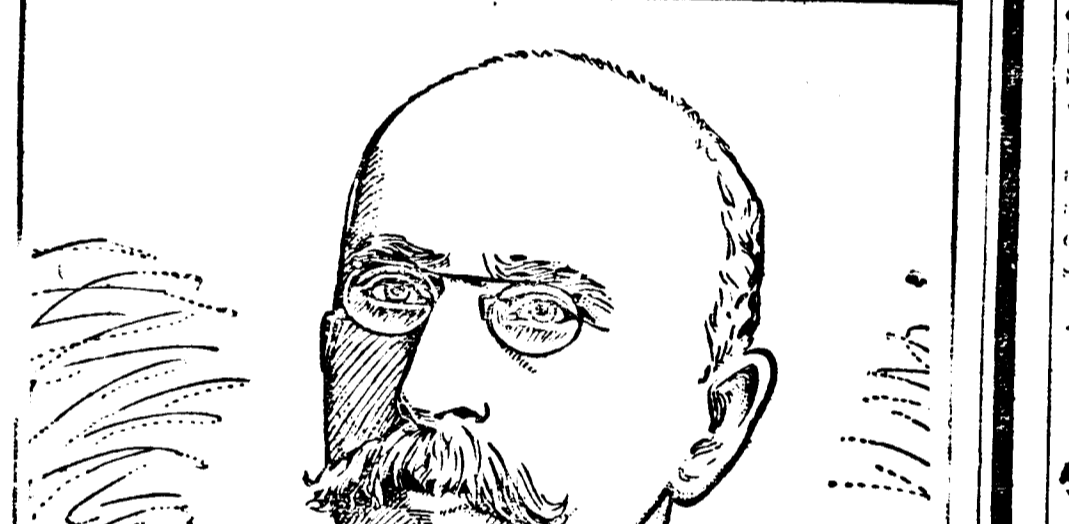
