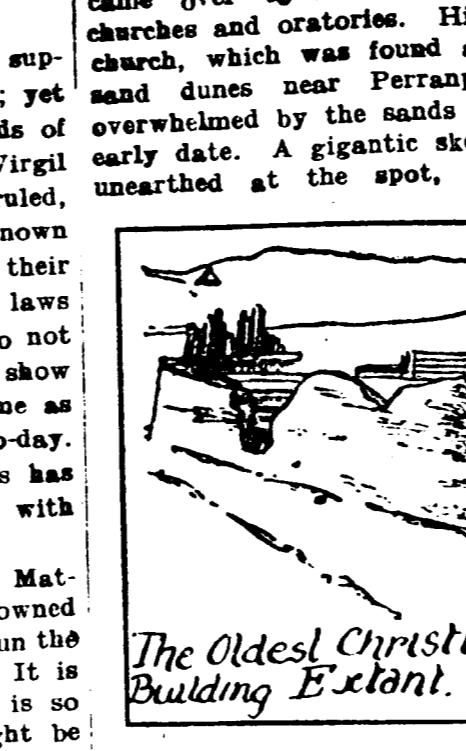

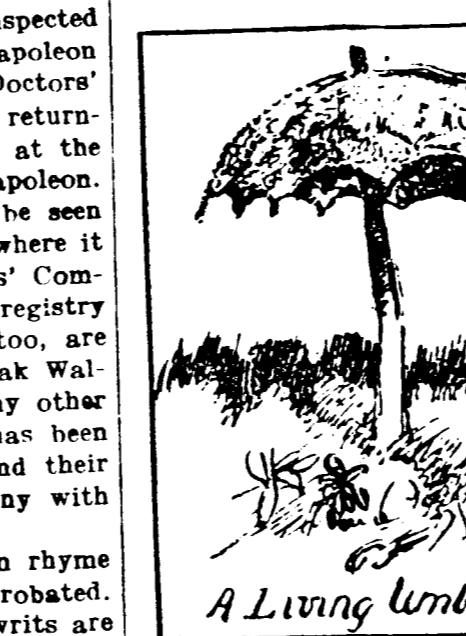

A LIVING UMBRELLA.

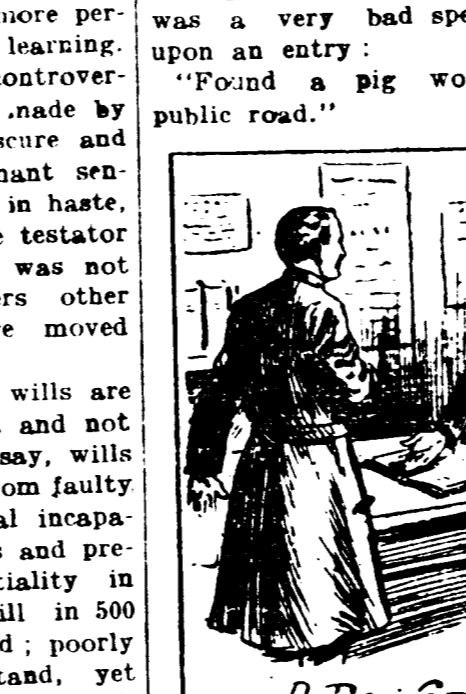

BEAUFORT AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY.

The annual meeting of the Beaufort Agricultural Society was held at the Shire Hall on Wednesday evening.

CORRESPONDENCE. Routine correspondence was received.

BALANCE-SHEET. The balance-sheet for the year ending 20th September, 1911, as printed and circulated, was read by the secretary (Mr W. H. Halpin).

The auditor (Mr A. Parker) reported as follows: I have this day carefully examined the books and accounts of your society, and have pleasure in certifying to the correctness of the same...

Mr R. A. D. Sinclair moved that the auditor's report and the balance-sheet be received. Seconded by Mr H. B. Seager, and carried.

The president, in moving the adoption of the balance-sheet, said the fact of there being such a handsome balance in the bank spoke well for the secretary.

The action of the executive committee in hiring sheep from Mr Halpin for use at the sheep dog trial was endorsed.

The president welcomed Messrs O'Neil, Cringle, Penny, and Tucker to the meeting.

ACCOUNTS.

The following accounts were passed for payment:—A. Parker audit fee, £1 11; printing, £1 12; president's railway fare to Shepperton conference, £2 0 3.

ELECTION OF OFFICERS. The president, in vacating the chair, thanked the members for the assistance they had given him during his term of office.

Mr R. A. D. Sinclair was voted to the chair. Regret was expressed by several members at the fact that the senior vice-president (Mr E. W. Hughes), whose absence was apologised for by the secretary, could not see his way clear to accept the position of president.

Mr H. B. Seager was elected president, on the motion of Messrs D. R. Hannah and W. Lynch, and cordially thanked the members for the honor conferred upon him, appealing for a better attendance at meetings of members than in the past.

Mr Sinclair moved that the best thanks of the meeting be conveyed to Mr W. Lynch, the ex-president, for the thoroughly satisfactory manner in which he had conducted the society's business during his term of office.

The other officers were elected as follows:—Senior vice-president, Mr W. Glover; junior vice-president, Mr A. M. Hannah; secretary, Mr W. H. Halpin (the salary being fixed at £25); treasurer, Mr J. R. Wotherspoon; auditor, Mr A. Parker; executive committee, Messrs W. Lynch, R. A. D. Sinclair, G. Topper, J. H. Gazzard, D. Stewart, C. Cushing, D. R. Hannah, D. and W. J. Stevenson, E. W. Hughes, T. Schlicht, G. A. Dunnet, B. Beggs, M. O'Loughlan, A. Kelly, and A. H. Holdsworth.

GENERAL BUSINESS.

A bonus of £5 was passed to the secretary in consideration of extra work entailed by lectures,

etc., on the motion of Messrs A. M. Hannah and T. W. Schlicht; Messrs Sinclair and Seager speaking in support.

Mr Halpin returned thanks. A bonus of £1 1 was also passed to Mrs Lowe.

A letter held over from last meeting from the Chamber of Agriculture, in reference to securing a uniformity of rules and constitution of Agricultural Societies, and containing suggestions in regard to prize schedules, the awarding of champion ribbons, and a board of appeal to deal with protests, was discussed at considerable length.

Mr R. A. D. Sinclair moved that no action be taken. Seconded by Mr T. Schlicht. Mr D. R. Hannah moved that the support of the society be given to the proposals of the Chamber of Agriculture. Seconded by Mr A. M. Hannah. The motion was defeated.

SPRING SHOW QUESTION.

The president announced that owing to the date fixed for the Beaufort spring show clashing with the Clunes fixture on 24th Nov., the executive committee had made a further alteration to Decr. 1st.

Mr A. M. Hannah moved that the Beaufort show be held on Wednesday, 29th Nov., stating that next year he would fight for a Friday. Seconded by Mr W. R. Glover.

An animated discussion then arose, in which the legality of holding a spring show this year in face of the result of the recent referendum was questioned by Mr Sinclair, who maintained that they could not hold the show in November when the referendum papers distinctly stated that it was to be held in October.

Mr D. R. Hannah said Mr Sinclair was splitting straws.

Messrs A. M. Hannah and W. H. Halpin pointed out that this had occurred owing to a clerical error, and that the referendum papers should have read "Are you in favor of a spring show?"

Mr Sinclair moved as an amendment that a spring show be held in 1912 instead of 1911. Seconded by Mr J. A. Harris.

Mr A. M. Hannah said a small minority were dictating to a large majority.

Mr Sinclair rose to a point of order. He did not think those remarks were fair at all.

The president asked Mr A. M. Hannah to confine himself to the subject under discussion.

Mr A. M. Hannah said he was simply speaking his mind, and reiterated his former statement.

The president repeated his request, Mr A. M. Hannah answering that he did not intend his remarks to reflect on anyone.

Mr D. R. Hannah said he was sitting on a rail in regard to holding a second show this year, and wished to hear an expression of opinion. He did not want to see any feeling, and was quite prepared to fall in with the majority.

Mr Howard Penny spoke in favor of a spring show from the Ballarat exhibitors' point of view.

Mr Lynch was opposed to a spring show altogether, and was prepared to move a further amendment to the effect that the society revert to the autumn show in March.

Mr D. R. Hannah threw out a suggestion for next year which another member had made to him, that as it was of no use to talk of showing sheep in December, a sheep show be held on the same date each year as the dog trial.

If they fixed the stallion parade for the same date and threw in a few events, such as a hackney over hurdles, they could make a good day of it.

On being put to the meeting after further discussion, Mr Sinclair's amendment was lost.

Upon its being accepted by the president, Mr Lynch moved as a further amendment that the society revert to the autumn show in March. This was seconded by Mr D. R. Hannah (who announced that he intended to vote against it).

Upon the amendment (for which only the mover voted) being lost, Mr A. M. Hannah's motion, that the show be held on Wednesday, 29th Nov., 1911, was carried unanimously.

REVISION OF PRIZE SCHEDULE.

The meeting to revise the prize schedule was fixed for Tuesday evening, 26th inst.

Misses Sinclair and Schlicht were appointed to revise the miscellaneous class and make suggestions to the meeting; and several suggestions made by Mr Penny for the amendment of sections in the class for horses were noted.

In view of the nearness of a State election, those who are qualified to vote and whose names are not on the roll should take the earliest opportunity of getting them there. The rolls have been open for inspection for some time past. They have, on the whole, been carefully compiled by the police, who have missed very few qualified electors.

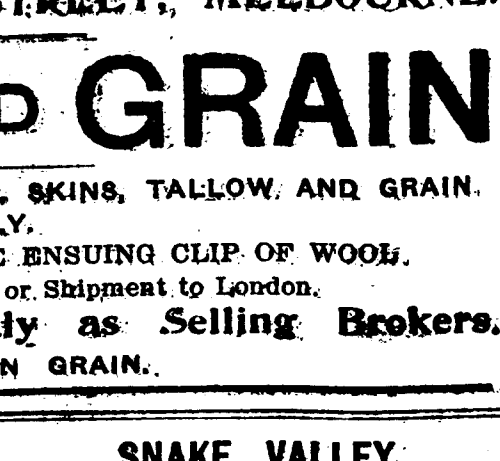

### USEFUL HINTS.

**Wash Clothes in Paraffin Soap.**—Wash clothes in paraffin soap and put it into a bucket of water to melt. Rub the clothes well with the water. Then take them into the boiler and let them boil for half an hour; then wash them into a tub with plenty of water; wash them thoroughly, then rinse in clear water and dry.

**Clean Linen.**—Gold and silver ornaments of this description may be more easily cleaned with spirits of wine, either plain or diluted with an equal weight of water. The common practice of using alkali for cleaning silver is very injurious, and frequently destroys the beauty of the articles, instead of cleaning them.

**Messianic Lint.**—Take a little of fuller's earth, a little of white soap, 30c of fuller's earth, and a pint of vinegar. Mode: Extract the oil of the vinegar by pounding and pressing them; then put the soap and fuller's earth and beat all together. When cool, pour the vinegar on this mixture, and the oil will disappear, if not so bad as to be used for the lint.

**Prevent Floods.**—Some mistresses make a practice of coating the floors of bed-rooms with linseed oil, and the oil is not only a nuisance, but it is also dangerous to the health of the people who occupy the bed-rooms, and it is also liable to catch fire. The oil should be allowed to dry out of the room, and the window should be left open to allow the steam to escape.

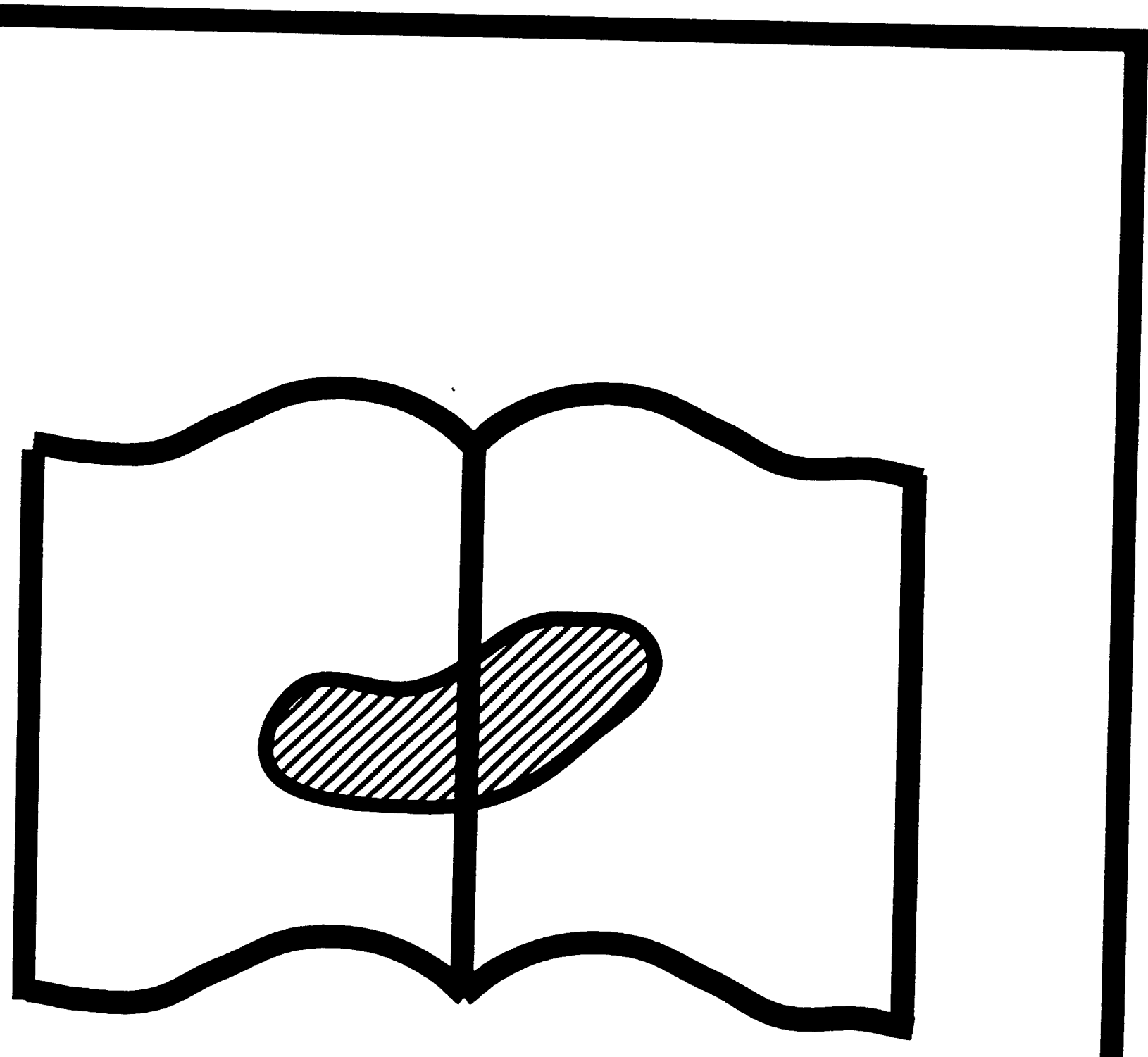

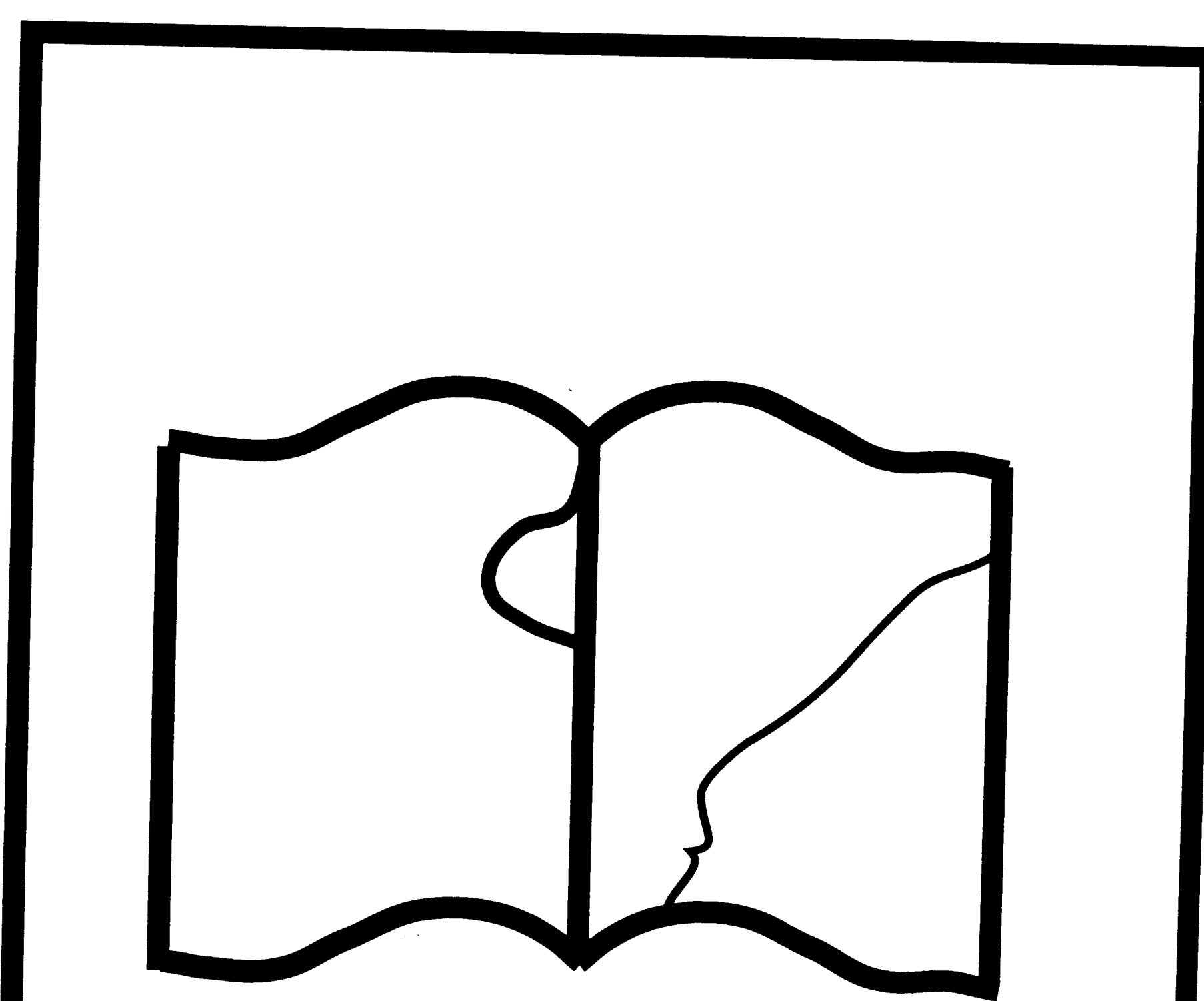
