Here you will see remembrance of every campaign of recent years, including King Theobald's cap and gold seal, presented to Queen Victoria at the conclusion of the Abyssinian War; the scarlet sash, edged with gold, captured from the late Kaiser of Afghanistan; and the crimson banner of Wad Bishara, which fell into Lord Kitchener's hands at Pretet.

Here, too, is to be seen a wonderful collection of old china, consisting of 10,000 pieces, and valued at over £10,000.

Among the furniture are the writing desk given by Henry VIII to Anne Boleyn on their wedding day; and a Venetian chair, used by the Popes, and dated 1678.

There is also a solid silver table of the same period.

The King's collection of feather cloaks is valued at £10,000. They are composed of gold, black, and various feathers from the wings of a now extinct species of parrot, and were given to George IV, by the King of the Sandwich Islands in 1821.

Not far away may be found the collection of water-colours King George III inherited from his mother, which included 157 in all, many of them of great value. One, painted at the Colchester sale in 1897, is valued at £10,000.

Not the least interesting feature of the Royal Museum is the collection of gold keys, presented to King George and his royal predecessors on the occasion of important events, to each of which is attached a brief account of the ceremony with which it is connected.

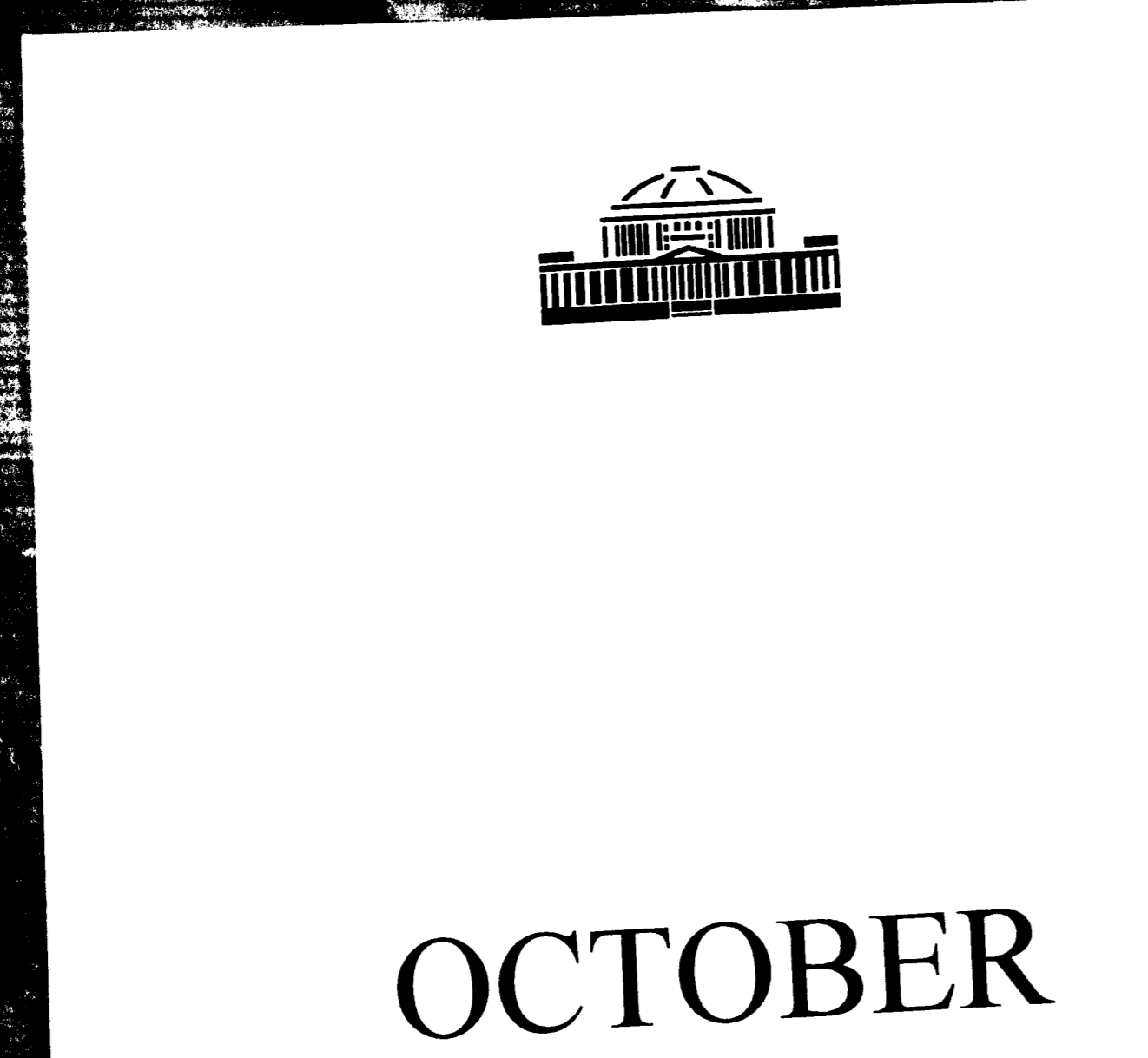
