### TO HELP CHARITIES FOR CHILDREN.

Few charitable efforts can make a stronger appeal to the hearts of the community than the annual Wattle Day Appeal collection in aid of charities for children. The Children's Welfare Association of Victoria, whose headquarters are at 119 Swanston street, Melbourne, is now engaged in organizing the appeal for 1933, which will be made in Friday, August 21st.

On that day, enthusiastic buttons, brooches, and sprigs of wattle blossom will be sold in the streets of Melbourne and suburbs, and also throughout the State to the extent of the cooperation which can be secured from provincial sympathisers. Last year the collections totalled £2725, and 65 children's institutions were materially benefited thereby. These included homes and orphanages for boys and girls, baby health centres, creches and free kindergartens, fountains for play, holiday homes to children, etc. An effort is being made this year to secure the practical interest of school children throughout the State, and the honorary organizer (Mrs J. S. Winter) is hopeful that she will materially help to secure an even better collection than last year. She will be grateful to receive a consignment of wattle from this district. If addressed, Wattle Day Appeal, it will be carried free on 22nd and 24th of August on the railways.

At a meeting of the Skipton Old Boys' and Girls' Association on Monday night, members agreed to forward a letter of congratulation to Mr. S. Drennon (an old Skipton boy) for the success he had achieved by his appointment to the position of secretary to the Australian Workers' Union.

The annual meeting in connection with the Skipton Town Council was held on Saturday night. The balance sheet showed a credit of £39/19/2. The retiring managers (Messrs J. Conding, W. Shaw, and M. Shannon) were re-elected, and Mr. R. Boyle was appointed auditor. A vote of thanks was recorded on the minute for an appreciation of the services rendered by the managers during the past year.

At a meeting of members of the Skipton school committee and the Old Boys' and Girls' Association, held on Monday night, it was agreed to hold a monster fair during March, under the auspices of the State school and the Old Boys' and Girls' Association.

The school committee is to receive 70 per cent. of the net takings, Mr. J. Rowe was elected president of the movement, Messrs. McIntyre and T. Williams vice-presidents, Misses Exiles and Belle joint secretaries, treasurer, Mr. W.
