Herbert O'Howd, poet and Parliamentary draftsman, is one of the most interesting personalities Australian has produced. Born in April, 1866, at Beaufort, where his father was a policeman, young O'Howd received his education in a local private school, whence he passed on to State schools at Croyham, Soldiers' Hill, Ballarat, and Mt. Pleasant, from which, with a State school exhibition, which he won at the same time as Judge Wasley, he went to the Gravelly College, Ballarat. He passed the first year B.A. there, but, owing to the death of his father, he had to leave out for himself, and taught at St. Stephen's R.C. school, Ballarat, for a time. He then fell a victim to the waunder-bait, and put in some time along the banks of the Murray. He returned eventually to his native place, where he ran a private school. He joined the State public service in 1896 and, from 1897 to 1913 was the assistant librarian at the Supreme Court library. He was then appointed Assistant Parliamentary Draftsman, which position he now holds. Brought up an R.C., he studied in Spirituality, and taught in the Melbourne Lyceum (of which the late Lord Dunsin was one of the first conductors). Theology, and all things occult, both theoretical and practical. Eventually he became president of the Nationalist Association. His book "Downward" is said by Professor Tucker to be the best book of verses yet published in Australia. Categories have made their appearance in the Rochester and Corp district.
