**WATERLOO ROAD TRAGEDY.**

**THE INQUIRY.**

At the Beaufort Court House on Saturday afternoon, Mr D. F. Troy, J.P., held an inquest concerning the death of John William Peck, 38 years of age, electric tram motorman, of Geelong West, who was found on Friday evening, 23rd inst., on the Waterloo road, a mile and a half from Beaufort, fatally shot through the head.

Allan Rutherford, telegraph messenger, employed at the Beaufort P.O., and residing at Waterloo, gave evidence that on Friday, 23rd January, 1925, he left his home at Waterloo at about 6.25 p.m. He was riding his bicycle into Beaufort. On the Waterloo road, about a mile and a half from Beaufort, he saw the body of a man lying on the roadside. He saw a gun lying between the man's legs, resting over the body. There were a leather travelling bag and an overcoat close to the body. That would be about 6.45 p.m. He did not make an examination of the body. He went straight to the police station and reported what he had seen to Senior-constable Williamson. He did not know deceased.

John James Jones, farmer and grazier, Wallaloo, stated on oath that he had viewed the body of deceased, now lying at the Camp hotel, Beaufort. He identified the body as that of John William Peck, who was a married man and had four children and resided at Upper Church Street, Geelong West. Witness last saw deceased alive at Geelong West about 20th December, 1924. Deceased seemed at that time to be in a normal state of health, but had previously been suffering from nerve trouble. Deceased had to leave his work—that of a motor man on the Geelong electric tram— and was about 5 weeks away from work. Deceased then went back, and took another job in the sheds. On last Thursday week, deceased left his home at Geelong West to go to Melbourne to see if the change would do him any good. Witness believed deceased left Melbourne on Monday or Tuesday last. Witness's sister had a letter from deceased, saying he was staying at Ballan for a few days, and intended going to witness's place at Wallaloo. At 2.30 p.m. on Friday, 23rd inst., witness received a wire from deceased from Ararat, which read, "Meet sister Ruby at Beaufort at once." It was lodged after 12 o'clock, and bore the signature, J. Peck. Witness received a telephone message from deceased's wife about 3.30 p.m. on the 23rd inst., and she said she had received a wire from deceased at Ararat, which read, "Meet Jack at Beaufort at once." Witness left Wallaloo at 5 a.m. this morning to go to Beaufort. When he arrived at Stawell, he received word from his home that the worst had happened, and to go on to Beaufort. Deceased was his brother-in-law. As far as witness knew, deceased had been suffering for about three months off and on from nerves. Witness did not


