PINUS INSIGNIS.
[CONTINUED.]
Pinus insignis is not a very hard name, and it is one which all of us should know not only because it is one of the most valuable pines in the district, but because it is one of the most remarkable trees in the world. The Monterey pine, as it is called, is native to California, Western U.S.A. Near a town called Monterey there is an area of a few hundred acres of hilly country and sandy slopes, where this tree grows naturally. It is a tall, slender, tapered tree of little use, and of no importance. It was first described by James Smith, who recorded it as the world insignis meaning insignificant, or of no account. In some manner (and nobody knows exactly in what manner) the seed of this tree was brought to Australia and planted. The seedlings flourished and were sold for some time until one day a scientist arrived at the plantation and found that the trees were of a different kind. Their origin was then quickly discovered, and the historic seed recorded a new phenomenon. A somewhat peculiar case may here be mentioned to advantage. The famous Scotch pine (which is really a pine of northern England) reaches dimensions up to 150 feet in height, with a proportionate girth. Specimens planted on picked sites in Australia are only about 20 feet in height after thirty years' growth. The contrast is most extraordinary. It is interesting to note that the Scotch pine, which is a pine of a more equable climate and stronger soil, produces a better and stronger timber than in its natural home. There are other remarkable features of the Monterey pine as we know it. It is one of the fastest-growing trees in the world. A six-year-old pine in a plantation will grow 19 feet 2 inches in one year, which is a world's record for the growth of a pine; while three other trees grow over 17 feet in the same year. It will grow on what used to be termed "barren land," and therein lies its national value. At Crossville, pinus insignis is growing on ledges. It requires only two or three inches of soil to let the rain soak in. Where the rock is exposed, no water soaks in and the tree will not grow. At Brighton it is growing thriving on the tailings left by the bucket-dredges. Those tailings won't grow grass! They are capable of growing only three things—rubies, St. John's wort, and pine. For years the Owens Valley was considered a barren on the State, but now the fertile property of the little community at Brighton is assured. Monterey pine, grown in plantations, is spaced only eight feet apart at first, and is ready for cutting in its twenty-third or thirty years. It gives quick returns and big profits. Private companies have now taken the matter in hand, and it is to be hoped that their ventures will be successful as the Government is not planting fast enough to meet the insatiable demand which will arise when in twenty-five years time the American sources of softwood supplies are utterly exhausted.

GRIMMEAN VETERAN PASSES.
Mr George Lekey, a Grimmean veteran, has died at Shielbourne, aged 95 years. He was born in Norfolk, England, and at the early age of 15 entered on a seafaring life. In 1851 he enlisted, and served in the Grimmean War on a man-of-war. He took part in battles at Gibraltar. After the war he came to Victoria, and was engaged in gold digging at Ballarat and Bendigo. More than 50 years ago he settled in Shielbourne. He married in Victoria, and a widow and family of 11 children are left. On each anniversary of the Grimmean War Mr Lekey had received a box of tobacco and a pipe from the Governor-General. Six sons of the deceased carried his remains to the grave in Shielbourne Country. The late Mr Lekey was the father of Mr Thos. Lekey, of Tirrawalla.
