



The Charities' Board has risen the status of the Beaufort General Hospital to that of a base hospital for Northern Victoria.

To bring the Beaufort General Hospital to the status required will necessitate its remodeling, the cost of which is estimated to be £20,000.

A public appeal for this amount has been authorized.

Friends of Mr. and Mrs. Wm. Hartly, of Dawson street, Ballarat, and formerly of Beaufort, will regret to learn of the death of their daughter, Ellen Winfield, which took place at the Fairfield Hospital, Melbourne, on Friday afternoon, 26th ult., after an illness of one day's duration. The deceased, who was only 21 years of age, had recently taken up the nursing profession, and was about her duties as usual on Wednesday, 24th ult. On Thursday morning, 25th ult., she complained of feeling ill, and was relieved of her duties and put under medical attention. She seemed to rally a little, but on Friday, 26th ult., she took a turn for the worse and gradually sank and passed away at 3 o'clock. Miss Hartly was the possessor of a fine voice, and was an accomplished musician. Her services were eagerly sought after and freely given, especially in connection with charitable and church matters. She was of a very lovable and bright disposition, and soon established herself as a great favorite with all with whom she came in contact. The funeral took place at the Ballarat New Cemetery on Saturday afternoon, and was attended by a large gathering of friends and sympathers from all parts of Ballarat and district, and also from Melbourne. The floral tributes were numerous and beautiful, and included wreaths from the staff of the Fairfield Hospital and St. Aliphan's Choir, St. Aliphan's Club, H.A.C.B. Society, and the G.Y.M. Society attended the funeral. The casket-bearers were Messrs A. Anglin, G. Collins (conductor St. Aliphan's Choir), J. O'Brien, J. Bouker, P. Goodall (Mellorway), and Clark. The Rev. Father Timmins officiated at the graveside, assisted by the Rev. Father M. Conlon.

Ballarat Diocese.

It was stated at a meeting of the bishop in council held on Thursday, 25th ult., by the bishop of Ballarat, Dr. Maxwell Gambleton, that for some time past he had been of the opinion that time had come for the matter of the division of the diocese to be seriously considered. When in England recently he conferred with the archbishop of Canterbury and other members of the hierarchy, and as the result of his efforts there he had reason to believe that the endorsement of a new see would be forthcoming. The lowland diocese of £10,000 from Mr. Edward Manifold and £20,000 from Mr. and Mrs. C. Campbell, of Warranwood, for the purpose of the episcopal synod of the province of Victoria was in favor of the division. The matter was fully discussed, and by a unanimous vote the council decided to introduce legislation at the forthcoming meeting of the synod to effect the division. The legislation committee will meet to draft the bill. It cannot be stated at present what the boundaries of the new diocese will be. Bishop Green long ago realized the need of such action.

RIPON FOOTBALL COMPETITION.

BEAUFORT V. WATERLOO.

The third and last round of the Ripon football competition for the Beaufort Cup was played on Saturday. There was a good attendance of spectators at the Beaufort Park, and a fast, well-contested game between the locals and Waterloo, witnessed. Beaufort won by 11 points; the final scores being:—Beaufort, 1 goal 13 behinds (11 points); Waterloo, 1 goal 3 behinds (27 points). C. M. Flynn captained the visitors, and W. Gray was back at his old post as Beaufort's skipper. Quick officiated as central umpire, and the goal umpires were J. E. Glover and J. J. Dunn, and the timekeepers W. O'Sullivan and J. Mooney. The final was rather muddy in places, and the ball quickly became greasy. In the first quarter Beaufort had five scoring shots to one. The game opened strongly, and Waterloo got the ball up their end several times. Fast play from end to end, with frequent flashes of chain marking and quick passing, characterised the term. Beaufort were the first to score, and E. Vowles got Waterloo's first goal as the result of a mark. Quarter-time scores:—Beaufort, 1 goal 1 behind; Waterloo, 1 goal. In the second term Beaufort scored on nine occasions, but each time only got a single. Waterloo had one scoring shot for a major point. There was again good, fast play from goal to goal, but at times it had a marked tendency to roughness. A shot by Fogg hit the bottom of the Beaufort goal post. Later H. Norman had the misfortune to bring the ball in contact with a post when shooting for Beaufort's goal. At half-time Beaufort were seven points in the lead. Scores:—Beaufort, 1 goal 13 behinds; Waterloo, 2 goals. Beaufort had four scoring shots in the third quarter for two "sixers" and two minor points; Waterloo scoring twice and obtaining a goal and a behind. L. Sandilant found the opening for Beaufort, but the ball was touched. E. Vowles (Waterloo) marked in front, but only scored a single. Following several minutes of fast, open play, an exciting period ensued in front of Beaufort's goal; Waterloo preventing them from scoring several times and eventually relieving the pressure. At this stage there were too many men on the ball, and the quality of the play deteriorated. Waterloo now took the offensive. Lewis made a dash for half the length of the field, but was eventually penalised for holding the ball. The term ended with a series of exciting but futile attacks by Waterloo. Score at three-quarter time, when Beaufort had a lead of 11 points, were:—Beaufort, 3 goals 13 behinds; Waterloo, 3 goals 1 behind. Each team scored three times in the closing quarter, with the same result—one major and two minor points. With a lucky snapshot H. Norman got a goal for Beaufort at a very difficult angle. McKenzie was doing valuable work on Beaufort's back line. Another angle shot by Norman raised one flag for the home team. Lewis (Waterloo) was taking mark after mark in excellent style. Eric Vowles (Waterloo) kicked his fourth goal for the afternoon from an acute angle. A shot by Fitzpatrick found the opening, but the ball was touched and only a behind registered for Beaufort. Attack after attack by Beaufort was broken by Waterloo's full back (Flynn), who repeatedly nullified Beaufort shots. Final scores:—Beaufort, 4 goals 17 behinds; Waterloo, 4 goals 3 behinds. Beaufort's best players were R. Miller, W. Gray, H. Larner, W. McKenzie, H. Norman, F. Jaensch, I. Cheeseman, W. Fitzpatrick, and D. M. Rogers. Occasionally L. Sandilant, G. Crimmins, and G. Burnett were prominent. For Waterloo good form was shown by Rutherford, I. McEwale, C. Lewis, A. and E. Vowles, J. and A. Loney, J. Davis, J. Connor, and C. M. Flynn. At times H. Jones rendered useful service. The goalkeepers were:—Beaufort (J. Fitzpatrick) and H. Norman (J. Fitzpatrick—E. Vowles (4).

LIFEBOATS FOR AEROPLANES.

Several new types of aircraft have been designed specially for marine use in conjunction with the Navy. One, a scout, carries a crew of four in rapid seaward flights from a shore base; a larger machine is driven by two motors, and has a crew of five; while a multi-engined giant (carrying a crew of six is intended over the open sea.

A feature in the design of new seagoing aircraft is the provision of a ball, light, specially designed life-boat. This fits snugly into place along the big hull of the flying boat and does not set up any air resistance when the machine is in flight.

CLOCK WITHOUT A FACE.

At Tallington Church, Burton-on-Trent, there is a clock with neither face nor hands. It strikes the hours on the church bell, and has carried on in this manner for nearly four hundred years.

It was made by the village blacksmith in the sixteenth century, and is of the crudest type. It is wound up daily by the sexton, the winding 'tare's being of oak, like the leams in which the iron beating occurs.

A clockmaker, who has just put in new bearings and striking pins, declares that there is no reason why the clock, which keeps admirable time, should not continue working for centuries.

The Rev. L. Burgess, who has been appointed vicar of the newly-formed parish of Skipton, Mt. Bate, and Central, was farewelled at a social evening at Linton, when the vicar (Rev. A. G. Horner) presented him with a handsome suit-case, study chair, and other gifts from the congregations of Linton, Carngahm, Snythedale, and Scarsdale. Mr Horner spoke in eulogistic terms of Mr Burgess, who had been his curate for about 18 months, and wished him success and happiness in the Skipton parish. Mr A. J. Smith and Mr L. Sparrow also spoke, and the Rev. L. Burgess suitably responded.

The winter up to date has, with the exception of heavy frosts, been very mild at Middle Creek, and crops (of which there have not been much sown this season) look remarkably well, the dry winter sowing this part. It is thought that the big drop in wool values (which seems to have come to stay) will have the effect of farmers again returning to cultivation, and which will be better for the district generally, although the last few seasons have been too wet here for wheat growing. A few years ago between twenty and thirty thousand bags of wheat alone was trucked from Middle Creek and Buangor stations, which goes to show that the country here, although not equal to the northern and Wimmera districts, with an average season and proper cultivation, can be made to produce good yields of oats and fair returns of wheat, and this with considerably less working of the land than the northern farmers have to do.

THE HISSING IGUANA.

In the Pacific Ocean, about 500 miles off the coast of Ecuador, lies a tiny group of desert volcanic islands, known as the Galapagos Archipelago. Here, among many creatures that have never heard the voice of man, the dominant sound of life is the hiss of the sea iguana, a great marine lizard that exists nowhere else in the world.

Erwin visited four of the islands in 1835 and found wonderful material for his "Origin of Species." The great marine iguana grows to a length of four feet and looks like its prehistoric ancestors, some of which were eighty feet long.

It lives about the seashore and feeds on seaweeds. At night it sleeps in a burrow of the earth or in a large crevice, while in the daytime it comes out and at low tide makes its way to the edge of the surf to feed. It will not live in captivity.
