FARMERS' CO-OPERATIVE SOCIETY.
A YEAR'S TRANSACTIONS.

The annual meeting of shareholders in the Beaufort and Wainwright Co-operative Society was held at Beaufort on Friday, 29th ult. Mr. John Bond, chairman of the meeting, presiding. In his opening remarks, Mr. Bond referred to the death of Mr. D. Walton, who was chairman of the company for some time. To Mr. Walton, he said, they had had a valuable work.

The manager of the company, Mr. R. Baxter, reported the operations of the year in a comprehensive report. Concerning the late Mr. Walton, one of the founders and president of the society, Mr. Baxter said he was the moving spirit who infused the life into the society that was so apparent to all. Dealing with the operations of the company, "the results," he said, "has been very satisfactory. For progress has been made in the balance and the assets were increased by £1884 over last year. The total sales from all branches were £51,049, and profit earned after providing for all expenses, including interest on loan, discount to members, and depreciation, is £1749/12/11. The business is maintained for H. V. McKay Pty. Ltd. during the year shows a vast increase over any previous period. The stability and growth of the business, however, is maintained by the Australian firm, combined with reasonable charges, and a desire to give the farmer a superior article, are no doubt in a great measure responsible for the results. Insurance is maintained at present for the interest of the Co-operative Insurance Co., resulting in a profit of £250. Buildings and fitting out main building were completed and have been opened as a showroom and hardware department. The Wainwright business is being the serious consideration of your directors. It is not their wish to remove it, but it is our duty to see that it is self-supporting. The Beaufort business is steadily increasing in volume and justifies its opening. A small piece of land adjoining the store has been purchased, and sheds have been erected thereon for the convenience of customers. Sheds made to members during the year were £35,210, and to non-members, who do not participate in any bonus, £25,828, which should be sufficient proof that the quality of our goods and price charged are in order. The capital of the society was increased during the year by £1983, made up as follows:—£782 in loan shares, and £1201 in contributing shares, making a total paid up by capital of £9776/10/. Last year a special effort was made to induce shareholders to increase their holding of shares. The result in the Beaufort district was very satisfying. The number of shares issued was 1367, increasing the capital £783/10/. The result in other districts was not so favorable. I would impress upon all concerned to increase their holdings as far as possible, remembering that 8 per cent. interest is paid on capital invested. The interest paid to the banks was £468. The amount could just as easily be put to shareholders. We have now placed before you, since the society's extended operations to Beaufort and district, our balance sheet, and the profits earned during the period total £12,275, dividends and bonuses paid amounted to £5014, and the balance in reserve is £5061, which shows that there is more in operation than some people give it credit for.

The report was adopted.

STACK MEASUREMENT.—To find the correct area of an oblong stack with perpendicular ends, multiply the length by the average width (between bottom and top) and the product by the height from the ground to the eaves. For the top multiply the area at the eaves by half the height to the right. The weight may be ascertained very accurately by measuring the cubic contents of a stack, and from this calculating the weight at the top.

DEATH FOR LAZINESS.

In a lecture on Ancient Peru, Senor Sabason, the London Consul General for Peru, pointed out that the ruins of the Inca civilization are spread over a wide area from Panama to the north coast. More important than the fact of the civilization, called Tia Huano, the remains of which—monuments, tombs, palaces, fortresses, and so on—have been found scattered over Bolivia, in Cuzco, round Lake Titicaca, and in many other places.

The Incas were a great agricultural people, and the remains of their canals and aqueducts may be seen in many places along the coast of Peru.

They had no fish and no poor. The State did everything for its subjects, interfering in all things, even in the affairs of private life. There were three classes—the Royal Family, the priests, and the people. The chief priest, and the Head of the Army, were drawn from the Royal House. Every man of twenty-one and every girl of eighteen was compelled to marry. To every child a piece of land was given—a boy getting more than a girl. All the work was done by the people and every person—man, woman, and child—had his or her allotted share of work to do. No one was permitted to be overworked, but no one dare be lazy under penalty of death.

MACHINE THAT GUIDES SHIPS.

Making the compass guide the ship is one of the latest achievements of marine engineering.

The oldest and most skilled helmsman finds it impossible to guide a ship exactly in a straight line, especially in bad weather, and the constant small deviations from its set path make a journey slower and less certain.

So the automatic pilot has come about, and to-day giant liners are being made to steer themselves. The Berengaria is the latest ship to be fitted with the apparatus, and, after making one turn of a little wheel to set the direction in which she is to go, the vessel can be left to herself to make a bee-line across the Atlantic with no man's hand upon the steering wheel.

The secret of the control lies in the master compass, a gyroscopic compass of great magnetic power, which points due north with dead accuracy, and rights itself instantly on the slightest movement of the ship.

Just as one master electric clock can operate a hundred others in a big building, so the gyro-compass electrically operates a number of repeater compasses placed in different parts of the ship. One only of these repeaters, or receivers, operates the ship's helm.

The compass receiver contains an electric contact, in reality a sort of switch, which on the least movement of the ship from its set course closes the circuit of a relay which starts an electric motor in the lower part of the self-steering outfit. A toothed wheel on the axle of the electric motor is connected by a chain with a toothed wheel on the axle of the steering wheel.

In this way any turn of the compass makes a similar turn of the steering wheel. The turning of the steering wheel instantly follows any swerving to one side of the ship, so that the ship itself is at once steered back into its set course.

Automatic steering with the gyro-compass considerably shortens the time of a journey across the Atlantic, and when we remember that a big ship will burn a hundred tons of coal in an hour, the economy of the self-steering apparatus can be understood.

The gyrostatic apparatus used on the Berengaria is the invention of an English engineer, Sperry, but when the ship was taken over from Germany she was equipped with a German system, which was originally devised by Dr. Anschütz-Kaempfe for a submarine that was to go to the North Pole.

The compass is floated in a bath of mercury, so that its movements are almost entirely free of friction and wonderfully swift. This swiftness of movement is the chief secret of the apparatus for a deviation in the ship's course is put right quickly that in the roughest sea the vessel leaves a wake that is almost unnoticeably straight.

A great use of these steering compasses is being made in experiments in directing ships by wireless.

EXPLOITING NOAH'S MOUNTAIN

Though it is not among the very highest places of the earth, there are few mountains more famous than Ararat, where, when the waters of the Flood receded, the Ark came to rest "in the seventh month, on the seventeenth day of the month."

We are all familiar with this mountain from the Bible narrative, but few of us have ever seen it or ever expect to see it.

Now, however, all this is to be altered. Plans are being made to build a funicular railway up the slopes of the famous mountain, and to make its snow-clad summit a pleasure resort, where winter sports may be enjoyed all the year round. So, if the scheme goes on, we may presently see advertisements such as these: "Armenia's Switzerland. Try Noah's Country for Your Next Holiday. Winter Sports All the Year Round." "Hotel Noah." "Winter Sports and French Cuisine."

Some of the old attractions of the place will have gone, however. The monastery at the foot of the mountain, where relics of the Ark were on show twelve hundred years ago, has been destroyed by lightning, and the world's first vineyard and Noah's own vine have been buried under a mass of rock brought down by an earthquake.

MISS SEXTON BLAKE.

The acme of woman's ambition must have been reached now that Scotland Yard has decided to admit women to the ranks of the Criminal Investigation Department. It has also been decided to increase the number of women police from twenty-four to fifty.

Women detectives will at first only be chosen from policemen already serving. Despite this, however, some hundreds of typists, chorus-girls, and governesses have applied for the few appointments available.

The women detectives will be trained on exactly the same lines as the men. It is thought that they will be particularly useful in gaining entrance into shady night clubs, exposing dealers in illicit drugs, and running swindling fortune-tellers to earth. It is, too, far easier for a woman to disguise herself than it is for a man. A man in a wig we can spot at once, but a woman in a wig—well, hardly ever!

SEA WALLS OF WOOD BLOCKS.

As a means of protecting exposed shores from the destructive wearing away by shingle and boulders, concrete walls have been tried and found wanting. Such sea-walls are ground down rapidly, but the new plan of giving them a facing of wood seems to promise great increase of durability. In some English experiments, wood blocks were set in cement, with the end grain exposed. On recent examination, the trial lot of wood blocks inserted in the wall showed very little wear, but the surrounding unprotected concrete had been eroded 14 to 2 inches more than the wood. The blocks had been so satisfactory, a considerable length of sea-wall has been faced with wood, mostly in cubes of six inches to a side, but with occasional projecting blocks having a depth of nine inches. The blocks were set in neat cement grout.

GEESE ON GUARD.

Will geese are extremely wary, and take nothing for granted. While feeding they have a perfect system of sentries. Not content with this, every now and then two or three will fly round high up to see that nothing is even approaching them from a distance.

STACK MEASUREMENT

—To find the contents of an oblong stack with perpendicular ends, multiply the length by the average width (between bottom and ends) and the product by 2, to height from the ground to the eaves. For the top multiply the area at the eaves by half the height to the right. The weight may be ascertained very accurately by measuring the cubic contents of a tray, and from this calculating the height at the top.
