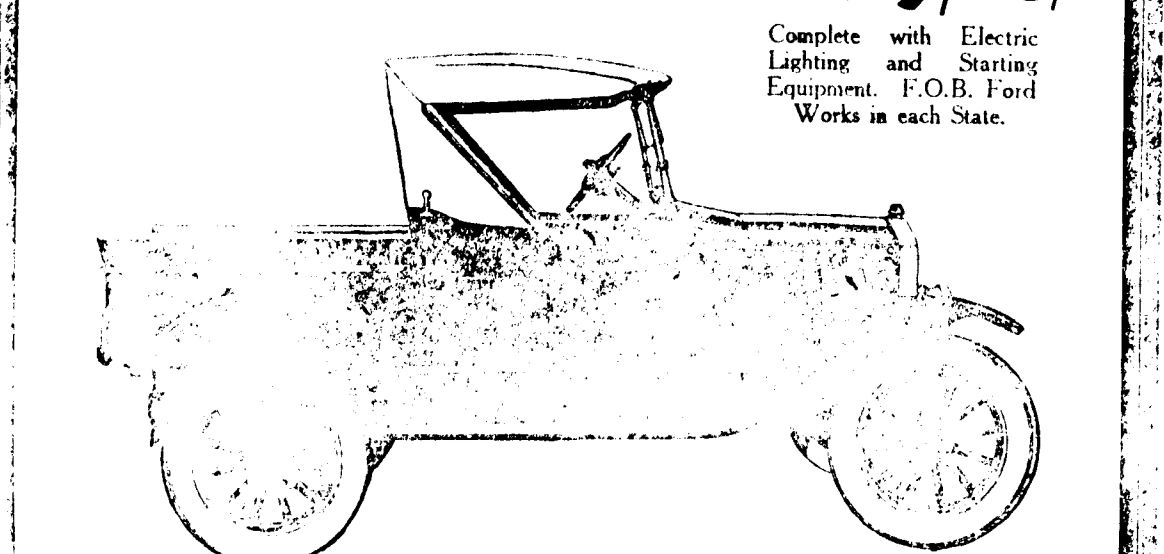

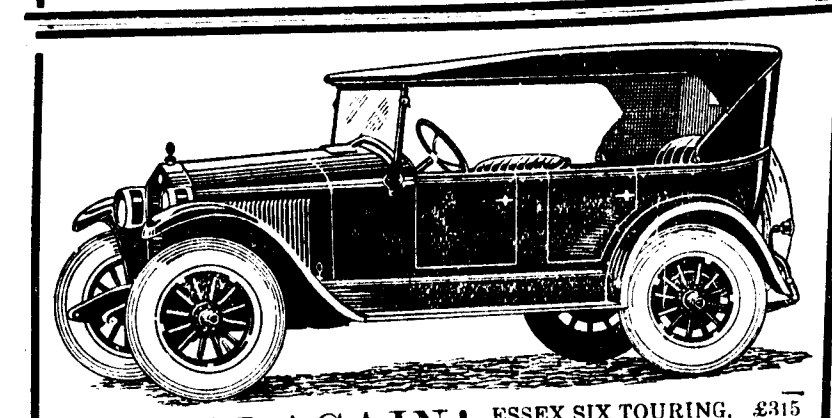

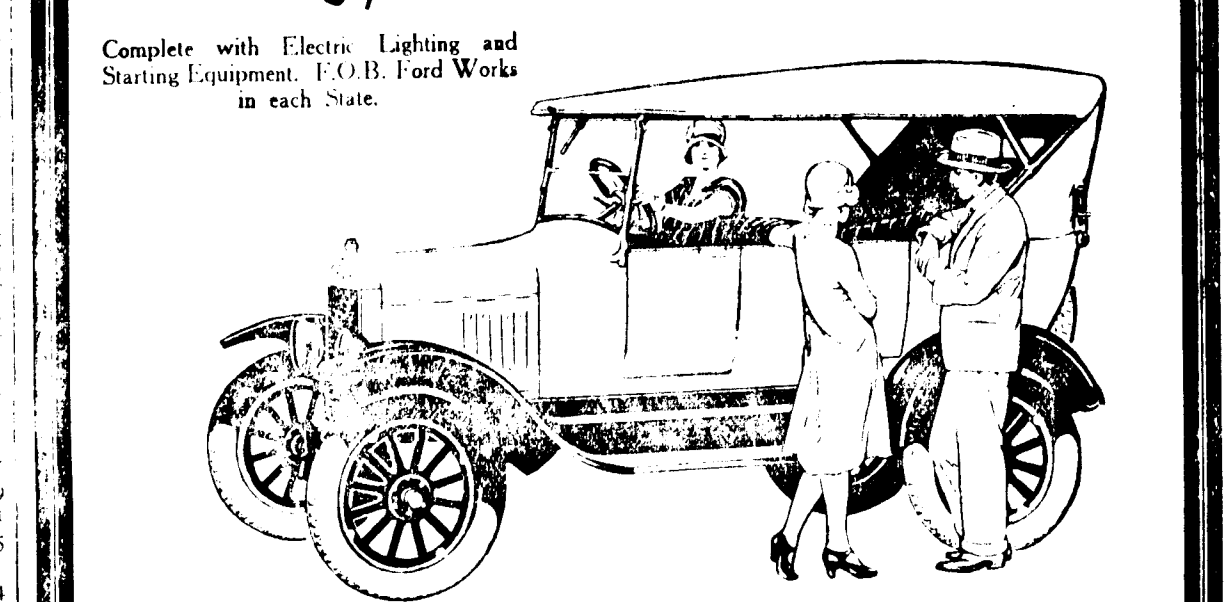

**A CROSS OF PEARLS.**

What are perhaps the most remarkable natural pearls in the world was exhibited in the Australian Pavilion at the British Empire Exhibition. This extraordinary exhibit, known as the Southern Cross, is a cluster of nine pearls forming an almost perfect Latin cross. The shaft is composed of seven pearls measuring at least an inch in length, while the arms of the cross are formed of one pearl on each side opposite the acute point from the top downwards. The examination under a powerful microscope shows that the pearls were produced by nature in their present form, probably as a result of natural compression during growth. The pearls were discovered in 1873 by a pearl fisher at Hobsons, in Western Australia, but so unimportant was the find and the value of the pearls that they were left to be forgotten.

It remained hidden until 1874, when an Australian explorer, Mr. Alfred Percival, passed through the area and, hearing accidentally of the pearls, discovered its existence to the world. It is now the property of a London merchant and is valued at £10,000.

**UNDER THE SEA TO FRANCE.**

The old project of a Channel Tunnel has been again in the public eye recently. There has been a great deal of talk about it, but the scheme does not seem disposed to let matters rest at that.

In 1802, the project was discussed as long ago as 1785, when Sir John Lubbock, a Parliamentarian of those days, introduced a bill to construct a tunnel from Dover to Calais.

The point which most puzzled them was how to provide ventilation. "The only means we could contrive for getting this obstacle surmounted," wrote the bill, "was a compressed air in barrels and transmit it in that state to be let out in the centre of the excavation."



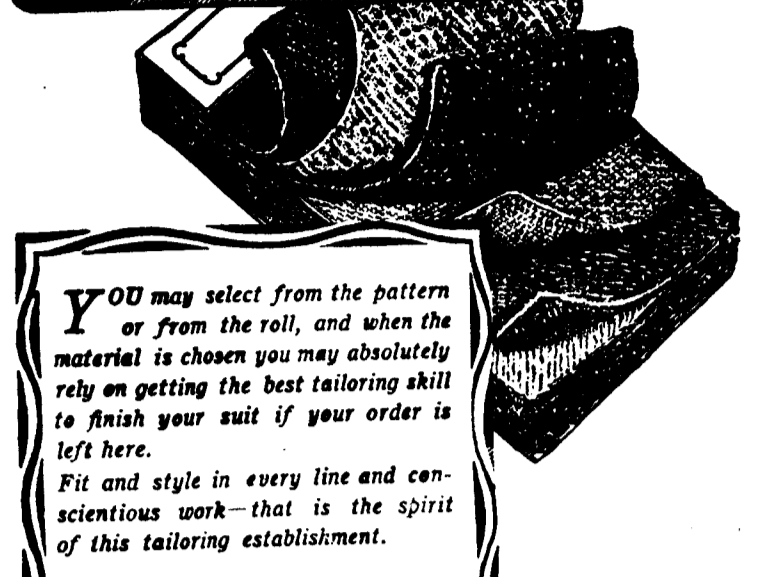

### "THE LIGHT OF OTHER DAYS."

De Blowitz had an "accomplice," a young man attached to one of the diplomats. He was to bring De Blowitz word of all that happened.

It would have been fatal to success for the pair to have been seen speaking together, so the following ruse was arranged: Every day the young man came to lunch at De Blowitz's hotel with the news of the day in the lining of his hat. When he left he took De Blowitz's hat instead of his own, and the correspondent thereupon took possession of the hat containing the news.

One day the conspirators had a scare, for one of De Blowitz's rivals took the hat by mistake! Luckily he returned it without finding what was hidden inside. Thus "The Times," alone of the newspapers, had accounts of what the Conference was doing.

Another story concerning De Blowitz is as follows:—

He was noted for his wonderful memory. At the Berlin Conference he was very anxious to obtain the treaty that was to be signed. He managed to get a copy of part of it, and persuaded one of the diplomats to read the missing portions to him. He then went back to his hotel and dictated to his secretary all that he had heard word for word.

De Blowitz left Berlin with the treaty stitched up in his waistcoat, and "The Times" published it before it was signed, one of the greatest "scoops" in the history of journalism.

The author tells an amusing story of Lord Palmerston, the famous Victorian Prime Minister. "The wife of a poor agricultural labourer had been awarded by the Labourers' Encouragement Association fifteen shillings for her praiseworthy domestic energy during the year. 'The Scriptures have it,' said 'Pam,' when presenting the prize, 'that a virtuous wife is a crown to her husband; but here is one who is worth three crowns to her helpmate.'"

In some countries, where natural difficulties have stimulated human inventiveness, it is quite usual for snow to be collected during the coldest part of the winter and buried, well pressed down, in specially dug pits. So intensely cold do these blocks of compressed snow become under this treatment that, after a few hours, they freeze into solid lumps of ice, which keep almost indefinitely, and can be dug up when required.

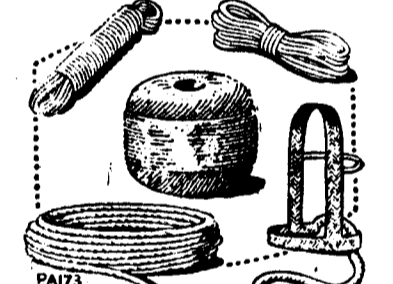
