**MAILS BY RADIO PLANE.**

A scheme was recently put before the French Government whereby letters and parcels can be delivered to certain centres throughout the country by radio aeroplanes, aided entirely by electricity and wireless.

The mail bags will be stowed in separate compartments, according to their destination, and by operating a switch-board in the central tower the contents of each compartment can be released, with parachute attached, when the aeroplane is over the "receiving station". No slackening of speed on the part of the cylinder is necessary.
