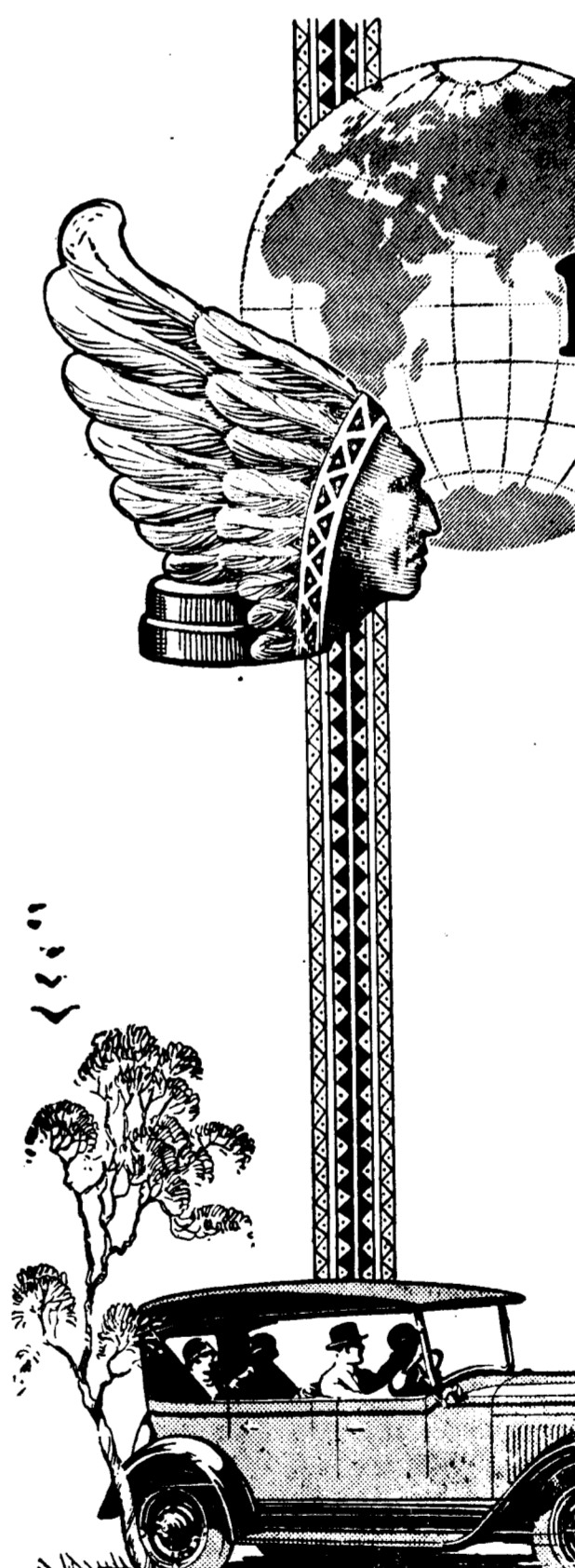

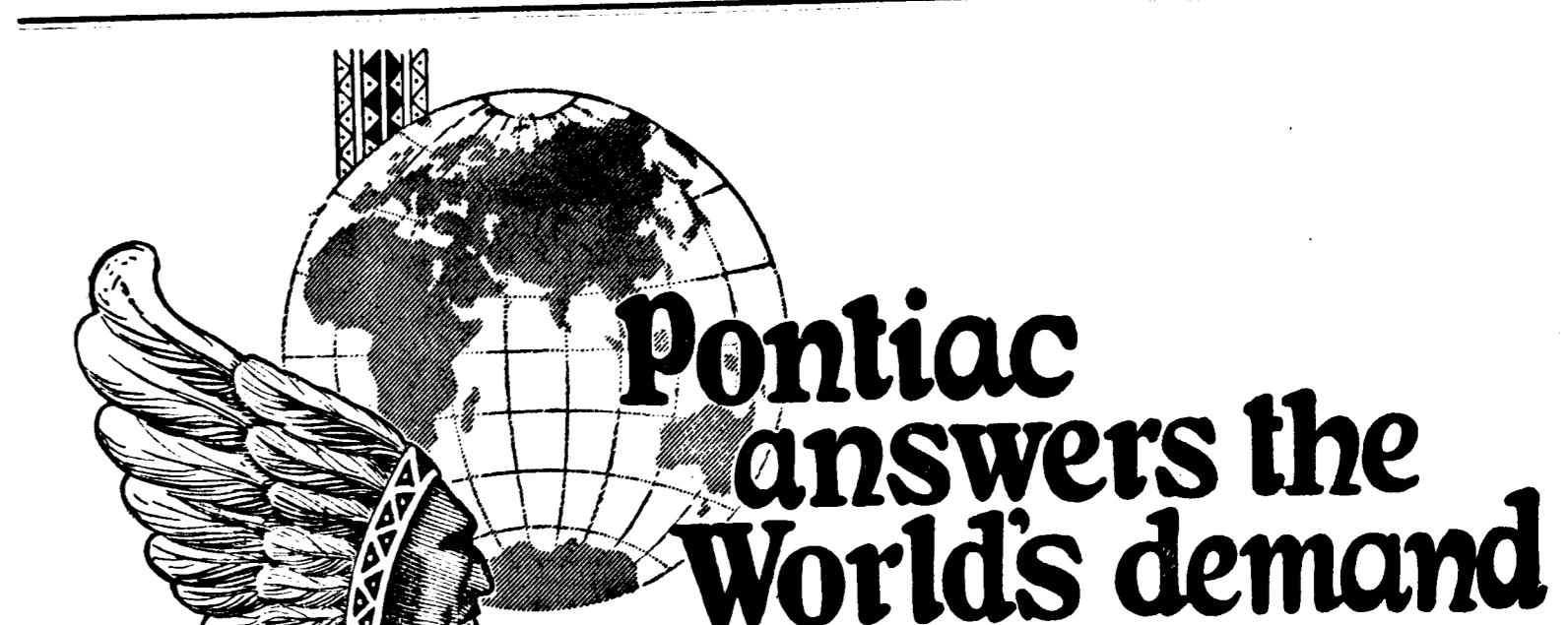

MERINO FLOCKS.

MAINTAINING HIGH STANDARD

An important suggestion (writes "The Argus"), regarding the preservation of Australia's valuable merino flocks, to the effect that if such flocks were to be maintained at their present standard Government assistance was essential, was made by Mr W. B. Daley, wool expert, of New South Wales, in a paper on "Wool and Sheep Production," read before the agricultural section of the science congress at Hobart.

"If we are to remain the greatest sheep and wool producing country in the world it is essential, with the advantages we have, that the merino flocks should be protected by Government help," said Mr Daley. Despite improvements in clips by other countries, such as South Africa and Argentina, he continued, Australian wool still held pride of place, and our good merino wools were the principal attraction to the buying trade. The Australian merino of to-day was the greatest sheep ever bred. The serious question, in view of the rapid disappearance of the superior fine merino sheep, was where were the flocks to be obtained in the future? Careless cross-breeding had ruined many flocks which had topped the world's market year after year. It was his belief that some of the fine flocks of Tasmania and the Riverina would be kept intact.

It was remarkable, that sheep-breeders had never received much encouragement or assistance from the various Governments, Mr Daley continued. Apparently legislators in the past had overlooked the importance of that industry. That might have been all right when the flocks were in a few hands, but now that the country was being so settled, and there were more sheepowners than when the Government first set the various Governments assisted the breeders. Otherwise the was every probability of a serious deterioration in the Australian clip. The gradual encroachment of inferior sheep was a very serious matter, when it was considered that 77 per cent. of Australia's wealth was produced from the flocks, and under the present conditions that some of the quality and style of sheep and wool could hardly be avoided.

AUSTRALIAN WOOL.

The following item from "The Argus" is of interest to local wool-growers:

The question of whether Australian wool has deteriorated depends upon the angle of view of the critics, and those who base their opinion on the quality of fineness are no doubt correct. Senator Guthrie, who possesses a profound knowledge of the subject, is not only an ardent champion of Australian wool, but he has rendered, and is still rendering, splendid service to the industry. No one realises more fully than he does the necessity for maintaining the standard of the wool by the expert classing of sheep and the careful preparation of the clip for market, and he has consistently advocated the provision of greater facilities for teaching young men the intricacies of the business. Senator Guthrie, who possesses a wide reputation, has committed the unpardonable offence of adversely criticising Australian wool, and in a letter to the industry he says that Mr Hollings' criticism of and advice to the flockmasters of Australia and South Africa are valueless. Few interested in the industry will subscribe to this statement, and, notwithstanding Senator Guthrie's chiding, Mr Hollings' estimate of the wool of the world will continue to command the attention and respect which it is entitled to and does receive. It may be taken for granted that he has no desire to injure Australian wool, but that, on the contrary, he should continue to strive to hold the high position on the market that it has enjoyed for such a long period.

Economic factors during recent years have revolutionised the wool industry, and as far as Victoria is concerned, the output of fine wools has declined. The principal reasons for this are the subdivision of large pastoral estates into smaller ones, the wool was produced, and the fact that it is more profitable to keep sheep of stronger constitution and larger frames, which naturally grow heavier-cutting fleeces and wool of a more robust type. The prices offered for superfine wools are not sufficiently high by comparison to induce sheep-owners to specialise in that type of wool, and so long as they can make a better profit from a large, but not necessarily a coarse sheep, they are not likely to do so. The top-dressing of pastures has also contributed to the increased strength of the wool but it encourages the growth and thriftiness of the sheep. Another factor that must not be overlooked when the quality of the Australian wool is being considered is the greatly increased number of farmers who are contributing to the supply. The many small holders do not pay sufficient attention to the quality, either of their sheep or the wool, and therefore it is probable that a greater proportion of inferior wool is sent overseas than formerly. While Mr Hollings' criticism may be too drastic, it is timely, and should not be disregarded or denounced, but accepted in the spirit that it no doubt prompted it. If the wools of Australia are unacceptable to buyers, or the methods of getting up the clip for sale are faulty, these shortcomings, if they exist, should be corrected before it is too late.

History Repeating Itself.

In view of the present day season the following items are interesting:—As a result of the complete break-up of the wool market, many thousands of sheep are being driven back to the walls of the towns and families, with stock and sheepmen seen passing in and out of the towns 25 years ago. The sheepmen have ruined the crops in the Swan and Strathmore districts. The swamps are all dry, but the hovering flocks of Cape Barren geese promise, according to some people) the approach of stormy weather.—"Ballarat Courier" of 50 years ago.

WIFE DIES OF INJURIES.

At about 7 p.m. on Saturday, a sensational motor accident occurred near Middle Creek, about 10 miles from Beaufort. Owing to the capsizing of a Buick car, weighing about 25 cwt., a well-known Wimmera farmer received serious injuries, and his wife was fatally injured. The victims were:—

Mrs. Ada Elizabeth Lingham, 55 years of age, Rupanyup, ribs on both sides injured, possible penetration of internal organs, and contusion on back of neck; died of injuries.

Mr. John Graham Lingham, aged 60 years, farmer, Rupanyup, head and internal injuries; condition serious.

Their son, Mr. Clifford Graham Lingham, aged 26 years, who was driving the car, escaped practically uninjured; only receiving a few bruises.

It appears that Mr. and Mrs. Lingham were motoring from Rupanyup to Ballarat to visit relatives, and that their son intended to turn to Rupanyup and finish harvesting. Near Mr. Aubrey Dunn's residence at Middle Creek, Mr. Lingham, Junr., was driving the car at a brisk pace on a piece of good road, and on suddenly reaching a bad piece, applied the brakes, and the car skidded to the right and slowly turned over on to the hood. Mrs. Lingham, who was in the front seat with the driver, was thrown over into the back seat, and pinned by it. Her husband, who was occupying the back seat, was thrown half out of the car, and caught in that position. The driver was thrown clear. Mr. Robin, of the Nash Motors, Ballarat, and Mr. Jackson, of Ellwood, came along the road and rendered assistance to the party. On the arrival of Dr. Nicholl, who was motoring from Ouyen to Melbourne, the injured persons were taken to Mr. Aubrey Dunn's house. Dr. S. E. Humphreys, of Beaufort, subsequently arrived, and they were handed over to his care. Three-quarters of an hour after the accident, Mrs. Lingham died from hemorrhage and shock.

Senior-constable R. McCormick and Constable J. J. McCarthy, of Beaufort, and Constables Mills (Bunanger) and Hall (Ararat) were soon on the scene of the mishap, and righted the overturned car, which was but little damaged. It was subsequently towed behind another car to Mr. Aubrey Dunn's residence.

Mr. Lingham, senr., was removed by motor ambulance to the Ararat Hospital, and the body of Mrs. Lingham was taken to the Ararat morgue.

An inquest was opened at the Ararat Police Station on Sunday by the Deputy-cornor (Mr. T. A. Wild, J.P.). Evidence of identification was taken, and the inquest adjourned to a date to be fixed.

The remains of the late Mrs. Lingham were interred at Ballarat on Monday.
