FOOTBALL.

RIPON ASSOCIATION FORMED.
A well-attended meeting was held at Beaufort on Friday night, 24th ult., to re-form the Ripon Football Association; delegates being present from Waterloo, Elmhurst, Dulcis, Rughan, and Bunton. Mr. S. Young was voted to the chair, and called for a general discussion, pointing out that a 5-team competition was better than a five-team one. It was understood that Amphitheatre would join the association.

After a lengthy discussion, it was decided to admit Dulcis, subject to the Hamilton line being their western boundary, on the motion of Messrs. Richardson and Hovvy.

Mr. Richardson said that under those conditions Dulcis could not set a team at all.

The chairman said they had to keep any team out, but to take in Ararat as a recruiting ground for Dulcis would make hopeless matches for some of the teams. He thanked the Dulcis delegates for coming along, and was sorry the boundary would not suit them.

Mr. Dawson moved that the Ripon Association be re-formed, to consist of Waterloo, Elmhurst, Rughan, Bunton, and Amphitheatre clubs, succeeded by Mr. Hanson, and carried.

On the motion of Messrs. Wallish and A. Beggs, Mr. S. Young was unanimously elected president of the association.

Mr. Young briefly returned thanks and donated a trophy of £3/3/ for the minor premiers.

Mr. Flynn was nominated for the position of secretary, but declined the honor.

It was decided to interview a likely secretary.

Messrs. S. Young, J. Grant, and H. V. Martin were elected as protectors and disputes tribunal.

Delegates were appointed for the various clubs.

The rules of the association for 1928 were revised, and the previous conference of the association adopted.

It was decided that no man who had played in any other association could play in the Ripon Association's matches after 19th June.

The competition is to commence on May 6th.

A draft of the draw was made, to be revised at a later meeting (if Amphitheatre did not come in), to provide for a four-round competition.

The meeting closed with a vote of thanks to the chair.


