ENGINEER'S REPORT.

The following report by the engineer (Mr. E. S. Crox, C.E., L.S.) was submitted to the Riponshire Council meeting on Monday.

Stockyard Hill Road. Re-sheeting and patching in progress near Stock Hill and south of Bull Gherin gate.

3. Joint Water Supply. The wooden culvert across the Main Lead road on the south side of Watkin's Hill collapsed during the month, and same has been replaced with a slant deck culvert of reinforced concrete.

4. Lynch's Corner Widening. An amount of £150 was provided in estimates two years ago for this work. Accompanied by Mr. Muntz, I have again inspected this site, and beg to submit an alternative scheme involving 84 chains of straightening, which will give a safe intersection and prevent any further accidents.

5. Stockyard Hill Road. Hill north of Mcintosh's corner, about 60 chains, has been covered with a coat of 1925, but no provision was made to complete this work, and provision made for next year's estimate.

6. Trawalla West Road. Mr. Muntz advised that 20 chains on the west side of the Trawalla West road were allowed for such, and suggested that the work be done immediately.

7. The engineer's report was favorable to the scheme, but Cr. Elder opposed it on account of the order he had given to the engineer's remarks, that he would not allow a sharp dip, and would bring back the intersection to its original position.

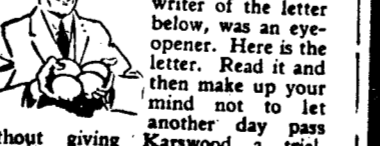

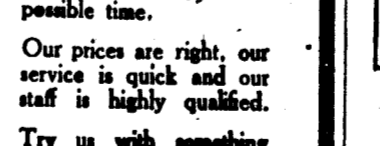
