### COUNTRY DEVELOPMENT

#### RAILWAYS AND DECENTRALISATION.

**THE NEED FOR COURAGE.**

Previous articles on this subject have made it clear that little relief from railway costs to country production can be anticipated so long as Parliament and the people as a body are unwilling to face the issue in the boldest manner, demanding that a State railway system be used as it should be used for the benefit of the whole country, not for the advantage primarily of those living within a certain radius. Only by facing the question from a new standpoint, and one totally different to any experiment hitherto tried in this State, can the much desired impetus be given to more population in the rural areas and a greater amount of production, alike primary and secondary.

At present the Commissioners are burdened with a load of debt for assets that no longer exist, and they are stepping to a proper system of finance for the department is to take cognizance of this fact, and either by writing down capital to the extent of 20 millions or so, or in some manner that may commend itself to Parliament, reduce the heavy overhead expenses that at present are too frequently the fruitful cause of efforts to increase the burden on production represented by railway freights and fares. Having arrived at a proper capitalisation of the railway accounts, the whole problem of freights and fares must be faced, but not on the lines to which we have been accustomed. There must be an end to a policy of loading industry with whatever rate of freightage the Commissioners think such an industry can bear. The railways must be made to serve the interests of decentralisation—whether the freights are payable in the ordinary sense of commerce or not. If there should be a loss by a general reduction of freights to and from the rural parts, the loss will be only of a temporary character, and the State as a whole must be prepared to shoulder the loss, and meet the deficit from consolidated revenues by an increase in the already low rates that at present operate within the suburban areas.

At present there is neither scientific basis for, nor understanding of, the system on which the railway freights are based, and as Mr Eggleston truly reminds the Railways Royal Commission, some lines of produce are carried at a rate far below the economic value of the product, while other lines are forced to pay almost as much as the product itself is worth to reach the markets of the world.

With one suggestion of Mr Eggleston we can heartily agree when he pleads for an abolition of political influence or patronage in the matter of fixing the rates to be paid by railway users. It may be necessary, as he suggests, that an independent tribunal, presided over by a Supreme Court Judge, should be constituted to settle railway freights. Such an independent tribunal could probably be constituted to examine the whole question of railway finance prior to the establishment of the promised Ministry of Transport, and when a new Ministry is formally set up, it should be directly charged with the most economical operation of the railways without any power to alter rates previously determined by the special body entrusted with the duty.

In arriving at its basis for rates it will be necessary for the tribunal to study the needs and potentialities of each part of the State, and the new scale of freights should be based on the determination that the man carrying on a productive operation of industry, either primary or secondary, farthest away from the big markets of the State should not on that account have to bear the heaviest burden of transport charges. One way in which this end can be achieved is to divide the State into zones representing approximately equal distances from the seaport, with a suburban area surrounding each seaport or the larger inland centres like Ballarat and Bendigo. Within these suburban areas a flat rate of charge for goods

or passengers could be fixed at the same rate as prevails to-day in the metropolitan area, while in each of the outer zones beyond these suburban areas, a flat rate for each zone could be adopted. In the fixing of the zones the greater distance should be compensated by a regular scale of reduction per 10 or 25 miles, so that there would be a definite increment held out through the railways for industries to settle in country parts and build up more cities like Ballarat and Bendigo in the country, relieving the congestion in the metropolitan area and tending to the creation of bigger and better home markets for all classes of production.

The principles of deliberately creating inland centres by means of special rail railway concessions to and from the seaport has been tried and proved successful in other countries, such as Canada and the United States, and even in Italy in the recent past, by exercise of his almost supreme power, the British Government has allowed more than a specified number of persons to reside and carry on their business in any one town. A similar result can be obtained in terms of the people of this State will realise that the primary duty of the State-owned railway system is not to earn profits but to render service to every part of the State. The proximity of a railway is a source of added wealth to every acre of the State, and the more these acres, which are to-day not being utilised to their full extent, produce the better will it be, not only for the railway department, but for every department of our State finance. The danger of to-day is not one of over-production, but of under-production, at too heavy a cost to the producer. Only a bold policy of railway reform in the interests of every class of production will meet the need of the situation as we see it to-day, and as it threatens to develop in the near future.

To weak-hearted men in public life the proposal to charge the man in the outback proportionately less than the man within easy access of the large markets of the State will be as preposterous as Mr Tanncliffe has already described the demand for a flat rate for electricity. To those who only think in terms of the present any departure from the old-fashioned ways of their forefathers must seem preposterous. But dangerous diseases call for drastic remedies, and there is no graver disease threatening the body politic to-day than the continued and continuous depopulation of our rural areas in favor of the city and its environs. No matter the cost, that problem must be faced and a solution of the difficulty encountered to-day must be found. So far as this campaign is concerned, the one method that promises the best and most economic solution is to look at our railways as a servant of the public, not in terms of £ s. d., and make them render the utmost service in their power to all parts of the State. The State itself, for some years, will have to make the making good of any deficit such a policy might result in, but in the final issue the State would be the gainer in a hundred direct and indirect ways by the added wealth that a settled countryside would inevitably mean. It is a policy that calls for courage, but it is the only policy calculated to effectively scotch and destroy the influences which are to-day robbing the country in the interests of a Greater Melbourne.
