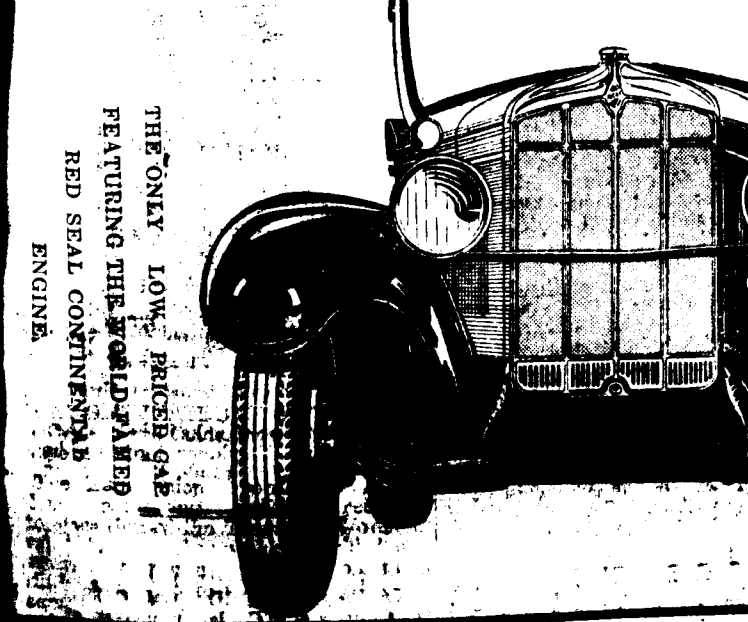

### FAST HILL CLIMB.

Mr. Alan Bruce, who recently carried out the Bluff's Spur motor cycle race, was again successful on the 22nd inst. in an attempt to climb Mount Fraser in record time. Mr. Bruce, who on this occasion rode a special model Indian motor cycle, made three consecutive ascents of the hill: the fastest time being accomplished after a heavy shower of rain had soaked the grassed slope of the hill. His time, usually given as 17 seconds, at an estimated speed of 25 miles per hour. Golden shell oil and Shell Spirit were used for the test. The hill is very steep and a continuous grade of one in three, and only a standing start is possible. Another machine which essayed the ascent to the summit burst a tyre about half way up, and its rider was fortunate in leaving the machine from overturning. The previous best time for the hill was established by Mr. J. Day in a Bugatti car when he reached the summit in 32 seconds.

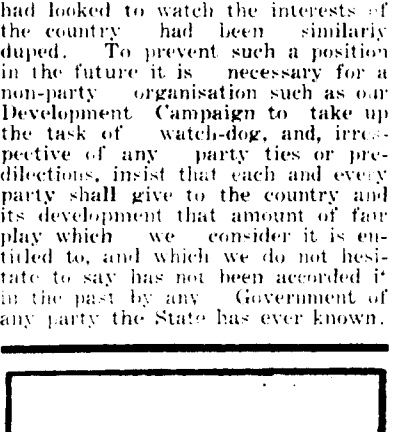
