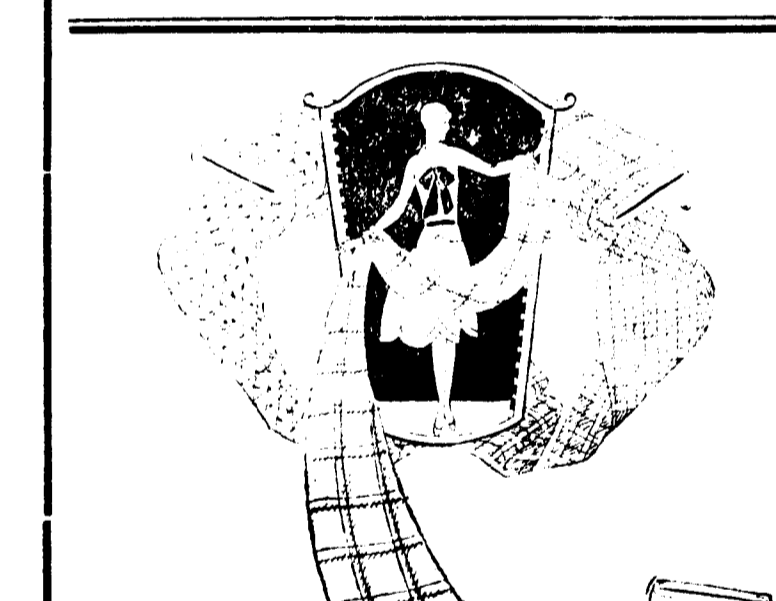

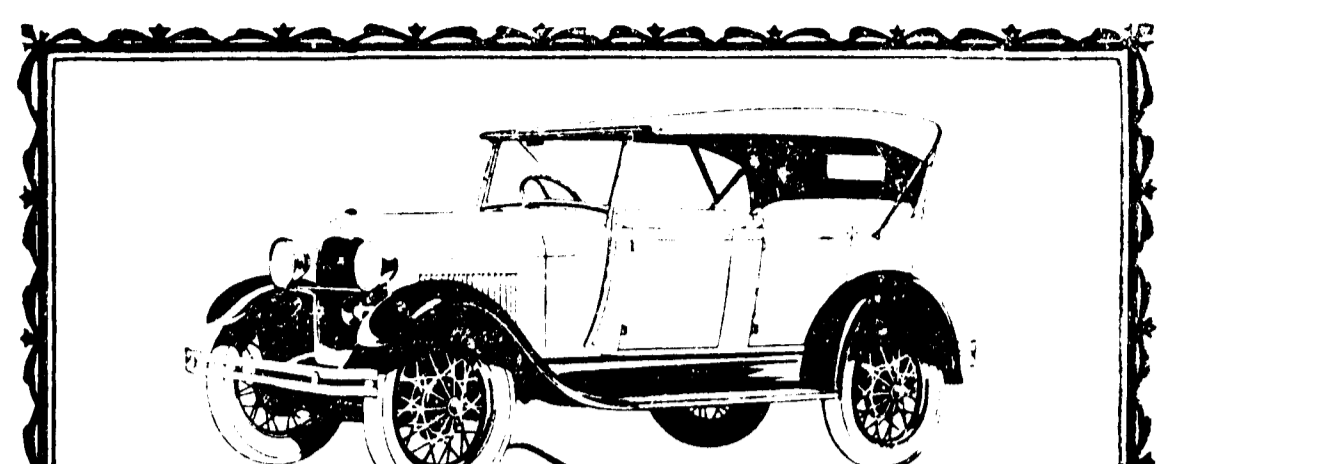

ENGINEER'S REPORT.

The following report by the engineer (Mr. E. S. Crouch, C.E., L.S.) was dealt with at the Ripon Shire Council meeting on Monday:

1. I beg to again draw attention to Stockyard Hill road from McIntosh's corner, northwards 60 chains to hill. This road, particularly the portion from the culvert southerly, is in bad condition. The estimate submitted was £350, and has been discussed, but as yet I have not received instructions other than for temporary repairs, which have been effected.

Clause 1—Cr. Mackenzie—At the North riding meeting, they considered that to do the road was beyond their powers, and the West riding was to assist them. They had decided that they could spend £50 on the whole of that road. Cr. Stewart—Then the cost would be £300 to the West riding. Cr. Sinclair—They did not see the West riding should give that, but a fair amount. The president—It was suggested that the work be done over the whole of the road and over the whole year. Cr. Stewart—He had advised the West riding assisting, and Cr. Kirkpatrick and he would have a talk over it. Cr. Kirkpatrick spoke in a similar strain, and asked for the figures he had asked for some time ago. The secretary asked the engineer to look them up. The matter was left in the hands of Crs. Stewart and Kirkpatrick.

2. Chepstow—Pittong Road.—Construction of pipe culverts and reforming are in progress.

Clause 2—Received. The engineer informed Cr. Russell that it was about finished.

3. Items Nos. 1, 2, 8, and 14, in the list of approved works agreed upon in committee, and submitted to this meeting for adoption, are such that the amounts provided are sufficient only for the supply of spalls. I would request that these amounts be reconsidered with a view to providing for crushing and spreading, as it would not be an economy to have

COUNTRY DEVELOPMENT

THE FLAT RATE DEBATE.

BY NO MEANS THE LAST WORD.

At the moment of writing there is some dubiety regarding the fate of the Assembly's discussion of Mr. Dunstan's motion in favor of a flat rate for electricity throughout the State. It is true the debate has been adjourned, but the session is getting nearer its end, and it is possible that the Government may find it necessary to withdraw all the sitting time of the House for the consideration of its own business. Whether this be or not, we can safely say that the flat rate has not been heard by any means on this most vital subject.

Two of the main planks of this campaign's programme have now been discussed in the Assembly with a measure of detail that was not possible under the previous more general resolutions moved by the member for Geelong (Mr. Brown), and it is a singular fact that, while on the one hand the Government has been being debated the majority of members left the Chamber, on the other occasion a leading Oppositionist—who previously opposed Mr. Brown's motion, gravely informed the House that if Mr. Dunstan's motion were a general resolution emphasizing the need for more country industries, all parties in the House would have supported it. The specious plea of the Oppositionist that a general proposal would have been more acceptable than a specific recommendation, loses any weight it might ever have claimed to have when it is recalled that the self-same speaker in the previous debate stigmatised Mr. Brown's resolution as "a mere general suggestion that would lead the House nowhere."

The value of the debate to our mind lies in the fact that members of Parliament in all parties are awakening to the fact that all is not well with Victorian population and industrial distribution, and some of the keener minds have grasped the fact that this campaign is never weary of reiterating, that the prime factor in bringing about this unhappy circumstance is not the geographical situation of Melbourne and its suburbs, or of any of those topographical features of the Victorian landscape like the Dividing Range (which a former mayor of the city once called "the wall of the metropolitan area")—the system that has been allowed, indeed, encouraged, to grow up in connection with our State railways. That system will be followed in its entirety, and in its entirety scheme if the people do not wake up to the fact that the arguments against Mr. Brown's motion and against the motions previously moved by Mr. Brown are simply the scientific expression through the lips of city and near-city members.

The debate in the Assembly followed generally the lines that we had foreseen, and the opposition to the resolution was based in the old fallacy that has brought our railways to their present condition, in which they are of very little service to the country, at a reasonable cost, and of no value whatever to the residents of country districts. If the present system of differential rates be allowed to become firmly established, then in the not far distant future it will be as difficult to get any Government to realise the hardship involved on country residents as compared with those in the metropolitan area, as it is to get the average member of Parliament to admit that the country railway patron pays twice as much for his use of the State instrumentality as the man in the suburban area. This campaign owes Mr. Dunstan's outspoken advocacy a revision of the railway rating system in country districts, but we would go further than he at present appears to think is necessary. While he would be satisfied with a reduction
