BALLARAT MARKET.

CATTLE—Small yarding, 30/ per head rise. Another light supply, the total being 111. Bullocks were limited to two trucks of medium weights. The cow and heifer beef comprised a nice range of quality from choice lightweight to prime station-bred heavy weights. There were also a few lightweight steers. From a regular attendance of buyers competition was extremely brisk, and values showed an increase of £1/10/ per head for all grades. Quotations: Best bullocks, £17 to £18/2/6; useful, £14 to £16; prime cows, £15 to £17; extra, to £18/17/6; good, £12/10/ to £14; useful, £10 to £12. Calves—Best, to £12/13/6; 50 penned. There was a good percentage of prime quality, chiefly well-grown young cattle and a few nice weaners. Competition was brisk throughout, best making £12/13/6. Sheep—Decreased penning, and a rise of 2/ per head. A very short supply of sheep came forward for to-day's sale; the total being only 1635, but with the exception of about 400, they were all suitable for the trade. Good and prime quality comprised the majority of the offerings; the crossbred and comback wethers being a really prime lot. Ewes were not too plentiful. There was a brisk demand for all grades from a representative attendance of buyers, and values showed a further increase of 1/6 to 2/ per head. Quotations: Prime crossbred wethers, 34/ to 38/; extra, 39/ to 43/; good, 29/ to 32/; useful, 24/ to 27/; prime crossbred ewes, 23/ to 32/; extra, 34/ to 37/10; good, 24/ to 26/; useful, 19/ to 22/; prime merino wethers, 30/ to 34/; extra, to 38/10; good, 26/ to 28/; useful, 22/ to 25/.

LAMBS—Light penning, and prices firmer. There were 1057 entered, being only a little more than half of last week's numbers. There was a fair number of prime quality, including a draft of late summer suckers, which attracted keen competition. All grades were keenly sought after at firmer quotations. Quotations: Prime, 28/ to 30/; extra, to 32/6; good, 24/ to 26/; useful, 20/ to 22/.

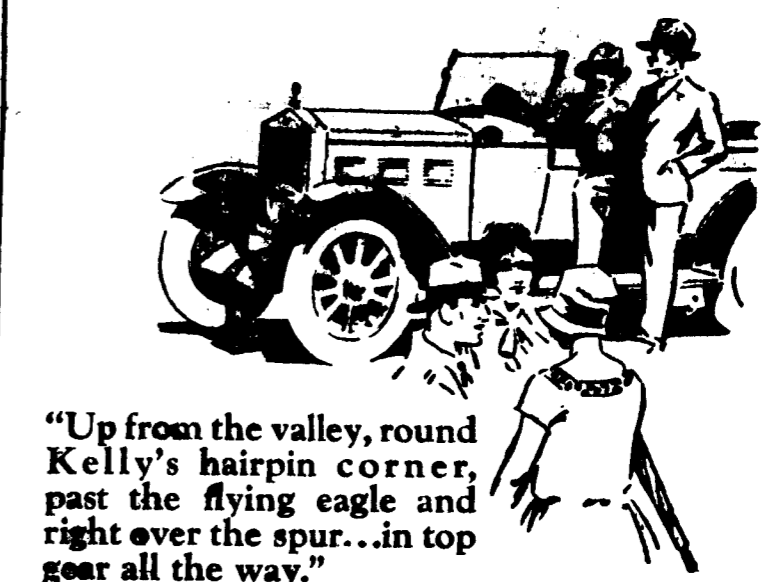
SKIPTON.
