### SUDDEN DEATH.

**MR. ALFRED DRIVER'S BODY FOUND IN THE BUSH.**  
A painfully sudden death occurred at Beaufort on Thursday, 27th ult., when Mr Alfred Driver, an old and highly respected Beaufort resident, passed away at Phillips' Flat, where he was working for Mr George Tomper, about three to four miles distant from his home in the town. The deceased left his home on Thursday, and when he had not returned on Friday afternoon, his relatives and friends became anxious and organized a search party. The body of the late Mr Driver was found in the bush, fully clothed. The deceased, who had been suffering from kidney trouble, had apparently been taken suddenly ill and died. He was 65 years of age, and a bachelor. Having lived an exemplary life, he was highly respected by all who knew him. For many years he was a member of the local Rechabites' Lodge, and in his younger days was a fireman. He followed the occupation of a woodcutter, and was a good, honest worker.

### FARMER FOUND HANGED.

**WIFE'S SHOCKING DISCOVERY.**  
NO CAUSE ASSIGNED.  
In circumstances that suggest a determined suicide, the body of Adam Robert Slater, farmer, of Carranballe, was found hanging from a rafter in a shearing shed, some little distance from the homestead at 4.30 p.m. on Sunday.

### THE FUNERAL.

The remains of the late Mr Alfred Driver were interred in the Beaufort Cemetery on Sunday afternoon, the funeral being attended by a large number of residents of the town and district, and old friends of the family. Twenty-five members of the Rechabites' Lodge of which deceased was a member) preceded the hearse to the cemetery. A large number of wife and family he accompanied him. The cortege was led by the Rev. A. Talbot, and the service was conducted by the Rev. A. Talbot, and Mrs. G. Pringle read the Rechabites' burial service. The undertakers were Messrs Chas. Morris and Co., of Ballarat.

### VERDICT OF SUICIDE.

**NERVOUS BREAKDOWN RESPONSIBLE.**  
Acting on instructions from the Coroner (Mr P. H. V. Elliot, P.M.), an inquest was held at the Skipton Police Court on Monday by Mr A. F. Rice, J.P., on the body of Adam Robert Slater, farmer, of Carranballe, who was found hanged on Sunday.

Constable Brady, who conducted the inquest on behalf of the police, produced a letter that had been written by the deceased. In it the unfortunate man stated that he was suffering so severely from a nervous breakdown that he feared he might inflict injury on his wife and family, and rather than risk the possibility of doing that, he decided to end his existence.

Mrs Slater stated that the last time she saw her husband alive was at 2 p.m. on Sunday. He then appeared to be in his usual buoyant spirits, and was in pursuit of some dogs, one of which he captured and tied up. At 4.30 p.m., she went to the shearing shed to gather eggs, and was horrified to see her husband hanging from a rafter. She cut the rope, but too late to save his life. Until afflicted by nervous troubles, he enjoyed good health, but lately he had suffered from insomnia, and was frequently depressed in spirits. He had no financial or other worries, so far as she was aware.

Mr Elder returned a verdict of suicide while suffering from acute mental strain.

Use More Wool.

At a conference of branches of the Country Women's Association in Melbourne last week, Mrs K. Amos (Manangatang) moved, and Mrs Tippetts (Annuello) seconded the following motion:—"That the executive be urged to formulate a scheme for submission to the branches pledging members to use more wool and to purchase woollen fabrics when possible, so that country women will bear their part in the national responsibility of conserving the wool industry." Mrs R. G. Beggs (Beaufort) said that she had been experimenting with the use of wool for mattresses, and exhibited to members a pillow stuffed with crossbred wool, which had been secured and teased at home. A 3 ft. mattress took 25 lb. of wool. At a maximum estimate, this would cost 12/ or 15/ if the wool was secured at 40s, and 25/ if bought already secured. Such mattresses were extremely comfortable, and would last more than a lifetime. The motion was agreed to.
