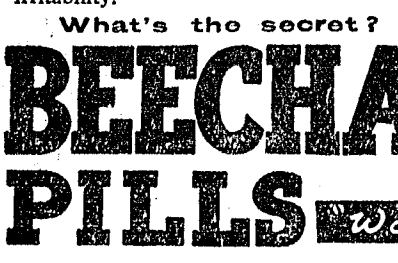

The Good Old Days.

"COUNT your blessings" is a habit that people of today are not prone to indulge in, although a little reflection will show they have good cause. Recently a resident well past middle age passed the remark in allusion to the alleged good old days that the old people knew nothing about some things, and cited the case of household comforts and conveniences, and the absence of old grandmothers even had to get outside in all weathers to get water for the kettles. Those who lived through the pioneering days in country districts and small towns had to put up with hardships unknown to their descendants. What would people ascribe to electricity light, say if they had to go back to the candle and the kerosene lamp? Middle-aged folk will remember the annual epidemic of typhoid fever each summer—a disease that is now practically unknown, owing to improvements in drainage, sanitary services, and water supply. The little, damp, four-roomed cottages, built too close to the ground are being replaced by convenient, well-ventilated, airy houses on high foundations. Wireless, the telephone, motor cars, and moving and talking pictures have brought the country dweller nearer to town and city, and made life a great deal more pleasant for him. The internal combustion engine and improved machinery have rendered much of the drudgery of farm work. With all these blessings to count, the people of to-day should be much happier than their ancestors, but it is interesting to note whether they have a more cheerful outlook or are more contented than those who pioneered this country. With the folk folk it was a case of "What the eye does not see, the heart does not grieve over." It is certain that our grandmothers derived much pleasure from an occasional concert and dance as we do from far more frequent entertainments.
