## Young Players Show Promise with Racquet

#### BEAUFORT CLUB'S OPEN TOURNAMENT.

Kaolin and bauxite, and their importance as economic products, are discussed by the Director of Geological Survey. Other features of general interest include an article on the Wonthaggi coal field, a glossary of geological terms, and notes on the Chewton gold field. The recent drilling progress in relation to the search for oil for the past six months is recorded, and reports are made on the dredges, mines, etc., operating throughout the State. 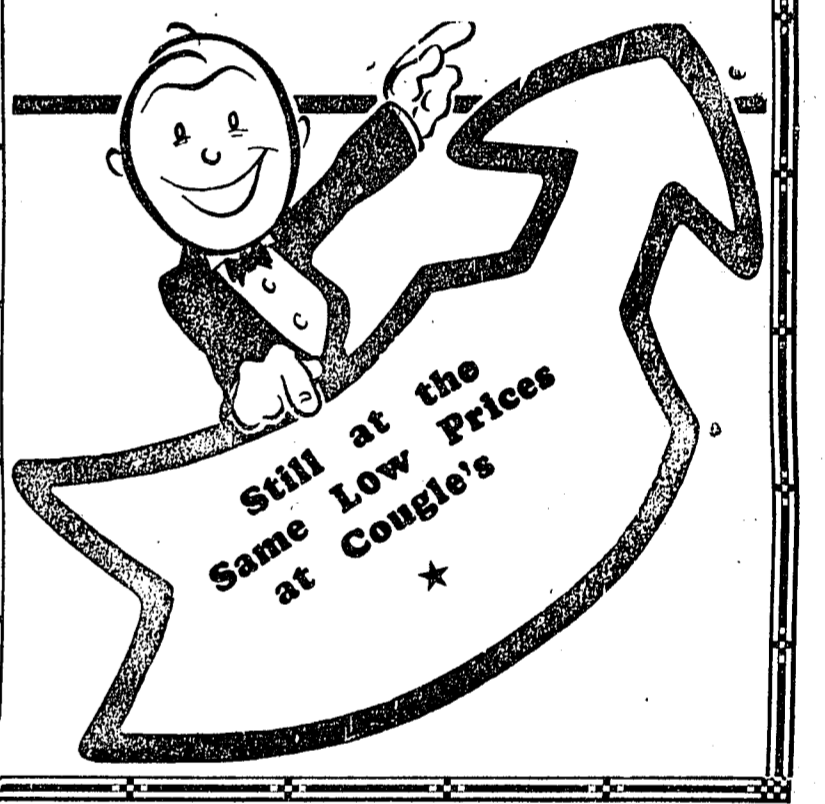
