## POLICE COURT.

**POPULAR OFFICIAL FAREWELL.**  
 Mr. C. V. Reddie, clerk of courts who has been stationed at Arrat for several years, and who visits Beaufort fortnightly, has been transferred to Fitzroy.  
 At the Beaufort Police Court on Monday, Mr. T. W. Schlicht, on behalf of the Beaufort Justices, heartily congratulated Mr. Reddie upon his appointment to Fitzroy, and wished him every success in the future. He (Mr. Schlicht) had only recently been appointed a J.P., but had known Mr. Reddie for a few years, and had always held him in the highest esteem.  
 First-constable J. Duke, on behalf of the Beaufort Police, also offered his congratulations. Mr. Reddie had been visiting Beaufort for some considerable time, and had always been a good, capable, and courteous officer. He had been of great assistance to the police, with his knowledge in connection with law and other matters, and helpful and obliging to old-age and invalid pensioners in his official capacity. At Fitzroy, Mr. Reddie would be filling a more important position and would have several junior officers under him.  
 Mr. Reddie, in responding, said he appreciated what had been said about him. He regretted leaving Arrat, and his association with Beaufort had been of the very best, and he had always got on well with the justices. They would find Mr. Hayes (his successor) a very capable officer, and he felt sure that they would not miss him very much when they got to know Mr. Hayes better. First-constable Duke had always treated him in a way which he would never forget, and with other police officers had always been helpful and of great assistance to him. He also wished to thank Mr. Young, for the help given him in connection with law whenever it was required.  
**TRAFFIC PROSECUTION.**  
**MOTORIST FINED £2.**  
 First-constable J. Duke (prosecuting officer for the Shire of Ripon) proceeded against Wearn Phillips for having, at Beaufort on June 17, failed to slow down at an intersection. Defendant did not appear, and was fined £2, with 2/6 costs. Messrs. T. W. Schlicht and H. J. Buchanan occupied the bench.  
 Action was taken under By-law 51, sub-section 2, Shire of Ripon, which states that a driver of a vehicle or horse proceeding along a major street, on approaching a minor street, must reduce speed so as to be able to stop immediately.  
 First-constable J. Duke stated that on June 17, he was called to an accident in which two cars were involved, at the intersection of the minor street and Lawrence Streets, Beaufort. He interviewed Phillips who later at the Police Station made a statement to the effect that he came travelling along the street at about 40 miles an hour. On approaching the intersection, he noticed another car coming in along the minor street. He applied his brakes, but a collision occurred. The other car would be travelling about 25 miles an hour, on the increase. Defendant said he noticed the "slow down" sign on the road. Witness, in continuing his evidence said that defendant had already passed two minor streets before the accident occurred.  
 To the Bench - Defendant admitted travelling at 40 miles an hour. There were braking marks on the road for 40 feet. Defendant's car was not high-powered.  
 Mr. Schlicht said the Bench took a very serious view of this sort of thing. The crossing was a very dangerous one, and something would have to be done; otherwise a serious accident would result. Defendant would be fined £2, with 2/6 costs.
