Low Rainfall but Fair Returns

Agricultural and Pastoral.

For the year 1940 19 inches of rain had fallen up to Decr. 27. The average annual fall for the district is considered to be 25 to 26 inches and in the drought year of 1914 13 inches were recorded. Crops generally are below normal yields; nevertheless, there will be isolated good oaten and wheat crops harvested. Hay crops now being harvested are very clean and well headed. There will be sufficient oaten hay for normal use and reserve, also hay for sale. The prices ruling for hay are brighter and some sales have been effected at up to 14 a ton in special cases, average about 53 in the stock. Oats harvested sold at 3/3 a bushel, as against 1/9 a bushel at this period last year, and hay 30/ per ton.

Some wheat crops should harvest eight bags to the acre, and average five to six. Although feed is short, there is sufficient to keep stock in store condition throughout the summer and the November rains of three inches made conditions secure, and the stubble feed will also be good. The rainfall has been low; nevertheless, falls occurred at the most vital periods. It is also probable that some moisture reserves had been preserved from the previous year of heavy rainfall. But, making allowance for these bright patches, the State wheat yield will be lower than for the past 20 years.

Fat lambs have proved profitable and though the season is considered unfavourable, many owners have secured good prices, and it is probably safe to say that the district would average 20/ per head, very recent sales up to 25/ and the number disposed of being very satisfactory. Prices for local and useful sheep, and particularly for young breeding ewes were also good, being up to 15/ per head. However, fat sheep prices are below normal for this time of the year.

Since early November numbers of sheep from the immediate dry northern parts have been grazing on the roads in this locality, and so far the improvement in the condition of the sheep is remarkable. Most owners of these flocks are holding on until the break in the season, when prices are expected to rise.

Beaufort and District Association in Melbourne.

The annual meeting of the club and election of officers will take place in March. It will thus be seen that the association has a busy time ahead, and further entertainments and functions will be held.
