## 600 TREES ADDED TO SCHOOL PLANTATION

### School Committee.

#### MONTHLY MEETING.

Mr W. J. Scriven was in the chair on Monday night at the residence of the correspondent (Mr H. J. Buchanan) when the July meeting of the Beaufort School Committee was held. Four members and the head teacher (Mr L. R. S. Dalrymple) were present.

The correspondent reported that the defects in the taps and drinking troughs at the school had been remedied, and the leaking roofs were to be attended to.

Correspondence was read from the Beaufort Church of England Committee, asking that pine trees near the Parish Hall be removed or lopped.

A letter was read from the Education Department, stating that the district inspector and the head teacher had been asked to report on the removal of the pine trees.

In regard to removing the pine trees, it was decided to give preference to a local man, provided he removed the residue; Messrs. Buchanan and Dalrymple to finalise the matter. The motion was moved by Mr J. Duke and seconded by Mr T. Thacker.

The matter of a proposed donation to the Mothers' Club Cocoa Fund was allowed to stand over for the present.

The head teacher (Mr Dalrymple) reported that about 600 trees were planted on Arbor Day; leaving 80 to be planted. The taps were now much more satisfactory than before. The attendance at the school had dropped, nine children having gone away during the month. There were now 17 children in the primary school, and 61 in the H.E. School. Mr Green had left them for Melbourne. Miss Douglas, a student teacher, had been appointed here. They would be able to carry on satisfactorily. He proposed turning the dahlia bed in the school garden into an onion bed to produce seed for the people overseas. They would also grow herbs in the garden.

### Points for Charcoal Users

Those motorists who have changed over to producer gas units must be careful of the quality of the charcoal they use, advises the R.A.O.V. It sounds very simple to put a bag of charcoal into the hopper, and the car will run 80 miles. Charcoal varies considerably in quality. You can get 80 miles out of a bag of well-made charcoal of even grade, but you may find that other charcoal will not give you more than 40 or 50 miles. To begin with, the charcoal should be well burned in a kiln. It is no use a farmer going out into his paddock, where he has been burning, and shovelling up a few bags of charcoal. This will be full of dust, badly burned, or uneven shape, and if such charcoal is used in the producer gas unit will be dissatisfied, and will be inclined to blame the unit rather than the fuel. Even charcoal burned in the old-fashioned way by piling the logs up into a cone-shaped heap, covering them with earth, and setting them on fire, is unsatisfactory, as too much dirt and dust get into the product. Charcoal for use in cars should be burned in a kiln, and should be marketed in very small, even pieces. If the charcoal is wet through, the bags having been exposed to the rain or damp, the engine should be run for 15 minutes at a good speed to bring up the temperature in the fuel zone, and to warm up the fuel. Then stop the engine, open the hopper lid, and allow for cause with a lighted match the "blow off" to occur—but stand well to one side, as the water in the match will be driven off.

### WAR SAVINGS QUOTAS.

Monthly quotas for each State for sales of war savings certificates and stamps in this financial year have been adopted to replace the objective of £25,000,000 fixed for the period from the inception of the campaign in May of last year to June 30 of this year.

The amount to be sought monthly by this means is £1,000,000 cash representing £1,250,000 in face value of certificates. This is the equal of a yearly total of £12,000,000, or £15,000,000 face value. For the last financial year sales were £15,234,478.

The monthly quotas allotted for the States are: New South Wales, £245,000; Victoria, £345,000; Queensland, £185,000; South Australia, £105,000; Western Australia, £80,000; and Tasmania £40,000.

The Commonwealth Loan Organizer (Mr C. Banfield) said that the quotas had been adopted as a guide to State and local war savings committees and State organizing secretaries, pending the completion of the new Federal Budget. Then, if necessary, the quotas would be revised, and probably figures to cover the whole of the financial year would be adopted.

In fixing the quotas, population had been taken as the principal guide, but regard had also been paid to other factors, mainly, area and degree of industrialization. It was felt that the quotas were well within the reach of all the States; in fact, it might be necessary later to increase them substantially.

"To achieve a fully useful result," said Mr Banfield, "we must induce more of our people to settle down to dispensing with luxuries and non-essentials and saving systematically. Victoria so far has had the highest proportion of the population in war savings groups, but even there, as in all States, there is ample scope for higher membership. It is along these lines that War Savings Committees are desired to work."

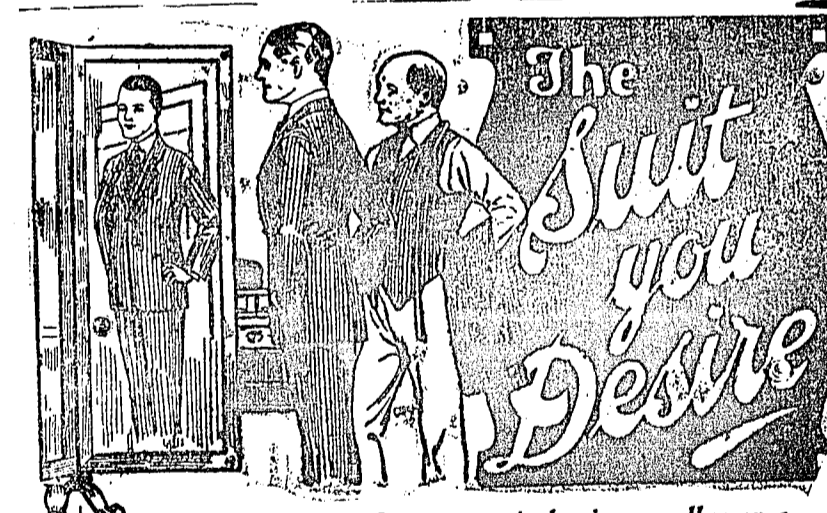
