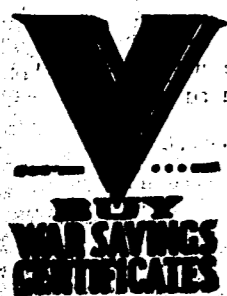

ARARAT SHIRE COUNCIL.—At the Ararat Shire Council meeting on Tuesday, Decr. 18 (the engineer reported that Streatham water supply had been tentatively approved, and further information asked for by the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission would be forwarded. Repairs had been effected to bridge, Fiery Creek, Ballyrogan; repairs made to roads Middle Creek, and Buangor road. It was decided to inform Streatham Welcome Home Committee that all servicemen would be included in the presentation of certificates.—"Advertiser."

BUSH FIRES.—On Saturday afternoon, 22nd Decr., a fire occurred in the bush between Mr J. J. Dunn's house on the Chute road, and Waterloo. About five acres of timbered land was burnt. The Beaufort Rural Brigade's Rural Fire Brigade's power pump and truck went out with a number of men, in charge of Mr J. Duke, and soon extinguished the fire, with the help of men from Mt. Lonarch and residents of the locality. On the morning of Boxing Day, with a very high temperature and a north wind blowing, a bush fire broke out on the southern side of the Western Highway, about two miles from Beaufort, and 300 yds. over the railway crossing on the highway. Between seven and eight acres of land was swept by the flames in Mr J. Stevenson's and Miss Schlicht's paddocks. The Beaufort and Buangor rural brigades sent trucks and power units to the scene, in charge of Messrs. Duke and Downie, and with the assistance of a number of men, the fire was fortunately subdued before it crossed the railway line (which had previously been burnt off) into the bush and developed into a serious conflagration.

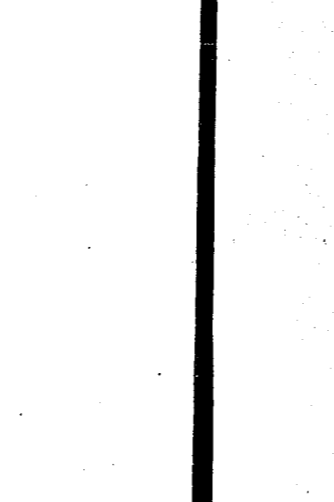

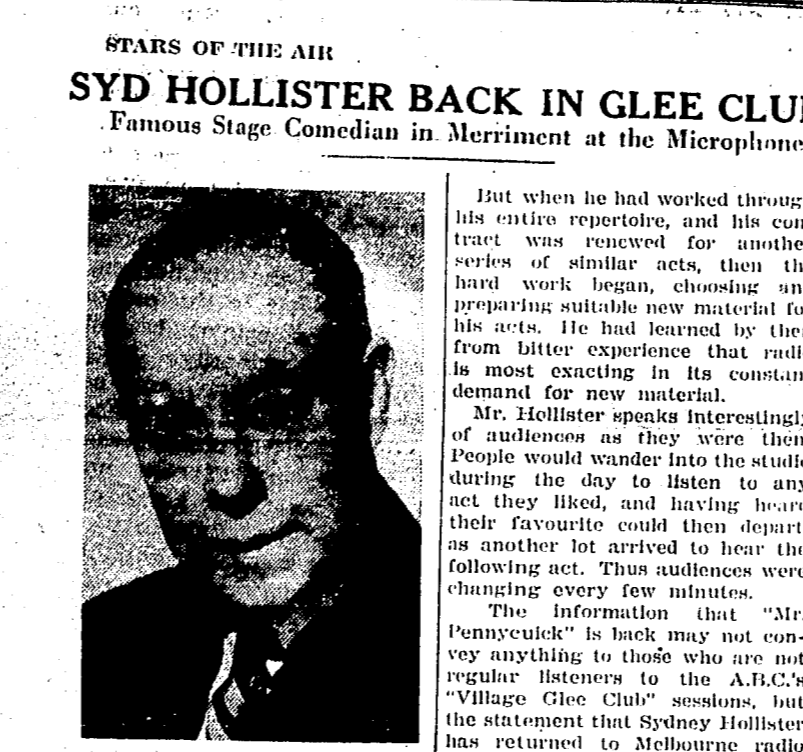
