DISTRICT NEWS

ITEMS FROM BUANGOR.

PATRIOTIC CLUB.
The Buangor and District Patriotic and Comforts Club held its annual and final meeting. The annual balance-sheet, showing expenditure of £117/13/10, was received and adopted, and the president (Mr H. H. Hooke), before closing the meeting, presented the following annual report:—This is the sixth and final annual meeting of our club. Owing to the termination of the war, activities during the year have been limited to disbursement of funds. Collection of membership fees ceased, and the small balance on hand at the end of the year was used to hold a final social gathering of service personnel and relatives. The steady flow of funds through our six years of operation, reflected the loyal co-operation of members, and during that period, the sum of £778 12/8 was disbursed amongst our local lads. I would like to record the warm appreciation of our club of the great assistance we received from the Buangor Orchestra, and the local ladies, both of whom assisted wholeheartedly at all social functions throughout the six years. It would be difficult to imagine success without the help we received from those two sections of our community. I think we can disband the Buangor and District Patriotic Club, feeling it has been a success, and has justified its existence.

PRIMARY PRODUCERS' UNION
A Primary Producers' Union meeting was held in the hall on Saturday evening, 29th June. The attendance was fair, and would have been larger had it not been for the rain. The main business dealt with was the agenda paper for the third annual conference, to be held in Geelong on Tuesday, 2nd July. Some points dealt with were:—The most suitable meeting place for annual conferences; the formation of councils to deal with business that could be satisfactorily settle, so that the main conference could be relieved of matters of lesser importance; the reluctance of the daily papers to give publicity to the doings of the Union; the need for support of all sections, woolgrowers, wheat growers, etc., to support pig raisers in their fight against the fixed price of baconers; and that a Government loan be urged for the extension of electricity, instead of such extensions being entirely dependent on profits as at present. Mr J. K. Pickford was unanimously elected as a delegate for the Buangor branch. If available, a second delegate will also attend the conference.

SCHOOL COMMITTEE.
On Monday evening the School Committee met to discuss school affairs. Arrangements were made to augment the water supply for the school garden, and to obtain a football for the boys. It was resolved that a fancy dress ball be run on Friday, 26th July, that good prizes be allotted, and that it should be widely advertised. Application was once more made to the Education Department for a grant for the building of a workshop and bicycle shed.

Death on the Roads

The June issue of "The Radiator," the RACV journal, says that the club views with great anxiety the increase in road accidents in recent months, and issues an urgent appeal to motorists to determine, as individual drivers, to exercise the greatest care when in charge of a motor vehicle and to ensure that through no act of theirs will any lives be endangered. In a leading article the journal says:—Among the multitude of wise sayings that have come down to us from the writers of the past is the adage, "It is better to travel hopefully than to arrive." That may have been good advice when it was written, but like the traffic code, it needs revision in the light of modern conditions. The numerous accidents that have occurred recently incline us to the view that the motorist should take as his motto, "It is better to arrive than to travel hopefully." There have been too many accidents for us to regard the situation without anxiety. A particularly large crop occurred on the weekend of June 1st. This, it will be remembered, was a wet week-end and one feels that too many drivers forgot that smooth tyres and wet roads do not tend to effective braking. Private car owners have not been able to obtain new tyres for several years, with the result that many covers are seen on the roads with smooth treads. The wet season is now upon us, and if we are to have fewer accidents, it is the duty of motorists to drive with the utmost care.

Finally, the RACV issues some advice to motorists in the form of some "Do's and Don'ts" for making the roads safer, which should be taken to heart and rigidly observed by all drivers. They are:—
DO keep your vehicle under such control that when an emergency arises you have time to pull up or room to manoeuvre.
DO observe pedestrian crossings and be prepared to pull up at traffic signals.
DON'T attempt to make up time under unfavourable conditions.
DON'T pull out from the kerb without first signalling and making sure that it is safe to do so.
DO anticipate that the vehicle in front of you may suddenly pull up, either due to a mechanical defect, approach to a pedestrian crossing, a traffic light or from some obstacle or person on the road.
DON'T drive at excessive speed, cut in, or keep in the centre of the road.
DO give the proper signals in ample time before turning or stopping.
DON'T forget to dip your lights when approaching other traffic at night time.
DO slow down if the approaching driver is selfish and does not dip his lights. There may be a cyclist or pedestrian on the road at the point where two cars pass.
DO drive always with that courtesy which everyone hopes and expects to receive from others.

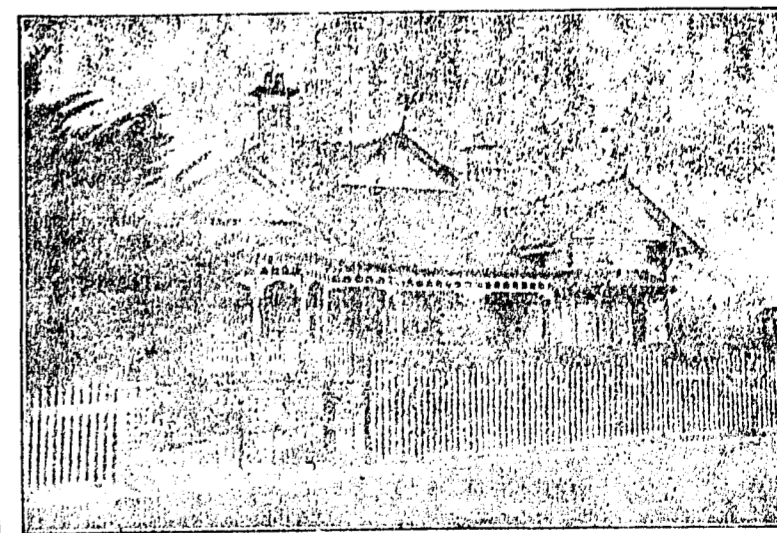

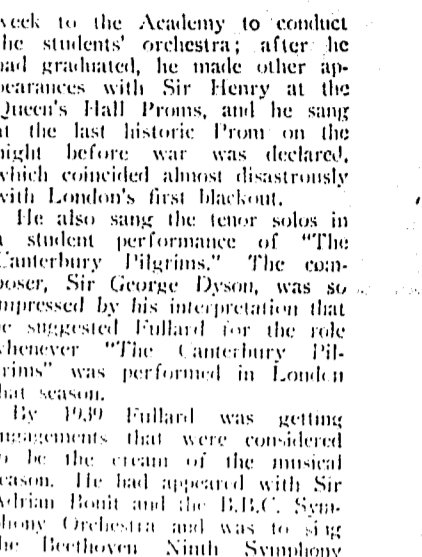

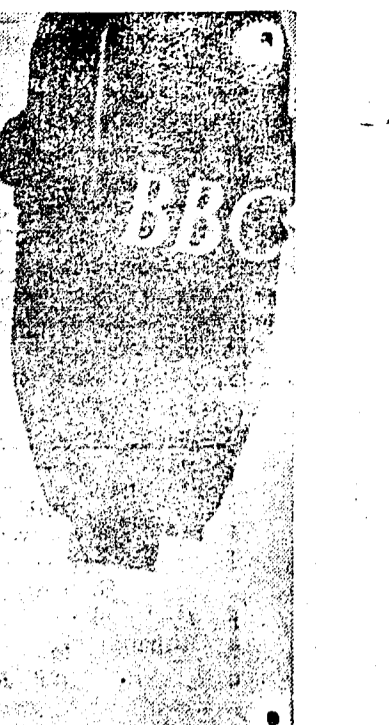

TOOLS OF TRADE

British law still will not allow a man to be deprived of the tools of trade or the equipment by means of which he makes a living. Distraint for debt cannot be taken beyond the boundary line of personal need, and the law thus recognises the essential tools of trade. Good work, however, cannot be ensured merely by that sort of protection. A tradesman must have in his kit, tools of the right kind for the work to be done; they must be kept in good order and the worker must be able to use them efficiently.

Money is a tool of trade for everybody. It enables the most complicated exchanges to be carried out. It changes the effort of a tradesman into the housing, clothes, food, education and amusement required for himself and his family and, when goods and services are available, money does this job smoothly and with the least fuss or effort. But, like any other tools, pound notes or pennies must be used efficiently. Also, they must be efficient for the job. Just as a chisel must be sharp, so a pound must have effective purchasing power. Money, in other words, is a chisel that can be blunted, and it can be blunted by clumsy use.

So it's the buyer rather than the seller who does the damage, and takes the edge off the pound note, so to speak. In the end the spender gets the blame for a "good spend" in every way production catches up on scarcity. When supply and demand are more nearly equal, then is the time for a "good spend". In the meantime, the wise course is to tuck that ready-money surplus into some form of saving, whether Government Bonds, or Savings Certificates, or a Savings Bank account, or life assurance.
