SCHOOL COMMITTEE FEBRUARY MEETING.

The Beaufort School Committee held the February meeting at the H. E. School on Monday night, when five members and the head teacher (Mr. J. L. Robinson) were present. Mr. C. W. Wyllie (chairman) presided. Correspondence was read from the Education Department, stating that expenditure had been approved for surfacing and grading work at the school.

From Mrs. F. Hainz, secretary Mothers' Club, asking committee to ascertain from the Education Department what could be done in regard to establishing cooking classes at the school. Mr. Robinson reported that the grading and surfacing work at the school ground was to be proceeded with. A stone retaining wall was also to be built. Edging asphalt was also to be repaired. With the amount of money being made available, a good deal of work could be done. It had also been suggested that the pits there be taken out. By the end of the year they should have a good playground. This was considered satisfactory.

The head teacher congratulated the Mothers' Club on their constructive suggestion in regard to a cookery class. He had been working on the lines of handcraft classes. The school inspectors were coming on the 3rd and 4th March, and he suggested that the School Committee and Mothers' Club appoint a deputation to go into a matter of cookery and hand work classes with them.

Mr. E. George moved that a deputation from the School Committee and Mothers' Club meet the secondary inspectors on Monday afternoon. S. con'd by Mr. H. A. Stowell, and carried. It was decided that the School Committee be represented by Messrs. Wyllie (chairman) and J. R. Davey (correspondent), and the Mothers' Club by Messrs. E. George and F. Wilson.

The Mothers' Club is to be writing to in reference to the proposed eradication of noxious weeds from the school plantation. The chairman invited Mr. A. Pearce and reported back to next meeting.

Mr. J. L. Robinson (head teacher) reported that the flag pole had been attended to. The flag was not in the best condition, and they would have to get a new one. It was resolved that Mr. Robinson obtain prices.

Continuing his report, Mr. Robinson said the combined district schools sports meeting was to be held on Friday, 21st March. Of the 120 delegates to be present, 118 were from the schools, 120 from the Parents' Association, and 10 from the various clubs. The audited balance sheet showed a credit balance of £27/7/11, which, together with assets amounting to £8/11/10 from the old association, disclosed a total balance of £16/10/4. Custodian liabilities, however, were £3 of three framed certificates, which are at present untraceable.

The election of officers resulted as follows:—President, Mr. J. L. Robinson; vice-presidents, Rev. J. Leach and Mr. J. McEwale, secretary and treasurer, Mr. H. K. Parker.

It was decided that the annual combined schools sports will be held on Friday, March 21st, 1947, and the association affiliated with the V.S.A.A. Club.


