Secretary's Report.
 In submitting my annual report, it will be noted on a close scrutiny of the balance-sheet compared with previous years, that the financial position is not so healthy as could be desired. Had it not been for the Government grant of £800, a considerable loss on the year's activities would have been incurred, and the incoming committee will have to give serious consideration to this aspect of affairs, and if the Hospital is to be kept open and maintained, the public generally will have to share some of the responsibility. The service that this hospital has given to the community is entitled to the best that the district can afford. With the Hospital Benefits now at 8/ per year, any slight increase in fees would not be an excessive charge, and one that would certainly be within the reach of all. Making a comparison with other centres, we have been fortunate in having for the most of the year a full nursing staff, and have been able to give a service to the community that has too frequently been overlooked. It is with pleasure I record the cordial relations that exist amongst those employed at the Hospital, and under the guidance of Sister Hughes, the nursing has been of a high order and up to the standard of former years. The work of the Ladies' Auxiliary has again been a most commendable one, and has relieved the committee of an indebtedness that would most certainly have otherwise occurred. Thanks are due to the Linton Auxiliary for their effort in supplying firewood, and the owner, Mr Kerr, on whose property the wood was cut. Water has again been one of our problems. With the winter's low rainfall, it has at times been acute. We are indebted to Mr Nunn, an active member of this committee, for his valuable help in that direction. The Committee also desire to express their thanks to the auditors, Messrs. Stewart and Loudon, who have

FOG LAMP WARNING.

Many country motorists, says the R.A.C.V. journal, "The Radiator," make use of fog lamps when driving at night. It may be news to them that they run the risk of prosecution unless they have the written permission of the Chief Commissioner of Police to use such a lamp, particularly if only one is used and it is in the middle of the car. The use of such a lamp is a breach of Section 31 of the Motor Car Act Regulations, which reads:—"No lights, except those prescribed by the Motor Car Act and these regulations, shall be carried on any motor vehicle without the approval in writing of the Chief Commissioner of Police having first been obtained." Supt. T. O. Morris, head of the Police Traffic Branch, points out that the regulations say that each motor car shall carry two headlamps, one on the left and the other on the right side of the vehicle. A light in the centre would therefore infringe this law. The use of two fog lamps, one on each side of the vehicle, would be permitted, provided they complied with the anti-dazzle regulation, but if the two fog lamps are a light, the other two headlights or parking lights must not be a light at the same time.

APPLICATIONS TO JOIN HEALTH UNION.

"Avoca Mail" reports:—The Department of Health is to be asked for its opinion whether the Shires of Ripon and Avoca should be admitted to the Central Victorian Health and Weights and Measures Unions.
