## Improvements to the School Oval

### SCHOOL COMMITTEE SEPTEMBER MEETING.

Business of importance came before the monthly meeting of the Beaufort School Committee held at the H.E. School on Monday night. Mr A. J. Hughes was voted to the chair, and five members and the Head Teacher (Mr C. V. Saunder) were present.

Correspondence was read in regard to the Dr. Vera Scantlebury Brown Memorial Appeal, and a sample of buttons for sale forwarded. Received, and 50 buttons and a supply of folders to be ordered.

From School Committees' Association, forwarding agenda paper for annual conference on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday, Sept. 26, 27, and 28. Received, and balance of affiliation fee and subscription to paper to be paid, on motion of Mrs Haintz and Mr Q. Gregory.

**HEAD TEACHER'S REPORT.**  
 The Head Teacher (Mr Saunder) reported that the top playground asphalt was in a bad state. Mr Schultz, P.W.D. Inspector, said the Public Works Department would not touch it. He thought it could be done under the Works and Building Account. He suggested that Mr W. Gillingham be asked for a quotation for the work. Heavy rain had caused stains on the walls of the school buildings, and leaks needed repairing. It was necessary that a power point be installed as soon as possible. The angles of the roof spouting on the H.E. School building had not received attention to date. In regard to the polio myelitis outbreak, being strictly carried out, and the Combined Schools' Sports House Sports, and the speech night would probably be postponed.

The Social Service League had made up 39 white woollen garments and four coloured ones to be sent to Britain, and they were on the Egg Appeal now. He reported that sheep had been put on the school oval without the authority of the chairman (Mr Wylie).

The Head Teacher also referred to the proposed improvement of the school sports ground, in regard to which nothing had been done. He thought it a good idea to put the money received from their plantations (which was worth £1200) into improving the oval. Mr Buchanan had seen Mr Godfrey and Mr Guthrie. He (Mr Saunder) had word from Mr Godfrey that money from the plantation could be spent immediately. The fact had also come to light that the Department subsidised improvements to grounds on a 4 to 1 basis. Mr Buchanan reported that Mr Guthrie could do nothing unless they submitted a plan. He (Mr Saunder) suggested that the Shire Engineer be interviewed.

The attendance was: Primary, 161; Secondary, 69; total, 230. He was trying to get an extra teacher on average attendance. If they could maintain a phone to the school residence, they would be certain to get a fourth teacher.

It was decided to get a quotation from Mr Gillingham for repairing the top playground, on motion of Mr Gregory and Dr. G. Little.

It was resolved to make further enquiries from the Shire Council about the installation of a power point, and to ask if the Council had any objection to the work being done by a qualified electrician from Ballarat.

A contractor is to be written to and asked to complete work at the school.

It was resolved to lock the gate of the school oval to stop stock being put in without authority.

Mr Saunder said there was a revenue of about £100 from the school plantation this year.

The acting-chairman said Mr Muntz had agreed to take the levels of the school plantation last June.

It was decided, on the suggestion of Mr Gregory, that Mr Muntz be interviewed by Mr Stowell (correspondent) and asked for a plan and estimate in regard to improvements to the school oval; Mr Stowell to report to Mr Wylie (chairman).

Mr Stowell said a letter had been received from the Postal Department, which was willing to consider extending the tele-better quarterly average (14).

Mr Saunder read several letters received by him in regard to the matter.

It was decided, on the motion of Mr Gregory, that the installation be approved, and the matter of the committee bearing portion of cost be discussed at next meeting.

**REPORT 1948-49**  
 "I have much pleasure in presenting this report of our Club's activities for the past year. We have 101 financial members and started the year with a credit balance of £20/6/ and ended with £140/2/, due, you must all admit, to a lot of hard work. On the motion of Mrs Dupin, an appreciative minute was placed on the books in regard to the work of the retiring committee.

It was decided to donate £25 to the Beaufort Urban Fire Brigade. Bouquets were presented to Mesdames Saddler, Duke and Parker, by Mrs Sullivan. These were made by Mrs Duncan.

**BURNING ACCIDENT.**  
 Mr James Meadows, a resident of Buangor, was severely burned at his home at about half-past seven on Saturday evening, Sept. 24. Mr Meadows threw some kerosene on a fire he was lighting, when he became enveloped in flames. He rushed to his bed and was severely burned about the arms and legs before a neighbour managed to extinguish the flames. Mr Meadows was taken to the Ararat Hospital by First-Constable Downie, where he received medical attention. — Ararat "Advertiser."

At the September meeting of the Lexton Shire Council, the engineer (Mr E. J. Muntz) reported:—

The total length from Waubra to Black Bottom road is eight miles, including one mile of north and south road. The cost with granite sand would be £2000 and I think this could be made to cover cost of several pipes. This work will have to be done and if half the cost could be obtained by a grant it would be a great advantage. The only trouble is that the council would have to provide £1000 in one year, but this would be instead of £2000 in 10 or 15 years.

No money has been provided this year for any construction on the Beaufort-Amphitheatre road. I think council should try to get at least some of this in view of the number of accidents at the Shanty bridge.

**BONUS ON FOX SKINS.**  
 At the Lexton Shire Council meeting held on Wednesday, 7th Sept., a communication was received from the Shire of Ripon, seeking information as to whether the Lexton Shire is paying, or intends to pay a bonus for destruction of foxes, and if so, what amount of bonus they intend to pay, and stating that Ripon Shire favours payment of 7/6 bonus.

After some discussion, it was decided on the motion of Mrs G. Gordon and J. Flynn, that the Council pay a bonus of 7/6 per skin for each fox killed in the shire from 15/9/49, providing that they carry fur and are reasonably well pegged out and dried, and must be brought in within 6 weeks of slaughter, the skin to become the property of the Council.

It was also decided to ask adjoining shires to co-operate. — Avoca "Mail."

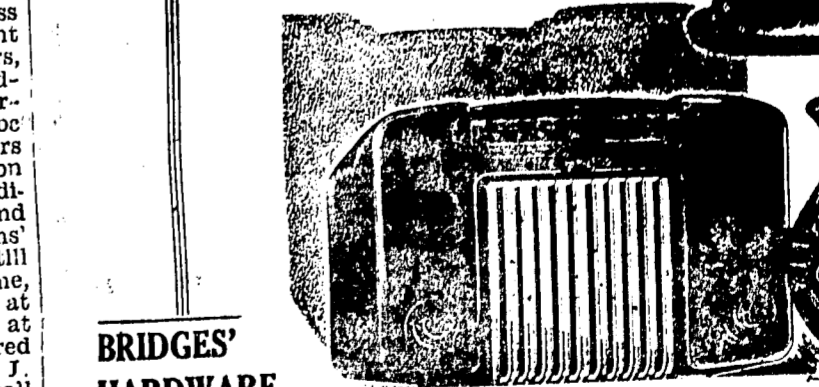

## DISTRICT NEWS ITEMS

### BUANGOR NOTES

**RURAL FIRE BRIGADE.**  
The annual meeting and election of officers of the Buangor and Middle Creek Rural Fire Brigade took place at the Middle Creek Club on Tuesday, 20th Sept. Shearing kept many away. Apologies were received for the absence of Messrs. Dyer and Mr. J. Brennan. The following were present:—Colonel Baslin, Messrs. Hooke, C. Smith, G. Brebner, E. Cameron, H. Downie, W. H. Walker, J. Hillman, C. Waldron, I. MacInnes, J. Fay, F. Linton, H. Humphrey, J. Roberts, J. Kneebone, W. Roberts, J. Crozier, D. Brennan, and H. Downie. Colonel Baslin was voted to be the chair.  
Correspondence included a letter from Emerald Bait regarding help given, re equipment of units.  
There was also a letter of appreciation from Mr. R. C. Hodgett, on behalf of the Eramore fire brigade for work done in connection with the Eramore fire last season. The brigade has been a contributing factor to the closing of the season.  
Routine letters were read, on motion of Messrs. E. Cameron and G. Brebner.  
The balance sheet, showing a credit balance of £35/3/4 at time of audit, was adopted on motion of Messrs. J. Pickford and G. Brebner.  
On the motion of Messrs. J. Pickford and H. Hooke, the secretary was instructed to write to the Country Fire Authority, 25 buildings.  
Mr. H. Downie moved and Mr. H. Hooke seconded, that a letter of appreciation be presented to Mr. Pickford's donation of an additional wireless set.  
Apparatus officer D. Brennan outlined the outline of the wireless set-up. Six operators were required and a bare minimum would be pleased to know of any other suitably interested persons who would be glad to become thoroughly familiar with the work, which had been simplified as far as possible.  
On the motion of Messrs. H. Hooke and E. Cameron, it was decided to transfer the brigade's account to a trading bank.  
The absence of Mr. Alex. MacIntyre, who has been president of the brigade for many years was regretted.  
Mr. Downie said he had rung Mr. MacIntyre's residence at 8.5 p.m., and being unable to raise him, assumed that he had left for the meeting. As Mr. Brebner would not do so, he left him a message to leave him without any responsibility. He had much pleasure in nominating Mr. Downie as president.  
Mr. Pickford and Colonel Baslin supported the nomination of Mr. Downie as president.  
Vice-presidents elected were Colonel Baslin, Mr. H. Hooke, and Mr. R. J. Waldron.  
Mr. J. K. Pickford was elected captain, Mr. H. H. Hooke first lieutenant, Mr. P. White second lieutenant, Mr. R. Dyer third lieutenant, and Mr. A. Humphrey fourth lieutenant.  
Mr. Crozier asked the position of the officers nominated in his absence, was not desirous of holding office.  
The secretary, Mr. H. Hooke, and Mr. R. J. Waldron were elected. Mr. H. H. Hooke was elected secretary, Mr. H. H. Hooke and Mr. Des. Brennan apparatus officer. Messrs. H. H. Hooke and E. Cameron were appointed auditors.  
Messrs. Pickford and Brebner and Colonel Baslin thanked the secretary for his efforts on behalf of the brigade.  
The secretary, Mr. H. H. Hooke, said, having witnessed the destruction caused by the big fires of six years ago, he felt he had a duty to see that everything possible was done to prevent such a thing in his district. The brigade would not be in the good position it is in today, but for the wholehearted support of the community given by everyone in the district. He felt the brigade was indeed fortunate to have the services of Mr. Des. Brennan, who had given up much time to build and organise the wireless section, without which the brigade could never be complete.  
On the motion of Messrs. Cameron and H. Hooke, it was decided to reimburse the secretary for the purchase of a stapling machine.  
Mr. J. Pickford moved and Mr. H. Hooke seconded, that a ball be held over, in view of the number of functions now running.  
It was decided, on the motion of Messrs. Hooke and J. Fay, that the 1st opposite the railway station at Buangor be inspected, with a view to taking precautions against a fire being started by travellers.  
On the motion of Messrs. Pickford and Downie, it was decided that a break be burnt behind the Police Station and Catholic Church.  
It was decided, on motion of Messrs. J. Kneebone and C. Smith, that the president, secretary, captain, and lieutenants be elected as a break burning committee.  
The secretary asked that any request for burning be forwarded in writing.

**HOUSE PARTY.**  
A very successful house party was run by Mr. J. Brennan, of Ballyroan, for the benefit of the Building Fund. A large crowd was entertained by Mr. Brennan, and an excellent buffet supper.

### SKIPTON JOTTINGS

**R.S.L. AND LEGION FOOTBALL.**  
A football match between members of the local R.S.L. and Ex-Servicemen's Legion was held on Saturday. The match was held on a large ground, and was watched by a large crowd of spectators. The match, which proved both entertaining and exciting, was won by the Legion, 4-7 (3-1). (Approximate time 2/10 matches will be held at Skipton.)

### DAFFODIL SHOW

The 26th annual Daffodil Show conducted by members of the Skipton Church, Skipton, was held on Saturday afternoon, 17th Sept. Nollan; and a large number of other sections. The show was a success, and the proceeds will be used for the benefit of the Skipton Hospital.

### 28750 SECURITY LOAN QUOTA

Mr. N. B. Acton, hon. secretary of the Buangor Loans Committee, said that the quota set for the town in the cash section of the Security Loan, which opened on September 6th, was £7850.  
Including advance applications, £2860 had been subscribed of this amount, and Mr. Acton anticipated that applications for the next few weeks would ensure the quota being achieved.  
Referring to the Conversion section of the Loan, Mr. Acton said that a steady flow of business had been maintained since the opening, but in view of the tremendous amount involved, £50,000,000 from nearly 185,000 subscribers, he assessed the need for early application.  
Mr. Acton pointed out that the conversion included three issues which would normally have fallen due in September, 1950, but by the optional terms under which they are issued, these were being pre-matured this year. Because of this, holders of these issues should be particularly careful to ensure immediate conversion in order that continuity of earning power should not be interrupted, as interest on these issues would cease after payment of this year's interest.  
The issues referred to include the short term 1945 Conversion and the 3rd and 4th Victory Loans.  
The district loans representative, Mr. N. M. Begg, said that the conversion of the 1945 Conversion, Mr. J. Morby, was highly gratifying with the early returns, particularly from the railway towns, many of which had already reached their allotted quotas and others, like Beaufort, would no doubt achieve their objective in the next week or so.

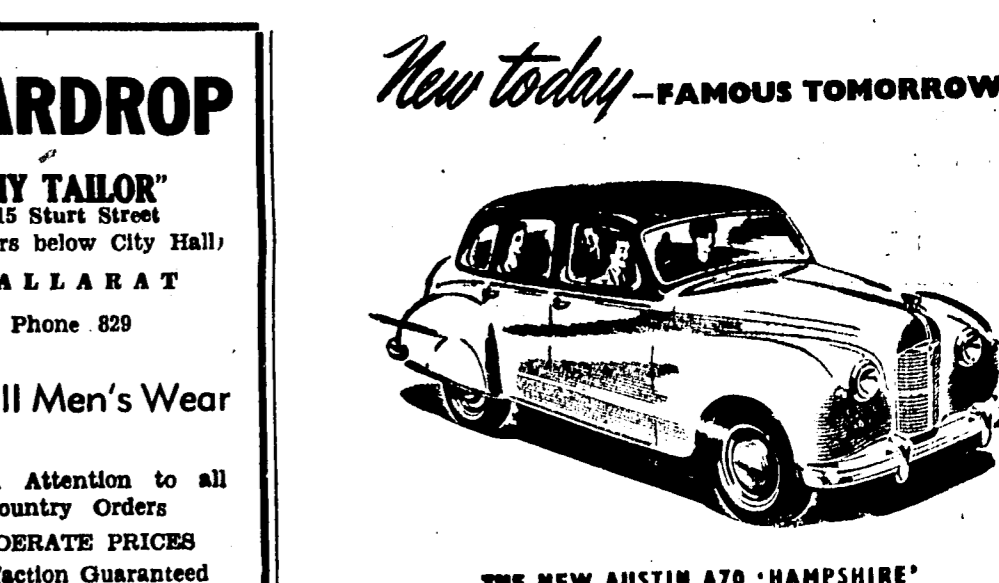

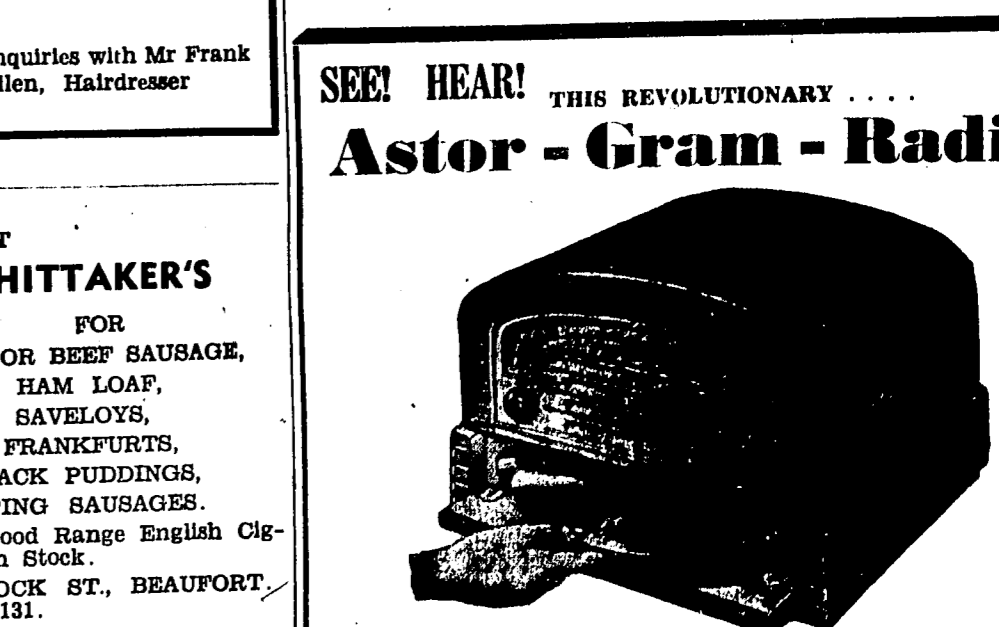


