NOTES ON THE PLAY.

In the first quarter Raglan scored 2.5 to 1.0. The play was rather one-sided; the two Raglan men running loose making it difficult for Moonambel to score. Maloney and Alan Cuthbertson goaled for Raglan, and V. S. Wright for Moonambel. A Moonambel player had his pants torn off, amidst great merriment. 

Other members mentioned that windows had been broken at the Park buildings, and damage done at a business place. It was decided to report the matter to the police.

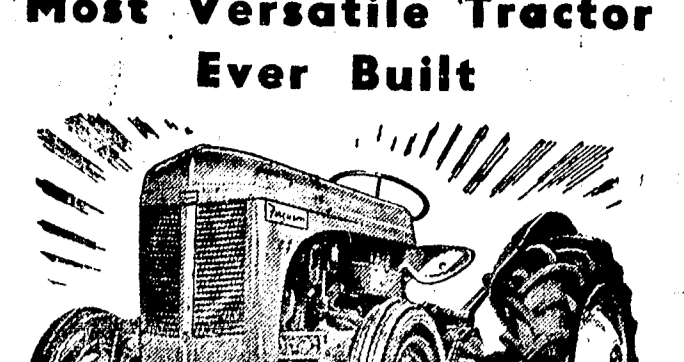

Business and Government

Fifty years ago government and business had very little to do with one another and the doctrine of a little government interference as possible held general sway. The Great Depression and two world wars have wrought profound changes on the role of government in the economic field. There is still much antagonism and suspicion in the general relations of business and government. But in the modern world both government and business must eventually recognise the indispensability of one to the other.

Two important matters have now been removed from the field of dispute. It is now generally agreed by all parties, first, that the level of employment can no longer be left to the operation of a free price market; and second, that the government must assume some responsibility for ensuring that all members of the community are provided with a decent minimum of food, clothing, shelter, education and health.

Constructive co-operation between business and government is just as vital to economic welfare and progress as the much more frequently discussed need for co-operation between management and employees. Without bold and enterprising business, government cannot hope to realise its central aims of full employment, maximum production and economic security. And, on the other hand unless government is successful in its central aim of preventing large-scale unemployment, business will suffer the losses and bankruptcies which follow inevitably from economic instability.

Some business men tend to be too sweeping in their criticism of government regulation. There is a great deal of inconsistency in the attitude of business to government. While they should always be free to criticise government policy if it is detrimental to public welfare, business men could be more selective in their criticisms and support those extensions of government activity which are clearly beneficial. It is time that both business and government started to give some hard thought on how to obtain the best results from their association.

In an age when socialism has become a powerful force, it is surprising that some government officials appear to associate the advance of socialism with the unduly suspicious attitude of businessmen. It would be a day for Australia if this tenth day of September became pronounced in the P.A. Review.

THE WAGE-EARNER'S SHARE OF THE NATIONAL INCOME.

Professor W. Prest, writing in the I.P.A. Review, says that while there are inequalities in the ownership of property in our present society, the idea of an entirely "property-less proletariat" is a dangerous myth. There seems to be a widespread assumption that rents, interest and dividends are paid to some persons other than wage and salary earners. But a great deal of property is held either by institutions, or as a supplementary source of income, by persons who are mainly dependent on wages, salaries or profits from unincorporated businesses. Institutions such as savings banks, assurance companies, friendly societies, pension or superannuation funds and trade unions are all bodies in which the wage-earner has a large stake. Therefore many employees who hold no property personally, nevertheless do so collectively through these social institutions of which they are members.

There is no doubt that the wage earner has a substantial share in home ownership. Indeed the census shows that about half the householders in Australia, own, or are in the process of purchasing, their own homes.
