Town and District Go Ahead

YEAR OF PROGRESS

The year 1950 was one of considerable progress in Beaufort and district in the primary, secondary and building industries. The Langi-Kal-Kal soldier settlement has been greatly developed, and 50 settlers are now on the land there. In the near future 7000 acres of Stoneleigh Station will be subdivided and settled; a sale of surplus stock and machinery having already been held.

Local factories and sawmills have extended their activities, and many new houses have been erected in the town and district or are in course of erection; the total built in the past three years (including Langi-Kal-Kal Settlement) being easily 100. The Training Centre for Youths at Langi-Kal-Kal is being steadily developed, and will eventually comprise 150 youths and a permanent staff of about 20 officers with their families. Mr H. C. Matthew is the superintendent. Prospects ahead of the town and district were never brighter in its 114 years' history.

THRIVING INDUSTRY

SHINING EXAMPLE OF DECENTRALISATION.

OPPORTUNITIES FOR LOCAL LADS.

One of the most thriving industries in Beaufort, and a shining example of the advantages of decentralisation, is that owned by Mr M. J. Clark in Willoby, Pratt, and Livingstone Sts., which has been turning out C. & C. Products at capacity for the past three years. The high-class furniture made at this factory has won an enviable reputation in three States, for it is being sold all over Victoria, New South Wales, and South Australia.

During 1950 the factory was greatly extended and now has 7000 ft. of floor space, and employs 16 men and four girls. Besides Australians, the staff includes a Scot, an Englishman, and a New Australian.

Mr Clark freely acknowledges his debt of gratitude to the State Development and Decentralisation Department, by whose assistance he has been enabled to develop his industry.

Mr Clark carries large stocks of upholstery material and timber; 90 per cent. of the latter coming from the local mills.

The commodious timber shed is fitted with large sliding doors to give ready access to stock. The factory and machinery have been improved at a cost of £1500.

Locally-generated electricity provides the power for individual motors, and the plant includes a modern wood-working lathe, planing machines with saws, a shaper, a band saw, dock, sanding drum, and double spindle, etc. The plant is adapted to doing everything required on the premises, and there are large polishing and store rooms. The factory is well lighted for day work with skylights and windows, and with a modern fluorescent lighting system for night work.

This industry presents a great opportunity for local lads to learn a remunerative trade, which they could, not otherwise do without going to a city to live.

The progress made by this business is remarkable — Mr Clark came here temporarily at the end of World War II. (in which he served) to do upholstery repairs in the old Golden Age Hall, and was later joined by Mr E. K. Crouch. Mr Crouch some time ago relinquished his interest in the business to start a joinery establishment of his own.

The C. & C. Products factory is a striking exemplification of the truth of the saying, "Mighty oaks from little acorns grow."

YOUTH'S SAD END

Laurence George, aged 17 years, youngest son of Mr and Mrs Ernest George, of Pratt St., Beaufort, was playing cricket on Saturday evening, 30th Dec., with companions, and called at his home and said he was going up the street. When he had not returned at a late hour, search parties went out to look for him. At about 10 a.m. on Sunday, 31st Dec., his brother Eric and Mr John Irving found him hanging dead in the school plantation. There was no apparent motive for the act, as deceased was of a particularly cheerful disposition — one of those lads who was habitually whistling and singing. Deep sympathy is felt for his parents and brothers in their sad bereavement.

Senr.-Constable A. McIntosh and F/Const. J. Duke made enquiries, and an inquest was formally opened by Mr H.J. Buchanan, J.P., and adjourned to a date to be fixed.

This is the fourth death by hanging in the district in 8 1/2 months.

THIS year Peter Dawson celebrates his fiftieth anniversary of his career as a concert singer. He was born in Australia and spent his first years in Queensland.

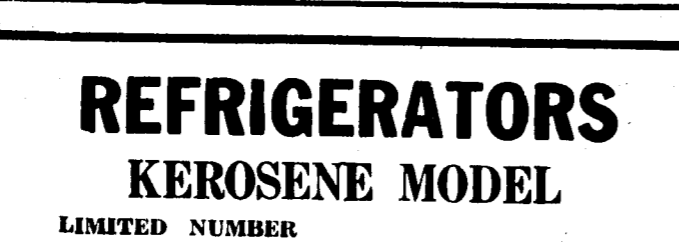


Back in Australia after yet another successful season abroad, Peter Dawson recorded ten programmes for the B.B.C. under the title 'Fifty Years of Song'.
