Cookery School to Proceed

SCHOOL COMMITTEE

Business of some importance was transacted at the monthly meeting of the Beaufort School Committee, held in the School on 23rd April. In the absence of Mr Hughes, the chair was taken by Mr Gregory. Five members were present.

Mr A. Crick said that he had interviewed Mr Butler, forest officer, who was agreeable to accept nomination as trustee of the School Endowment Plantation.

In reply to the correspondent's letter to Mr E. Morton, M.L.A., asking if proposed school works could be expedited, a letter was received from the Minister of Education, stating that:—1. Repairs would be invited at an early date. 2. Septic tank sewerage: Preparation of contract to be commenced at an early date. 3. Painting of Residence: Work to be carried out by Public Works mobile painting unit as early as practicable. 4. Conversion of Room for Cookery Classes and Provision of Shelter Shed: Tenders will be invited in three weeks' time.

A letter was read from the Education Department, stating that the Commonwealth free milk scheme had not yet been finalised, and the Department was unable to subsidise Mother's Club for milk or cocoa.

It was also stated by the Department that the plan of levelling and sowing down of school oval had been approved, and was in the hands of the Public Works Department. The dress-works pavilion plan had been returned for details and specifications to be drawn up by the engineer.

In reply to the correspondent's strong letter regarding shortage of teaching staff, the Education Department wrote, regretting that at present it was impossible to provide either a teacher of science or a woman teacher for the staff of the Higher Elementary School, owing to the unprecedented shortage of women teachers. The position was being closely watched, and every effort would be made to strengthen the staff.

Various minor repairs and renewals required were approved, and left in the hands of the head teacher, Mr Saunders, for execution.

An account for a new guard fence erected in the school playground by Mr A. Pearce was passed for payment.

Mr Thompson moved that the Shire Council be asked to improve road and gutters in front of the school. Seconded by Mr Crick, and carried.

The head teacher reported that the attendance was 193 in the primary school and 67 in the H.E. School; total, 260.

At the Ararat Shire Council meeting on Friday, 20th April (reports "The Advertiser") a letter was read from Cr. J. K. Pickford, extending to the president and councillors his sincere thanks for the good wishes conveyed to him during his stay in hospital. Received, and leave of absence was granted on motion of Crs McDonald and Dawson.

The engineer reported that gravelling had been completed on Challeum Road.

The president said repairs were needed on Coburn's Road, south of Mr W. Brebner's place.

HALL COMMITTEE MEETING.

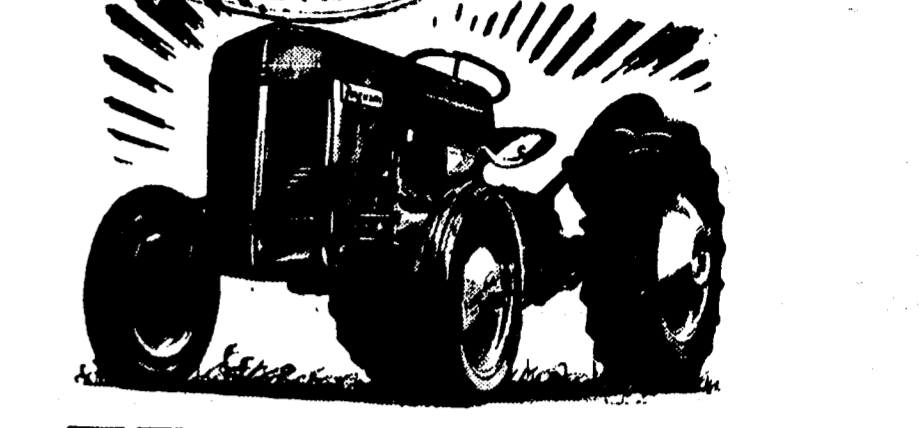
At a meeting of the Buangor Hall Committee the chair was occupied by Mr Sansom, and nine other members were present. At the conclusion of a general business a lengthy discussion of the possibilities of carrying out the proposed extensions took place. It was pointed out that the original proposal was to raise an amount of about £500 for investment until prices fell to a pre-war level, but that the continued rising costs had made the amount so far raised — a little over £800 — seem out of proportion to the likely costs and that the continued spiral of materials seemed to put the extension as planned, beyond reach. Alternative plans were then discussed at length and a plan, formulated for presentation to a public meeting for approval at a later stage. It was agreed that an architect be contacted and estimates obtained for both plans preparatory to the final plan being drawn up after consideration by the public meeting. A working bee was held to effect repairs to the main doorway, and it was found that white ants had entered portion of the building, necessitating removal of the weatherboards from the south end and insertion of six new uprights. The work was completed at the week end. A further section will be dealt with later.

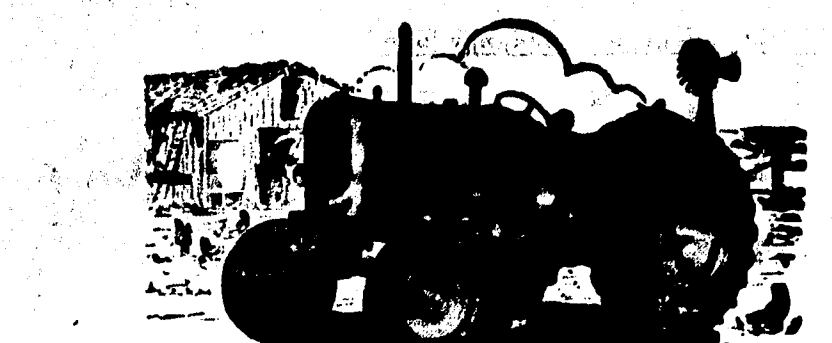

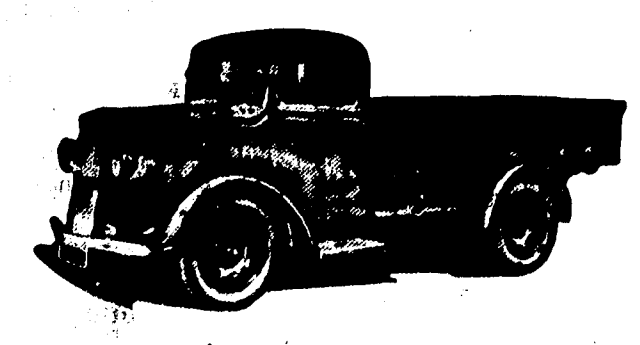

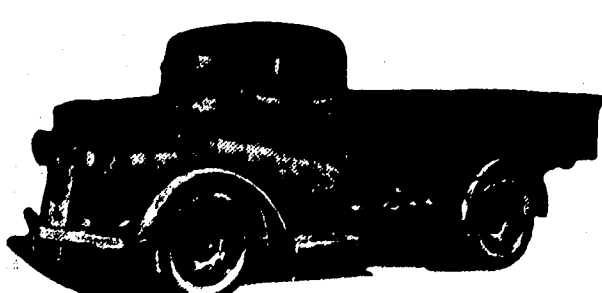
