CLOSE FINISH AT RAGLAN.

NOTES ON THE PLAY.

Although the match between Raglan and Moonambel at the Raglan oval on Saturday afternoon was little better than a scramble in the mud, it was well contested and had a close finish. Raglan won by three points.

For the greater part of the game a strong wind blew across the field, and smart showers of rain fell.

In the first quarter Moonambel scored 1.1 to Raglan's 1.0. E. Maher goalied for the visitors and G. Glenister for Raglan.

Raglan added 1.5 in the second term, and Moonambel 1.3. The Moonambel goal came from T. Wright's boot, and N. Johnson scored the maximum for Raglan.

The smallest man on the Raglan side, M. Kelly, who is as game as a sugar ant, registered a single. Raglan led by a point at half-time.

Raglan secured three behinds in the third quarter and Moonambel 1.2; their goal kicker being G. Driscoll.

At the last change Moonambel had a lead of three points, and Raglan scored 1.2 to 0.2. J. Kirkpatrick was responsible for

the home side's major point. The match finished in semi-darkness and driven rain; Raglan winning by the narrow margin of three points. Final scores:— Raglan, 3.10 (28); Moonambel, 3.7 (25).

FATAL ACCIDENT NEAR TRAWALLA

A 76-year-old man was killed instantly and five other persons injured in a collision near Trawalla on Friday, May 25, reports the Ballarat "Courier."

The injured were admitted to the Ballarat Base Hospital, where two were placed on the seriously ill list.

The fatal head-on collision occurred on the Western Highway, near Trawalla at about 12 noon.

The dead man was Frederick George Gardiner, retired, of 64 High street, Ararat. His wife, Florence Gardiner, of the same address, was admitted to hospital for observation with lacerations to the scalp and shock.

The other person in the Gardiner's car was Jean Caldwell, of 4 Sheridan Grove, South Caulfield. She was treated for a lacerated scalp and allowed to leave. Gardiner was driving his car, which was a late model English sedan.

In the second car the driver, James Bowman, 23, of Laura, S.A., was admitted to hospital with a possible fractured skull, abrasions and shock. The two seriously injured persons were Victor Blessing, 66, also of Laura, and his wife, Martha Blessing, of the same address. Blessing received a fractured pelvis and lacerations and his wife lacerations and shock. The third passenger was Brenda Bowman, also of Laura, who sustained abrasions to head and face. After treatment she was allowed to leave.

The cause of the collision has not been ascertained. Bowman's car was completely wrecked, severely shattered, and the front extensively damaged. Gardiner and Bowman towards Ballarat and Bowman towards Ararat.

The force of the impact swung both cars in towards each other, and they came to rest, side by side, and both partially facing towards Ballarat. First-Const. D. F. Anderson, of Ballarat, visited the scene and made police inquiries.

The injured were conveyed to hospital by the Ballarat and District Ambulance Service.

The district coroner, Mr D. J. Duggan, S.M., opened an inquest on Gardiner and adjourned it to a date to be fixed.

ANTI TUBERCULOSIS CAMPAIGN

What is an X-ray Survey? An X-ray Survey is a search for Tuberculosis by means of the X-ray.

The Government of the State of Victoria, along with other States of the Commonwealth has set out to eradicate Tuberculosis. This is not an idle dream.

Within the Department of Health an organisation has been created which specialises in the detection of the Disease. This organisation is known as The Division of Chest X-Ray Surveys and is the spearhead of the attack.

Only by X-ray can this dread disease be detected at an early stage of development — the most desirable time to discover it.

Unfortunately electric power of sufficient volume is not available in many far flung centres but in time this obstacle will be overcome. Since the word survey means "to determine the extent of," it is all important that the maximum number of people be examined. In order to get a high degree of coverage three sessions daily are worked and it is felt that somewhere in the period allotted to Beaufort and district there must be a convenient time for every resident young and old to attend for a chest X-ray.

The radiographs produced are read by a Radiologist and subjected to a check reading by a second Radiologist as an accurate report on your health from a T.B. point of view is essential. The Radiologist's finding is then conveyed to you by letter and is strictly confidential.

After preparation of the survey plan, the design of roads and drainage will be attended to and estimates submitted to the Housing Commission to allocate finance. It appears that extension of drainage in Burke street will be necessary to save the estate.

This procedure has been discussed with the Commission's Chief Engineer.

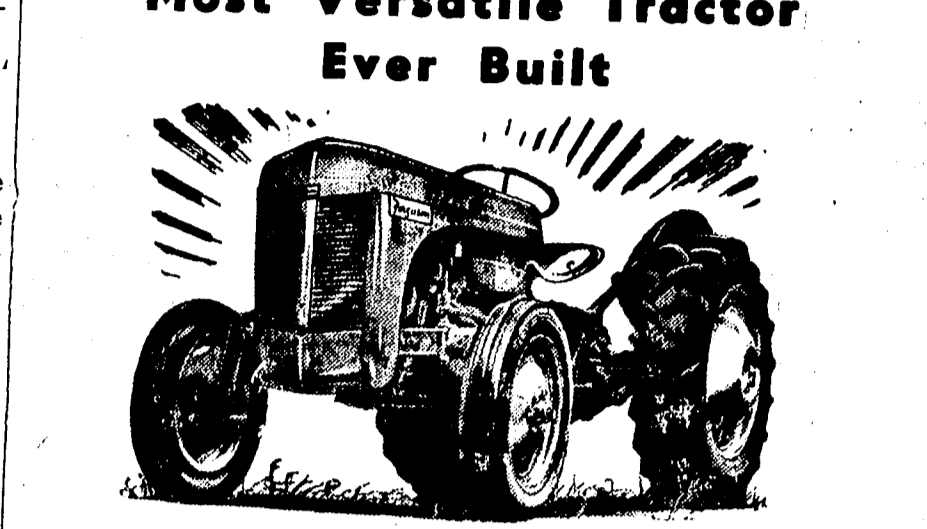

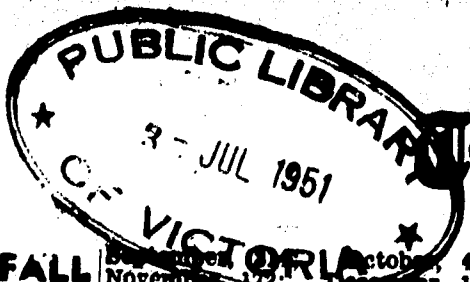

A LENGTHY LIST

A lengthy list of cases came before Mr D. J. Duggan, S.M., at Beaufort Police Court on Monday.

CARRIERS' LICENCES. Applications for carriers' licences by George Igan, Main Lead, and R. S. Pitt, Beaufort, were granted.

CASES WITHDRAWN. Two cases against defendants for non-payment of fines were withdrawn.

TRAFFIC CASES.

Inspector A. A. Fyfe, of the Transport Regulation Board, charged C. J. Loats with having, on 20th Feby., near Beaufort, been the driver of a commercial goods vehicle operating outside the prescribed radius; and with having on the same date near Beaufort, been the driver of a commercial goods vehicle and failed to carry a time card.

Inspector G. W. J. Voigt gave evidence that on 20th Feby., defendant in answer to questions, said the vehicle was owned by Elizabeth Thompson and registered in her name. Defendant admitted he had no permit, and witness thought he was a new man on the road.

The S.M. fined defendant, who did not appear, £5 for operating outside the radius and £2 for failing to carry a time card, with 2/6 costs in each case.

Inspector A. A. Fyfe proceeded against the United Poultry Farmers' Co-operative Society Ltd. for having at Burrumbeet, on 20th Feby., been the owners of a licensed commercial goods vehicle while carrying other than the prescribed goods.

Inspector Fyfe also charged A. G. Yann with having, at Burrumbeet, on 20th Feby., been the driver of a licensed commercial goods vehicle carrying other than the prescribed goods.

No appearance of defendants. Inspector Fyfe stated that Yann was driving the vehicle, and was in the employ of the Poultry Farmers' Co-op. Society Ltd. He admitted that he was carrying goods that were not licensed - iron posts.

Inspector Voigt gave evidence that at 11.30 a.m. on 20th April he interviewed the general manager of the company, who explained that they thought they had a right to carry these goods.

The S.M. - Fined £10, with 2/6 costs.

Inspector Fyfe withdrew the case against the drier.

F/Const. J. T. Bolton proceeded against Henry C. Collins for having at Beaufort on 11th April been the driver of a commercial goods vehicle and failing to carry a time card. Defendant did not appear.

F/Const. Holdsworth prosecuted. F/Const. Bolton gave evidence that at 8 p.m. on 11th April he saw defendant driving a motor truck on the Western Highway at Beaufort. He said he had no time card.

The S.M. - Fined £3. F/Const. T. R. Holdsworth charged A. He asked defendant why he rode the motor cycle when it was not registered, and defendant said he took it to get it welded. He stated that he took it down the street again because he wanted to go down there.

"The Coal Problem"

(By K. A. Cameron, formerly Chairman of the Joint Coal Board).

Despite what has been done in the last five years, the mines in N.S.W. are not yet fully equipped to produce sufficient coal to meet the demand, even if the industrial problem were solved. Lines of action towards a solution are firstly correction of the technical backwardness of the industry and secondly recognition that the industrial sabotage being directed by clever tacticians, can only be met adequately by similarly well planned tactics - not by a feudal attitude now outmoded in industrial relations. This is of paramount importance if the "agent - provocateur" is to be out-manoeuvred, and finally discredited.

It is in this sphere that management must meet its greatest challenge. Traditionally it has been mastering technical problems, but the modern human problem in industry is a new one for which management is largely unprepared. Particularly is that emphasised in the coal industry, whose background has increased the magnitude of the adverse influences. Nevertheless, as management acquires a better understanding of the human problem, and the forces which operate under modern industrial conditions, it will be solved, even in the face of the activities of the saboteurs. The modern twin techniques of industrial and public relations must be directed to convince both employer and employee that their interests are identical, and to demonstrate beyond any doubt that this common interest is not advanced by what is called Communism. To a great extent this has been done in U.K. and U.S.A. - therefore it can be done in this country, and if management is to retain its initiative, it must be done. - I.P.A. Review.

FAILED TO GIVE HAND SIGNAL AND KEEP TO LEFT

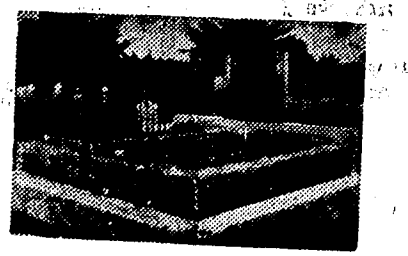

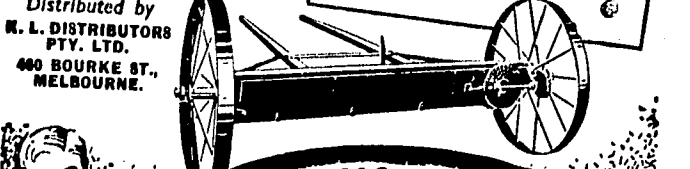
