





MONTHLY MEETING
 Matters of interest to local residents cropped up at Monday night's meeting of the Beaufort Progress Association at the Shire Hall. Eleven members were present, and Rev. A. L. Mills (president) occupied the chair.
 Apologies were received from several absentees.
TREE PLANTING
 The president reported that 30 trees had been planted and 16 had still to be planted. He thanked all those who had turned up and done such wonderful work. The Association in this work was deserving of more support from the townspeople than it received. As tree-planting was an important part of their programme, they would need more help from the townspeople in the future.
 Saturday, 29th Sept., was fixed as the date for planting the remainder of the trees, on motion of Mrs Gordon Little and Mr R. Linsten.
 The president thanked the Rural Fire Brigade for watering the trees.
 Mr H. V. Martin said the brigade would continue to water the trees. Brigade to be written to and thanked, on motion of Messrs. P. Russell and R. Pitt.
 Mr Russell suggested that they order timber and netting for next year's tree-planting. He was personally disappointed at the response of the people of Beaufort to assist at the tree-planting—only seven people from a place the size of Beaufort was shocking.
 The president thanked Messrs. Larkens and George for supplying the timber for guards.
 It was resolved that the sub-committee go into the matter of tree-planting for next year and report back to the general committee.

AVENUE OF HONOUR
 In answer to a question, Mr Linsten said the C.R.B. was in charge of the Avenue of Honour.
 Mr Russell asked why an honour avenue had not been planted for the soldiers of the second world war.
 It was decided to write to the C.R.B. for information about their plans for the Honour Avenue, and suggest that the Progress Association be responsible for its maintenance and extension on motion of Mr Larkens and Mrs H. T. Norman.
 It was suggested that the honour avenue be extended from Trawalla towards Burreumbet and through Beaufort towards Buangor. — This was added to the motion.
SCHOOL SIGNS
 Mr Pitt said the school signs were already on the highway, and he had applied to the C.R.B. to have them shifted further in.
FINANCIAL REPORT
 Mr Pitt reported a Cr. balance of £147/7/7, £109 of which was in the Kitchen Fund. There was also £17/8/4 cash in hand. — Adopted.
 In answer to a question, the secretary said there were about 68 paid up members.
PUBLICITY CAMPAIGN
 It was decided to have a booth at the show, make a drive for members, hold a publicity campaign, and exhibit a record of the association's activities, on motion of Mrs Little and Mr H. V. Martin.
 The sale of suitable buttons was also suggested, and it was understood that a button day would be held later.
 The school children are to be invited to exhibit their project on the history of Beaufort at the Association's booth at the show.
 A sub-committee was appointed to arrange details in connection with the publicity booth at the show, to consist of Mr Linsten, Mrs Little, Mrs Norman, Mr Pitt, Mr Hodgetts, and Rev. A. L. Mills.
 The sub-committee arranged to meet on Monday night.
CORRESPONDENCE
 From Shire of Ripon, stating that it had been decided to give Association the trees and £1 per tree; wandering stock request had been referred to the C.R.B. and the ranger; and signs referred to C.R.B. The Association was invited to a conference at the Park re kitchen and other improvements.
 From Ripon Dads' Association, offering their co-operation in effort to get night express to Adelaide stopped at Beaufort.
 It was decided to write, thanking the Council for their generosity in regard to the trees.
 The president said the conference at the Park decided that the kitchen be a permanent structure on the western end of the present building.
 An account for £16 for the trees is to be sent to the shire.
MECHANICS' INSTITUTE
 Mr Linsten referred to the meeting at the Mechanics' Institute being poorly attended, and a decision to close the meeting and billiard rooms.
 Mr H. V. Martin explained the changes that had taken place owing to the change-over with the library, and the increase of the back-room subscription. The place would not be closed, but was open to the present eight members, who were allotted keys. A new set-up was required to create fresh interest. The club room, which used to support the library, had fallen on evil days. Had the new room been built, as proposed, the place he believed would still be flourishing. He suggested that the Association be represented at the annual meeting in three months' time.
 After considerable discussion, it was understood that the matter would be considered before

BEAUFORT A.N.A.
 President E. K. Crouch was in the chair on Tuesday night at the Mechanics' Institute at the fortnightly meeting of the Beaufort A.N.A. Six members were present. Routine correspondence in regard to the medical benefits and chemists was received. The treasurer (Mr N. S. McLeod) reported the following credit balances:—Sick fund, £30 9/3; General fund, £26/2/9. Accounts and sick-pay amounting to £10/9/6 were passed for payment. Further details were arranged in connection with the visit of the Ballarat District Council and Director Menadue.
HIGHEST PROFIT SINCE FORMATION
VICTORIAN PRODUCERS' CO-OPERATIVE CO. LTD.
 The Victorian Producers' Co-operative Co. Ltd. show a profit in their annual balance-sheet which is the highest since the formation of the company, being twice as large as that of the previous best result. The profit, after making provision for depreciation and other contingencies was £260,201, and after providing for Income Tax £140,501. A dividend of 5 per cent. was declared and a bonus of 5 per cent. The balance to be carried forward is £10,589.
 At the annual meeting of shareholders, the Chairman of Directors (Mr J. P. Webb) said the business of the company had shown further consolidation and expansion. The turnover was the highest in the history of the organisation (£18,739,360). The issue of a further 100,000 shares in the company had been approved, and this new capital was being made available to shareholders and genuine primary producers at the original rate of £1/1/ per share. Wool prices throughout the year were on a very high level. Mr Webb commented upon the detrimental effect on the community, the primary producer in particular and our national economy in general, which the incidence of the shorter working week in secondary industry was having. Until the Commonwealth Government took this matter in hand and dealt with the situation and the forces that by devious tactics, were responsible for our lower man-hour production, there would be little if any alleviation in the present alarming inflationary position.
