Only 42% Petrol Tax Used for Roads ENGINEER'S REPORT

The engineer (Mr R. Linston) enquired as follows at the Ripon Shire Council meeting on Wednesday, 11th Feb.:-

1. GRANT WORKS: Progress can be reported on:- Cameron's Bridge (deck half completed).

2. ROAD FINANCE - PETROL TAX Revenue collected by the Federal Government from Petrol Tax during ten years, 1942 to 1952, was £18 million.

3. PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT GRANTS for Drains, Beaufort and Snake Valley, Unexpended balance of grants available is £16 plus £25 equals £41, which would finance £800 expenditure on £1 for £1 basis.

4. SHIRE WORKS attended to:- North Riding - Culvert on Chute - Raglan Road has been re-decked in concrete.

5. BACK RAGLAN ROAD - It is recommended that this road be closed to motor vehicles.

6. FIRE BRIGADE RUNNING TRACK - Draft proposals submitted for Council's consideration.

7. CLEANING OF MAIN DRAINS, BEAUFORT - Plans and specifications have been prepared and tenders called, closing 10th February, 1953.

8. ROAD FINANCE - PETROL TAX Revenue collected by the Federal Government from Petrol Tax during ten years, 1942 to 1952, was £18 million.
