Valuable Shire Gravel Deposits ENGINEER'S REPORT The engineer (Mr R. Linsten) reported as follows at the Ripon Shire Council meeting on Monday, August 17. C.R.B. Grant works: Maintenance attention has been given to Ballarat - Carnham, Darlington, Beaufort - Amalthea, Beaufort - Lexton and Skipton roads. It is expected that grant allocations will be approximately 40 per cent. of applications. Present shire work has been made for two bridges on Eurambone-Stream road near St. Marthees, and work is proceeding on formwork and reinforcement for three culverts on Stockyard Hill Road, three on Pitchoy Creek Valley road. By-pass bridge at McKenzie's, Beaufort, has been prepared. 2. P.W.D. Grant Works: Reinforcing mesh has now been obtained for gutters, slabs, and curbs, and work is progressing. It is recommended that the bridge over the Ding Dong Creek in Albert Street be reconstructed as pipe culvert and not as present bridge, as there would be savings would have to be replaced in concrete. Reinforcement obtained for slabs could be used for new bridge over the Cemetery creek at the Baths. 3. Shire Works: Works carried out were - North Riding: Sheet-piling 2 1/2 miles of Carpenter's and Panther's Lane with quarter mile of sheet-piling, 1 1/2 miles of sheet-piling (550 per mile). Maintenance grading in Beaufort streets, Chute-Waterloo road, Liston's Road, new culvert, Scherger's road, new flood-way, Beaufort - Elmhurst road, repair and repainting of fence at children's playground, drain and culvert maintenance repairs and renewals in Lawrence Street and Leichardt Street, Beaufort; two bridges patched in Rugin, Eurambone-Skipton settlement roads patched, two bridges patched in Beaufort. East Riding: Riding bridge on road outside Mr Norman Johnson's was full of potholes, which should be filled. The engineer's recommendation in reference to P. Sutton's oil deposit was approved, on motion of Cr. Watkin. Cr. Watkin drew attention to the fact that the oil deposit in Beaufort Road, Skipton, - To be written to. Gravel Pits in East Riding Cr. Watkin reported the inspection of Mr C. Smith's and Mr Bruty's land. The engineer had a truck to deal with the erosion, and it would have to be fenced in. The whole work would cost £200. He recommended that the work be done. Cr. Roddis - Mr Smith informed the Council that the erosion repair work that a gate be put through from owners. Costs of remedial works, including fencing, is estimated at £500. 7. Naminla Gravel Pit has been inspected with Mr Pletcher; a site of approximately 15 acres defined and fencing recommended.

Damage to Roads - Cr. Guthrie said it was not always carelessness but a fault in the manufacture of the implements. Raters pay to be notified by advertisement that raters will be prosecuted for damage to roads by agricultural machinery, on motion of Cr. Schlicht. Cr. Russell drew attention to the tops of culverts being interfered with and advised this to the motion, which he seconded. People taking gravel from shire pits the Council had done. The engineer said a man in the E.R. General notice to be inserted in Press warning people not to take gravel. Re drains being damaged through lack of private crossings over the drains. The engineer recommended that raters pay to be warned that if they did not put a private crossing at a gateway the Council would take action. Warning to be advertised in Press. Cr. Schlicht, asked if there were any obligation on people to put spouting on drains. The engineer pointed out that short downpipes caused erosion in at least six places in North Riding, and in these cases where an inspector should be appointed to report these matters. SCHOOL COMMITTEE

AUGUST MEETING

Matters of interest came before the monthly meeting of Beaufort School Committee on Monday night.

Five members and the Head Teacher (Mr A. Ruxton) were present, and Mr Arthur Crick presided.

CORRESPONDENCE

From J. Ahern, tendering resignation as committeeman, as he was unable to attend meetings. -- Received with regret, on motion of Messrs. E. K. Crouch and A. Crick.

HEAD TEACHER'S REPORT

Mr A. Ruxton, H.T., reported that an inspector had had a look at the electrical installations. It was reported that the Minister had stated that it was not the Department's policy to install septic tanks. The site of the new classroom, 34 x 30 ft., had been surveyed. He had a letter from the Department that the matter of making this a Class 1 school for the buildings allowance was receiving attention. The battery projector had been transferred to Trawalla School. Mr Morton, M.L.A., had written informing him that tenders had been called for a new classroom at Beaufort. The Education Department had written stating that a leaving certificate class would be established here in 1954, and every effort would be made to supply the necessary staff. The Department also forwarded a letter stating that men had been sent to restore the underground drainage system. The H.T. said they had had great trouble to locate the drains. The Public Works Department had been instructed to arrange for additional hat and coat pegs for the school. A letter from Mr Morton, M.L.A., gave particulars of the stopping and picking-up places for the secondary school bus service to Ballarat. Particulars were given of the amendment of the Beaufort - Trawalla bus service to the school to link up with the secondary school bus. -- It was pointed out that the children would have to leave Beaufort early in the morning and Ballarat late in the evening.

Continuing his report, the H.T. said the attendance was 236 primary, 72 secondary, 308 total. The medical inspection of boys was completed, and the standard of the boys compared favourably with other schools. The diphtheria immunization was conducted on several days, and those who missed out should call on Dr. Little. The Cookery class was progressing satisfactorily. Education week was to be held shortly, and a week's appeal was being made for the Save the Children Fund. -- Appeal to be supported, and left in hands of H.T., on motion of Messrs. Crouch and Wilkinson.

The H.T. said officially they had no wood; £25 being allowed for nine fire places. This had run out, and £10 worth of wood had been supplied by the Mothers' Club.

Mr Paul said he thought an arrangement could be come to about a cheaper wood supply.

Mr A. Crick mentioned an alternative scheme by getting green wood and stacking it.

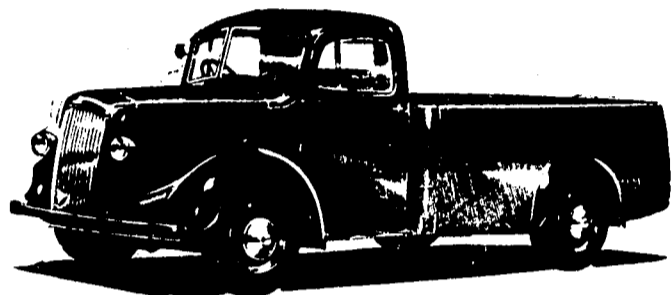

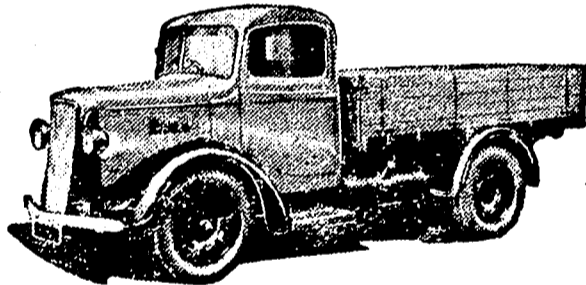
