## WATER TRUST JANUARY MEETING

The January meeting of the Beaufort Water Trust took place at the Shire Hall, on Tuesday, 26th January.

There were present Coms. R. C. Hodgetts (chairman), H. V. Martin, F. J. Blay, T. W. Schlicht and G. T. Riddoch. Messrs. R. Linsten (engineer), N. B. Acton (secretary) and S. J. Grimmer (assistant secretary).

An apology was received for the absence of Com. H. J. Buchanan.

**CORRESPONDENCE**

From State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, re crossing race at Mt. Cole, stating it would be necessary to comply with requirements of the Forest Commission. — To be proceeded with, providing cost approved by Trust.

From same, in regard investment depreciation funds, stating they could be invested in loans approved by the State of Victoria. — The secretary said there was £2000 already invested in Commonwealth loans.

Com. Martin moved a further £2000 be invested in the next Commonwealth loan immediately. Seconded by Com. Riddoch and carried.

From State Rivers and Water Supply, stating that present overdraft of £3000 should be sufficient, and asking that plans and specifications of works proposed be furnished. — The secretary said the present overdraft was £2687, and accounts totalling £180 would be passed to-night.

Mr. Grimmer (assistant-secretary) said they were indebted to the shire for £1000. The engineer recommended that the chairman and other commissioners approach the Chairman of the Commission as a deputation.

Com. Schlicht — They could try correspondence first.

Com. Martin — They could have a deputation appointed if the letter failed.

Com. Schlicht moved that in the event of the letter failing the chairman and engineer go down as a deputation. Seconded by Com. Blay and carried.

The engineer recommended that plans, etc., be not submitted until finance was approved. — Agreed to.

From J. V. Nothnagel, querying account for repairs (£4/13/6), and refusing to pay for two men doing nothing as it was one man's work; and offering to do this work as often as required for 10/-.

The engineer said the trouble was due to interference with private tapping, not old age. He took the statements of cost from the time-sheets submitted by the men.

Com. Schlicht — Mr. Nothnagel was complaining about the time taken, and Mr. Linsten said it was reasonable.

Mr. Linsten gave full details of the work required.

Com. Schlicht — He would say the men were not unduly exerting themselves.

In answer to the chairman, Mr. Linsten said it would take one man five or six hours. He would be quite happy for them to ask the plumber what was a fair charge.

Com. Martin — It looked to him as if two men could do it as well as three.

The engineer — The men were the usual gang who did the work.

Com. Schlicht — They could enquire from the plumber.

The chairman — The explanation was satisfactory, and Com. Schlicht's suggestion that they enquire from a local plumber was sound.

The Chairman pointed out that they were here to watch the Trust's own interests and those of the water users.

Com. Schlicht moved that the plumbers be written to and asked for their opinion as to the cost of the job; Mr. Nothnagel to be informed. — Agreed to.

The engineer — The report of private tapping was not the obligation of the Trust, and it should be done by a licensed plumber.

**ENGINEER'S REPORT**

The engineer (Mr. R. Linsten) reported:—

1. Headworks and Storages. — Output of Mt. Cole intake is satisfactory. Troy's level is 14 in. below full, or 13 million gallons. The booster pump at Raglan has been running for 12 hrs. per day since 21st December. Consumption for the last month was 8.2 million gallons, or approximately the same as last year. The brass strainer has been installed, and the intake at Mt. Cole cleaned out. The race from the side spring has been repaired.

2. Repairs and Maintenance. — Two breaks were mended in the 6 in. main near Raglan. Unauthorised interference occurred at a private tapping, which caused considerable loss of water. The tapping has been repaired, and cost charged to owner. The fittings removed are tabled for information. A number of breaks to service pipes has been attended to and cost charged to owners.

3. New Works. — Work has been stopped on new work due to unsatisfactory arrangements re finance. Quotations have been obtained for material needed, and will be submitted to the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission for approval after solution of the financial question.

4. Report on Headworks. — A site for additional storage has been located, and plans of the proposal are tabled. The completed report will be submitted to the February meeting.

Clause 1 — The engineer— Generally the position was satisfactory; the majority of the population observing the Trust's requirements.

Clause 2 — Adopted.

Clause 3 — Received; new works to be held over for the time being.

Clause 4 — The engineer said the proposal was to construct a reservoir that could be filled in the winter months by the race. He submitted a survey plan. The capacity would be about four times that of Troy's reservoir.

In answer to Com. Schlicht, the engineer said they could harness 60 million gals. in normal years.

The engineer, in reply to the chairman, said it might take 15 to 20 years to get this reservoir.

In answer to Com. Schlicht, the engineer said the higher storage proposed on Camp Hill would feed the higher levels of the town. They were implementing it step by step.

Com. Schlicht — The criticism was where were they going to get the water to fill it. Troy's was not filled in the winter two years ago.

The engineer — It was only a scheme to improve the pressure in the town.

In reply to Com. Schlicht, the engineer said they would definitely have to pump to fill Troy's in the winter. The main from the Mount was too small.

The engineer's report was received.

**GENERAL BUSINESS**

Accounts totalling £180/9/4 were passed for payment.

Com. Schlicht said one of their employees, Mr W. McDonald, was very ill. He was going to suggest that they call for applications for one or two men for the Trust.

The Chairman — He knew quite well that water was being taken from the standpipe at H. George's. If they locked it they never knew when they might want it in an emergency for a fire.

Com. Schlicht — They should have some control over it. It should be turned off and could easily be turned on for a fire. He moved that water standpipes be controlled and captains of the brigades have a key. Seconded by Com. Martin and carried.

Com. Blay — People wanting drinking water would have to come to the shire and pay for it.

In reply to Com. Schlicht, the engineer said the tanks at the Park would be full for the Legion sports.

A notice is to be put in the Press that the water from standpipes would be available from 4.30 to 5 p.m., on the suggestion of Com. Schlicht.

Com. Riddoch — Mrs Young complained that she had to get people to turn off water to get a supply in her storage tank.

The Chairman — The line was very bad, and it was one of the first jobs to be done. It would be noted by the Commission.

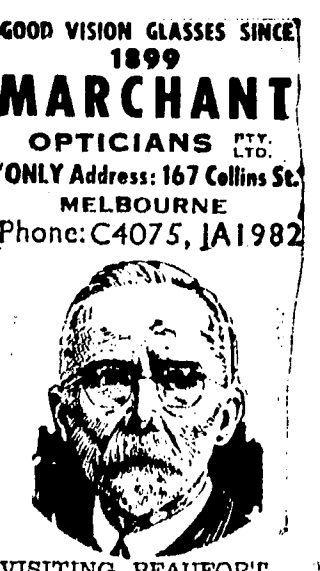
