




The need for a group of this kind was actually recognized in 1974 by Social Workers and Teachers within the area. They realized that because a number of families were on low incomes meaning that both parents had to work, there was no-one at home to supervise young children in the after school hours. Also, due to the nature of overcrowded small premises, and the number of young children in the Housing Commission flats where play space was limited and often dangerous, there was a need for supervised activities for children.

The Save the Children Fund was contacted by the municipal social worker and the idea

to pay the salary of one part time child care supervisor and \$100 a month running costs. The programme proved to be extremely successful and by 1976 there were two child care workers, (part-time), and a Kombi Van bus. This enabled the size of the group to expand and introduced the children to a range of activities which their limited environment did not allow. One of the workers thus employed, became very involved with the Women's Group and she gave them a great deal of support, encouragement and practical assistance.

started with only four children, but had steadily increased to between 25-30, which was considered the maximum which could be managed while ensuring a personalized approach. As the submission for premises was a joint one, the club arranged for the use of the house between the hours of 2-6 p.m., and used it as a base for any activities. The club has become known as a safe interesting place" for children to play as well as something they enjoy going to, the activities have included regular trips to Brunswick baths, excursions to the country, local parks, the docks and other

areas of interest. The children have joined the local library; have taken part in craft activities, and have been introduced to musical instruments, as well as a whole range of play activities. There was always a recognition however, that although the activities were important and rewarding in themselves, they would have little effect on the emotional development of the child in the limited hours they took place. Therefore, efforts were made to involve parents, and local community members as much as possible, so the children would have a sense of continuity. Many mothers actually become involved in the organization.



Huge bushfires are a common feature followed by flooding rains which wash you out.


As well, we dine and drink tea in a smoked atmosphere - everything is smoked, toast, soup, & tea. There's not much to do, except, fishing, beautiful

WINNERS -

Winners have different potentials. Achievement is not the most important thing. Authenticity is. The authentic person expresses self-reality by being, knowing, and becoming a credible person who is responsive. Authentic persons actualize their own represented uniqueness and appreciate the uniqueness of others.

Authentic persons -- winners -- do not dedicate themselves to a concept of what they imagine they should be; rather, they are themselves and as such do not use their egos, putting on a performance, maintaining pretence, and manipulating others. They are aware that there is a difference between being loving and acting loving, between being stupid and acting stupid, between being knowledgeable and acting knowledgeable. Winners do not need to hide behind a mask. They turn off unrealistic self images of inferiority or superiority. Autonomy does not frighten them.

ALL people have moments of autonomy, if only fleeting. However, winners are able to sustain their autonomy over ever increasing periods of time. Winners may lose ground occasionally and may even fail. Yet, inspite of setbacks winners maintain a basic self confidence.

Winners are not afraid to do their own thinking and to express their own knowledge. They can separate facts from opinions. They don't pretend to have all the answers. They listen to others, evaluate what they say, but come to their own conclusions. Although winners can admire and respect other people, they are not totally defined, demolished, bound or awed by them.

Winners do not play "helpless" nor do they play the blaming game. Instead, they assume responsibility for their lives. They do not give others a false authority over them. Winners are their own bosses and know it.

A winners timing is right. Winners respond appropriately to the situation. Their responses are related to the message and preserve the significance, worth, and well-being, and dignity of the person.

a time to be aggressive and a time to be passive,
a time to be together and a time to be alone,
a time to fight and a time to love,
a time to work and a time to play,
a time to laugh and a time to cry,
a time to confront and a time to withdraw,
a time to speak and a time to be silent,

To winners, time is precious. Winners don't kill it but live it here and now. Living in the now does not mean that winners foolishly ignore their own past history or prepare for the future. Rather winners know their past, are aware and alive in the present, and look forward to the future.

Winners learn to know their feelings and limitations and to be unafraid of them. Winners are not stopped by their contradictions and ambivalences. Being authentic, they know when they are angry and can listen when others are angry with them. Winners can give and receive affection. Winners are able to love and be loved.

Winners can be spontaneous. They do not have to respond in predetermined, rigid ways, but can change their plans if the situation calls for it. Winners have a zest for life, enjoying work, play, food, sex and the world of nature without guilt they enjoy their own accomplishments. Without guilt they enjoy the accomplishments of others.

Although winners can freely enjoy themselves, they can also postpone enjoyment, can discipline themselves in the present to enhance their enjoyment in the future. Winners are not afraid to go after what they want, but they do so in appropriate ways. Winners do not get their security by controlling others. They do not set themselves up to lose.

A winner cares about the world and its peoples. He is not isolated from the general problems of society, but is

To improving the quality of life.

Even in the face of national and international adversity, a winner's self-image is not "one of a powerless individual. A winner works to make the world a better place.



Our gardening section.

This Month we are going to have a try at hanging baskets. It doesn't matter if you haven't an garden at all, hanging baskets will add glamour and enhance any room.

The first thing to do is to choose a container. There is glass, plastic and fibre containers available. These may be purchased from certain plant shop or you may choose a wire container and line it with bark. This type is very popular and inexpensive. The soil used in hanging baskets should be very rich, because the plants must draw their food from the small quantity of soil within the container. indoor plant medium is suitable and can be purchased from garden shops.

The next step to take is to choose a plant. There is a large variety of plants to choose from, suitable for hanging baskets, natural trailers are seen at their best advantage in a basket.

Hedera (or ivy) has the greatest variety of basket subjects (just to name a few) There is Hedera Canariensis gold with gold to light green specks on the leaf, Hedera glacier grey green leaves variegated with white and pink edge in winter, and Hedera gold dust flecked gold and light green, also ferns make excellent basket subjects, they need more watering than most other plants, the most popular would probably be (Haiden fern) In summer take the basket down and stand it in water for a day or two, if hung in a draught or in a very sunny room it will dry out too quickly. Regular watering is ~~not~~ necessary to maintain good growth, as the plant increases in size, additional feeding is needed, a light application of balanced fertilizer.

sprinkled on the surface about once a month this should be ~~sufficient~~ sufficient, remember the soil should be moist not wet. I would just like to mention another plant that makes an ideal basket subject, its name is Ribbon Grass, it is very attractive and easily grown, it is a good idea to ask friends for cuttings, this way you can build up your indoor garden and have a much larger variety of plants Well, I hope you have enjoyed this section and until next month
