Jack came out to Australia, as a 'ten pound Pom,' arriving in May 1968 and he quickly took up a role on the trams. Jack had been on the buses in Lancashire before coming out to Australia so I suppose it was a natural move for him.


He loved his time on the tramways but was not happy with the removal of the conductors and as he had the opportunity he retired from the Malvern garage in January 1998 after just under 30 year's service.

Jack continued to live in Carnegie till he passed away on the 27th May 2010. His address was 1/16 Kokaribb Road, Carnegie 3163. A friend of Jacks, from the tramways, who attended the funeral, was a Jim MacDonald.

My mother, brother Alan and I are all very pleased that a good home has been found for Jacks tramway effects as they will mean so much more in Australia.
