eligibility criteria. To obtain a student Victorian Public Transport (VPT) Concession Card, you must be a student and must fulfil the eligibility criteria as described below.

all students must be:

- Attending a normal course of full-time study at a School/ College/Institution, registered with the Victorian Department of Education & Training as shown in the Victorian Public Transport Approved Schools and Approved Courses in Tertiary Institutions Register.

AND

- A citizen or permanent resident of Australia or a student with refugee status, a student studying as part of an approved overseas exchange program (proof required) or a student with an Australian Development Scholarship (proof required).

students are NOT eligible to obtain a VPT Concession Card if they are:

- Enrolled in a Masters, Doctorate, or other postgraduate courses.
- Overseas full-fee paying students (primary, secondary, tertiary).
- Enrolled in a tertiary course which is less than ten weeks duration.
- Enrolled in an apprenticeship course.

note:

- Debit and credit card payment facilities are available from Connex Premium stations, staffed V/Line stations and the MetShop.
- Cheques are to be made out to the appropriate transport provider endorsed with the name, address and driver's licence no. of the issuer. The identification of the person making out the cheque e.g. driver's licence or Medicare card, must be viewed by staff. Please check with staff at the issuing point prior to purchase regarding payment arrangements for cheques, debit and credit cards.
- Staff at the issuing point reserve the right to reject applications that fail to comply with the above points.

myki will soon replace Victoria's current public transport tickets, as well as your VPT Concession Card. myki will be your key to opening a simpler way to travel by train, tram and bus in Victoria.

When myki arrives, we'll send your card directly to you in the mail with a detailed guide telling you all you need to know. Throughout the year we'll also send you more information, so if you change your address you need to let us know!

how do I apply?

step 1: Complete every section under 'Your Details' on the application form and sign the 'Student Declaration'. Forms are also available at metlinkmelbourne.com.au

step 2: You'll need TWO recent passport size photographs to attach to the form. The photographs must be clear head shots taken from front on. Make sure you don't wear sunglasses, or anything that covers your face when you get your photo taken.

step 3: Take the completed form to your Principal/Bursar/Registrar or Secretary of your

- ### Conditions
1. I cannot use my school ID card to purchase a concession fare on public transport.
 2. I must carry my student concession card when travelling on a concession fare and present it on request.
 3. I understand if my Student Pass is lost/stolen I have to report it and wait for a new card to be issued which may take up to 14 working days. I must pay for tickets in the interim.
 4. Lost, stolen or mutilated VPT Concession Cards, Passes and Date-to-Date Tickets may only be replaced at the place of purchase. A replacement fee applies. A completed 'Application for Replacement Periodical Ticket' form, witnessed by the police, must be provided before a lost/stolen/mutilated VPT Concession Card, Pass or Date-to-Date Ticket is replaced. No refund will be given for charges on duplicate VPT Concession Cards, Passes or Date-to-Date Tickets. Originals, if found, must be returned to the place of purchase.
 5. I understand that my VPT Student Concession Card, Pass, Date-to-Date Ticket or myki can only be used by me and is not transferable to others.
 6. I understand that it is my responsibility to ensure I continue to meet



your 2007 Victorian Public Transport Concession Card

By completing this form you'll register for your 2007 Victorian Public Transport Concession Card (VPT Concession Card). This is the card you need right now to travel on a student concession fare.

You must carry your card with you at all times when travelling with a concession ticket or student pass.

Remember, you'll need to use your 2007 VPT Concession Card until myki arrives.

how will myki work?

When you receive your myki concession card in the mail, it will arrive with your photo ID and your student pass (if purchased) already on it. Once your myki concession card has a student pass or top-up value, it will be ready to use on trains, trams and buses throughout Victoria. myki will be simple to use. Just scan on when you board any bus, train or tram and then scan off when you reach your stop - scan on/scan off. Whether you're travelling to school, university or hanging out with mates, myki will always calculate your best fare based on your concession fare, every time. And like a pre-paid mobile phone card, you can simply top-up myki any time.

School/Institution and ask them to sign the 'School/College/Institution' Declaration and overstamp ONE of the photos and the form with the official School/College/Institution 'stamp' if you meet the eligibility criteria (see over).

step 4: Next, take the form with the appropriate payment to an issuing point for processing (see the form for locations of VPT Concession Card issue). This will be your temporary concession card until your myki concession card arrives. Payment for VPT Concession Cards and Passes may be made by cash, cheque, debit or credit card (not all outlets).

Definition of "Public Transport Authorities"

- "Public Transport Authorities" means:
- The Transport Ticketing Authority
 - The Secretary to the Department of Infrastructure (DOI), Director of Public Transport and any officer of Public Transport Division within DOI who has duties relating to Public Transport ticketing
 - Any agent, contractor or delegate of any of the above including Metlink or a Public Transport Operator (train, tram and bus operators).
