
FISHERMAN'S BEND-CITY (VIA INGLES ST.) Bus Route Nos. 57-64






FOOTSCRAY STATION—SUMMERHILL RD. (VIA BALLARAT RD.)




FOOTSCRAY STATION-RUSSELL STREET



FOOTSCRAY STATION—WILLIAMSTOWN ROAD








NORTHCOTE (VIA ST. GEORGE'S RD.)—CITY Route No. 9^A

Luggage, parcels or packages exceeding in the aggregate 56 lbs. in weight, or 36 x 18 x 12 inches in dimension are not permitted.

Luggage, parcels or packages exceeding in the aggregate 28 lbs. in weight are not to be carried on Motor Omnibuses.

CHARGES FOR CARRIAGE OF NEWSPAPERS

The charge to be made for parcels of Newspapers addressed to Newsagents and carried upon any Tramway of the Board shall be one adult fare for each parcel separately addressed not exceeding 281bs, in weight, and two adult fares for each parcel exceeding 28 lbs, but not exceeding 56 lbs, in weight. Parcels exceeding 56 lbs, in weight or 36 x 18 x 12 inches in dimension are not to be carried. The above fares will be paid by Prepaid Fares Stamps affixed to parcels. Stamps are to be checked for correct value and then defaced.

CARRIAGE OF SMALL TYPE FOLDING BABY CARRIAGES ON BUSES

Small Type Folding Baby Carriages may be carried Free on Buses subject to the following conditions:-

(a) The small type Baby Carriages must be closely folded (Unfolded Carriages will not be carried)

- (b) Their transport is to be at the discretion of the Operator or Conductor and provided there is room on the Bus without inconveniencing Passengers
- (c) Not more than four folded Baby Carriages will be allowed on any one bus at any one time
- (d) Carriages must be closely folded ready to be placed on buses upon their arrival at stopping places

The periods during which they may be carried are the same as those specified for Trams.

Crippled or Sick children in prams attending Hospitals, Clinics, etc. for medical treatment may be carried on TRAMS or SPECIAL PRAM BUSES, on production of a PERMIT or HOSPITAL CARD and payment of ordinary fare for pram.

A fare check ticket to the value of the fare paid is to be issued in exchange and where necessary, cash change is to be given.



The tickets are to be accepted at their full face value in payment of fares at ordinary rates and appropriate Check Tickets issued in exchange.

In cases where the value of tickets tendered is in excess of the fare for the journey travelled. Change is not to be given, but Check Tickets to the full face value of the tickets are to be issued, and the tickets paid in to the Depot Revenue Office where they will be credited as cash.

SPECIAL TICKETS FOR PENSIONERS AND INDIGENT PERSONS ATTENDING HOSPITALS

These tickets, which are brown in colour, with bronze blue lettering, are printed in the respective fare denominations and issued by the State Health Department to Pensioners and other indigent persons for journeys by tram or bus to and from Hospitals for medical treatment.

The tickets are to be accepted at their face value in payment of fares at ordinary rates and appropriate fare check tickets issued in exchange.

The numbers and fare values of each denomination of tickets received are to be entered by Conductors on their revenue journals and the tickets handed in to the Depot Revenue Office where they will be credited as eash.

CONCESSION FARES FOR SCOUTS, ETC.

Boy Scouts and Girl Guides in full uniform are permitted to travel at Children's Fares, irrespective of age. This does not apply to adult officers.

The uniforms worn are as follow:-

Boy Scouts:---"Baden Powell" hats; shirts in khaki, blue or green; dark knickers and puttees or stockings; scout badge worn on left breast pocket; scout belt.

Wolf Cubs:-Green cap with gold edgings; jersey in green or blue, scarf or neckerchief; wolf cub badge on left breast.

Sea Scouts:-White sailor cap; jersey in blue with words "Sea Scouts" written across; scout badge on left breast; scout belt and scarf.

Girl Guides: — Either light blue or white shirts, navy skirts, or navy blue dress with leather belt; "G.G." on shamrock shaped badge; coloured tie, according to company; black shoes and stockings; and with or without navy blue felt hat.

SUNDAY MORNING SERVICES

Ordinary fares are chargeable on all cars, other than "All-Night" cars, providing Sunday morning services.





DESCRIPTION AND ILLUSTRATIONS OF BOOKLET PASSES EMPLOYEES' FREE BOOKLET PASSES

Each of these Passes has the year during which it is available printed thereon and the name and occupation of the Employee concerned written on the inside. Those issued to female employees have the letter "F" overprinted both on the inside and outside.

The size of the Pass when folded is 21 x 25 inches.





BLIND PERSONS' AND BLINDED SOLDIERS'

These Passes are similar in size to those issued to the Board's employees, but are of a different colour. They have the year of issue printed thereon and the name of the person to whom issued written on the inside.

Those issued to Blinded Soldiers have a white band overprinted on the outside, and the words "Blinded Soldier — Attendant carried Free" overprinted on the inside.

In the case of Passes issued to Blind Persons who are not ex-Servicemen, attendants accompanying them are required to pay the ordinary fare,





LIMBLESS AND DISABLED SOLDIERS, TOTALLY AND PERMANENTLY DISABLED SOLDIERS, AND T.B. SOLDIERS, SAILORS AND AIRMEN

The Passes issued to the Servicemen in the above categories are similar in size and design, and are approximately 2³/₄ inches wide by 4 inches deep when folded.

They are issued on a yearly basis as from the 1st July of one year to the 30th June of the following year.



FARE CONCESSION CERTIFICATES FOR VISITING SISTERS AND DISTRICT VISITING NURSES

These Certificates are issued on a yearly basis to Visiting Sisters of "The Company of Our Lady" (Red Certificate) and the Melbourne District Nursing Society (Pink Certificate) and permit the holders to travel at Children's fare rates on the Board's Trams and Buses.

The name of the Sister or Nurse is written inside the Certificate, and the holders must show the Certificates to the Conductors when paying fares.

The year of issue is stamped on the inside and outside of each Certificate, the size of which, when folded, is approximately $4\frac{1}{4} \times 2\frac{1}{4}$ inches.


