


'OPERATION EXODUS'

FOR VICTORIA AND POSTERITY

TRAMS EVERLASTING?

The Tramway Museum Society of Victoria Limited was established in 1963 as a non-profit company with the aim of preserving for future generations, a collection of operable vehicles illustrating the history of the trams that have served the people of Victoria over the past 85 years. It is the policy of the Society to demonstrate the various types of traction - horse, cable, electric and to represent nearly every past tramway operator or undertaking.

At Ballarat and Bendigo, we are fortunate in having a number of cars still operating, which have come from now defunct tramway operators. As these cars are the only survivors to illustrate the early tramways of Victoria, the Society must make every effort to acquire such cars before they are lost forever. Of the cars we will obtain form the S.E.C. systems, only three are to remain in their present state. The remainder will be transformed back to the condition and livery in which they entered service under different ownership, over 50 years ago.

To be converted to an open cross bench car in the livery of the Electric Supply Co. Ltd. (Bendigo).

This bogie car is to be restored as car No. 26 of the extensive and historically important Prahran & Malvern Tramway Trust. To remain as representative of a typical S.E.C. bogie car,

acquired from the Melbourne tramway system.

All donors will be appropriately acknowledged at the new museum in a permanent record of gratitude.
