

ST. PATRICK'S DAY.

Procession and Sports.

The annual celebration of St. Patrick's day will be held to-morrow, and the arrangements are in the hands of a committee representative of the different Roman Catholic and national societies. A procession, which will start at 1.30 p.m. from St. Patrick's hall, and march to the Exhibition along Bourke-street and Evelyn-street, will be headed by Archbishop Mannix and the Roman Catholic clergy in cars. The pupils of various Catholic colleges and schools, and the societies and national organisations, will march, and will display banners and tableaux. A shield has been given by the Hibernian Society for marching, and other prizes for processional features will also be awarded. Fourteen bands will play selections.

At the Exhibition oval 7000 children will give physical exercises, plume and Swedish drills, and form tableaux descriptive of The Three-Leaf Shamrock and the Australian Boomerang. Under the direction of Mr. T. A. Dennett, choral numbers will be sung by 3500 boys and 1500 girls. There will also be dancing competitions, a tunnel ball display, and a contest for hurlers. At night pedestrian and motor track cycling events will be contested. The proceeds of the demonstration are devoted to the Roman Catholic schools.

The annual St. Patrick's night concert will be held in the Town Hall on Friday, 17th March, and a programme of musical, elocutionary and dancing items will be given. Archbishop Mannix will preside and give an address.

Tramway Arrangements.

During the progress of St. Patrick's day procession to-morrow trams whose routes include Bourke-street, Swanston-street or Elizabeth-street will be stopped in the city only from 1.20 p.m. for about an hour, but will continue to run on their suburban sections to points as near as possible to the city, as follows:—Northcote, Clifton Hill and Nicholson-street cars to the junction of Gertrude and Nicholson streets; Brunswick and North Melbourne cars to the intersection of Lonsdale and Elizabeth streets; Camberwell, Toorak, Glen Iris, East Malvern, Elsternwick, St. Kilda Beach and Albert Park cars to the intersection of Flinders and Swanston streets; North and East Coburg cars to the shunt opposite the Public Library. The cars on the West Melbourne route will be stopped during the progress of the procession.

The Kew, Hawthorn, Preston, Mont Albert, Essendon electric and Carlton, North Melbourne, South and Port Melbourne cable lines will be affected.
