CIRCULAR.

Dear Sir,

Confirming Press announcements, I desire to inform you that, in connection with the second Anniversary of the death of General Sir John Monash, G.C.M.G., K.C.B., V.D., B.A., D. Eng., L.L.D., arrangements have been made for a Pilgrimage to his grave at Brighton Cemetery on Sunday next, 15th inst. at 3.30 p.m.

It is hoped that all sections of the community will be well represented.

Returned Soldiers, past and present members of the Defence Forces, representatives of the University of Melbourne, Institutions, Clubs and other Organisations, etc. with which the late Sir John Monash was associated are requested to assemble on the vacant land adjoining the NORTH wall of the Brighton Cemetery in Hawthorn Road at 2.45 p.m. sharp. There is a tram stopping place quite close to the assembly point; therefore it will not be necessary to proceed as far as the tram terminus (Hawthorn and North Roads) before alighting.

The assemblage will be formed up under the directorship of Brigadier-General J. C. Stewart, C.M.G., D.S.O., V.D., assisted by Staff Officers of the Anzac Day March Ceremonial. The Director and Staff Officers will wear white arm bands.

Two representatives of each body (Association, Club, etc.) should report to General Stewart not later than 2.30 p.m.

On completion of the forming up, the various bodies accompanied by Guides will be marched through the NORTH WEST gates of the Cemetery (Hawthorn Road) to positions assigned them in proximity to the grave.

With a view to preventing trespass on, or damage to graves and their surroundings, it is specially requested that those attending the Pilgrimage will adhere to the positions assigned them - on Cemetery pathways.

A short service will be conducted by Chaplain the Rev. J. Danglow, V.D., M.A., and the commemorative address will be delivered by Major-General T. A. Blamey, C.B., C.M.G., D.S.O., G.O.C., 3rd Division.

The incidental music, under the directorship of Mr. W. Darwin, F.R.G.S., will be rendered by the Brighton Municipal Band.

There will be no Offertory or Collection.

Permission has been granted for the wearing of uniform; medals and decorations will be worn by those in uniform and may be worn also with plain clothes.

On completion of the service, those assembled will "stand fast" until marched off (past the grave) as indicated by the Director and his Staff Officers.
