fall on top of each other, they said. Passenger Logan Chang Garvey was left with a bleeding nose after being thrown from his seat.

"The glass on the door shattered and I instantly fell off my seat onto the glass," he told Nine News.

"We had to walk off quickly because the electric current is still running."

Resident Michael Munson heard the "massive crash" from his lounge room.

"It sounded like someone's kitchen falling apart," he told Channel Seven.

The road was closed for hours as

police investigated the incident. Tram services resumed at 4.15pm.

A Yarra Trams spokeswoman said the tram was taken back to the depot for investigation.

"There's a significant amount of damage to the side of the tram and the front part that went into the fence," she said.

"Derailments aren't very common and as you can imagine it takes a lot of force to derail [a tram], so our safety team will do a full assessment and our engineers will then perform the necessary repairs."

The spokeswoman said it looked as though the tram could be salvaged.
