We're upgrading two William Street tram stops so everyone can catch the tram.

This will make using Route 58 easier for everyone – including passengers who are vision impaired or using wheelchairs, prams, and other mobility aids.

It will also provide better connections to key health, business, and tourist areas.



Stops 5 and 7 on William Street in Melbourne's CBD will be upgraded to improve safety and accessibility.



Other key Route 58 stops are already accessible including those at the Parkville hospital precinct, along St Kilda Road, and Melbourne Zoo.

Better facilities

The new stops will see the floor of the tram meet the platform, enabling everyone to get on and off the tram safely and easily.

The platforms will feature new shelters, seating, improved lighting, and passenger information displays.

They will also enhance safety by separating passengers from traffic and trams through more pedestrian crossing points, and new collision barriers and fencing.

Better connections

Upgrading Stop 5 – Bourke Street/William Street, and Stop 7 – Flagstaff Station/William Street will improve connections between Flagstaff Station and some of Melbourne's key health facilities including The Royal Melbourne Hospital, The Royal Women's Hospital, Peter MacCallum Cancer Centre, and the Royal Children's Hospital.

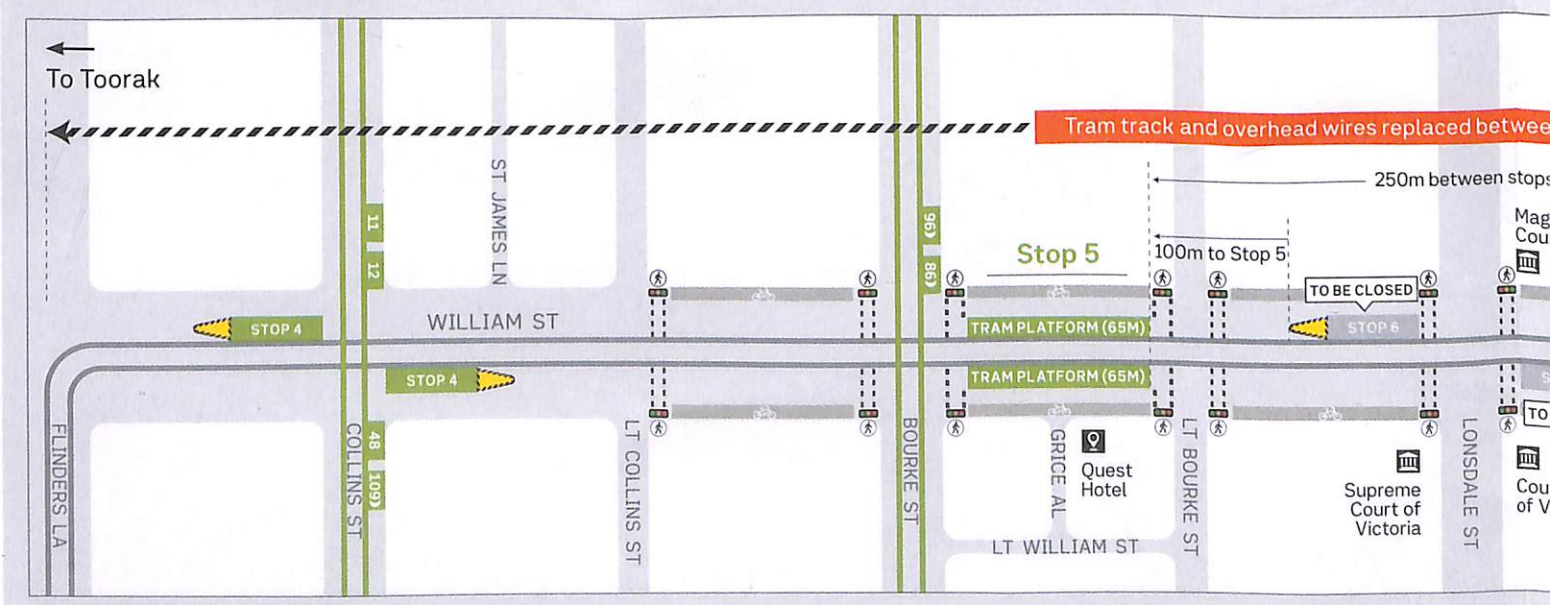
Route 58 also connects to important business and tourist destinations, including the Shrine of Remembrance, Melbourne Zoo, Queen Victoria Market, the City, Southbank, and Toorak; and with tram services on other routes in the CBD.

Other changes to William Street

As the new stops are longer and closer together Stop 6 (Lonsdale Street/William Street) will be closed.

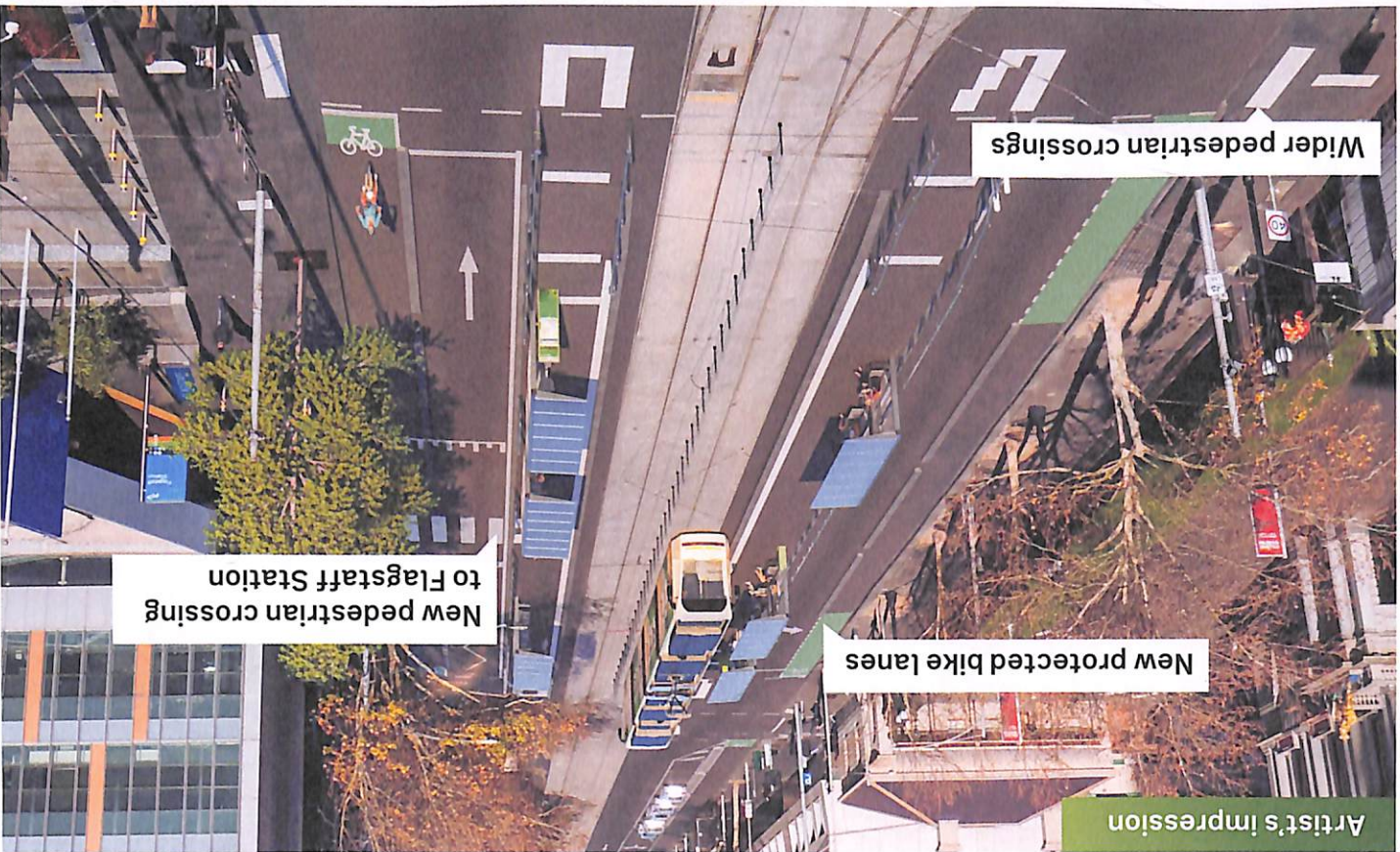
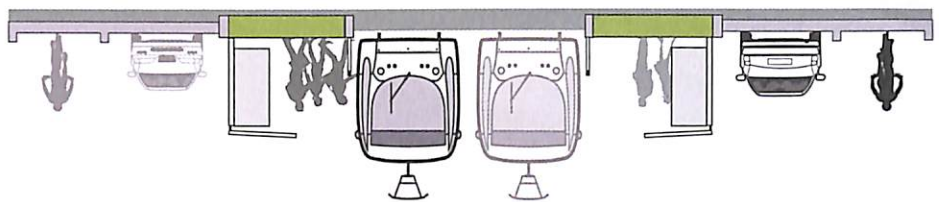
Car parking will also be reduced to make space for the new tram stops, support traffic flow, and enable new protected bike lanes to be built. We are working with the City of Melbourne to relocate some specialty parking spaces (i.e. loading zones) to nearby side streets.

Overview map from Flinders Lane to Dudley Street

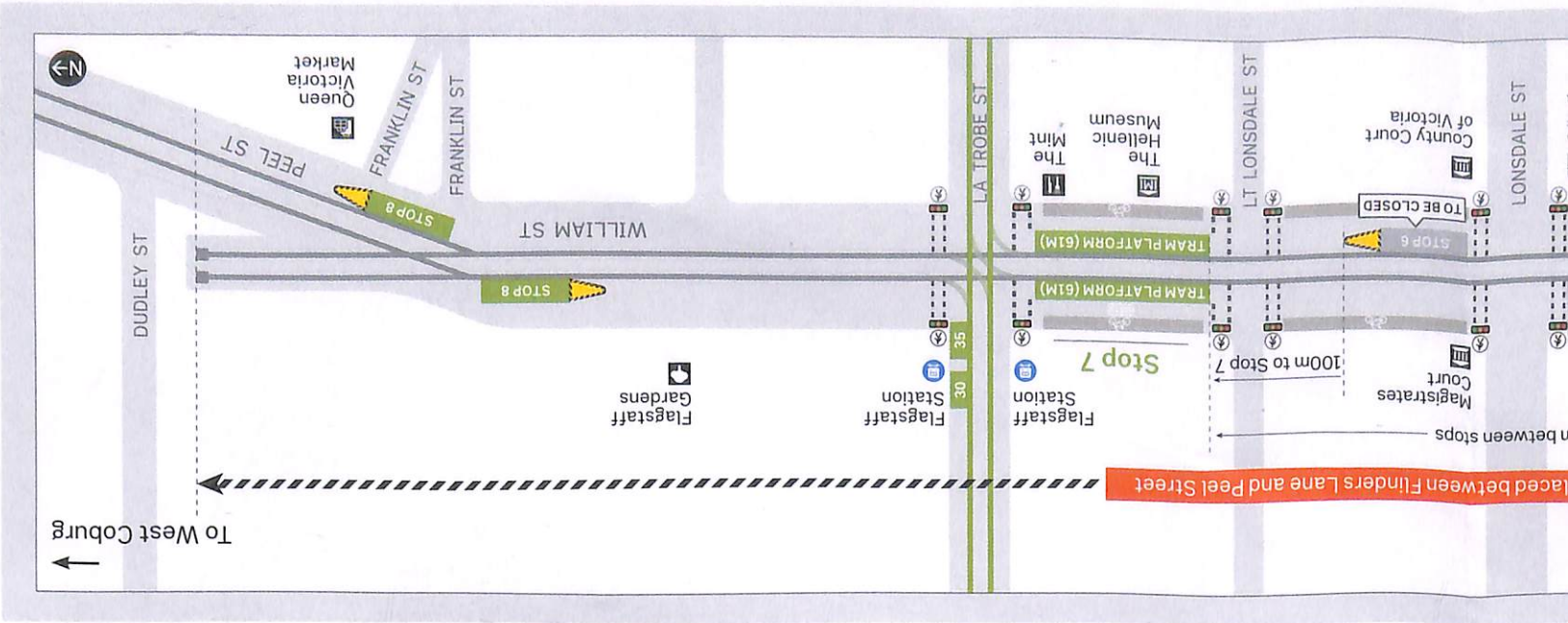


Cross section of parallel platform tram stop

Parallel platform stops are built by raising the tram stop to give level access to the tram. These stops separate passengers, vehicles and bikes, improving safety.

Construction

Major works are planned for a two week period from late November until early December.

To allow our workers to get in and out quickly and safely, temporary closure of William Street and nearby streets

may be required. Pedestrian access may also be restricted or detoured.

At the same time, Yarra Trams will be renewing the tram tracks and overhead wires along William Street.

The new protected bike lane will also be constructed along William Street as a part of these works.

Doing these works together reduces the need for separate road closures and impacts on the community.
