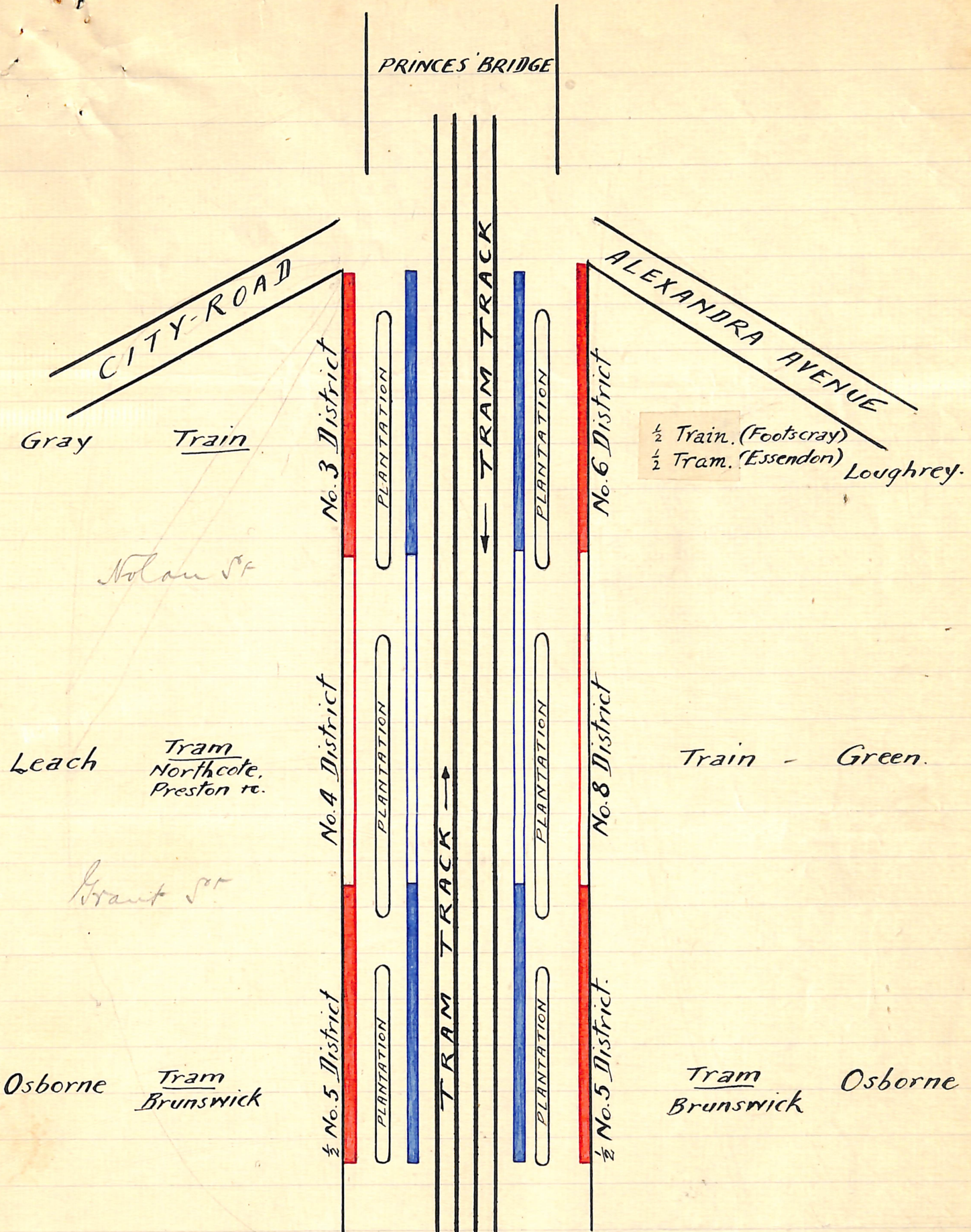

Arrival of Lord Huntingfield (State Governor designate)
Monday 14th May 1934

At 10.0 am the party moved off in Motor cars along the prescribed route. The first stop being at the Blind Institute's "Strong post" in St Kilda Rd. & Monbray St. (a delay of about 4 Minutes) then proceeded along St Kilda Road to Domain Rd. (South African Soldiers Memorial) where the Mayor of South Melbourne (Mr. A. W. Wallace) delivered an address of welcome to which His Excellency responded. From 10.19 to 10.36 am St Kilda Road cars were diverted via Park, Hanna & Sturt Streets to M.C. a Shunt but after party moved from Domain Rd. all traffic including trams was delayed by Police for a further 5 Minutes & then permitted to proceed Citywards via St Kilda Road. The first tram was shunted at Plinders Street @ 10.55 am on account of address of welcome outside portico of Melbourne Town Hall, and normal running was resumed at 11.0 am with very fair headways. Swanston St. cars were again delayed from 12.18 to 12.22 pm (4 mins) as party returned from Parliament House (After Swearing in Ceremony) to Government House.

HIS EXCELLENCY the RIGHT HONORABLE LORD HUNTINGFIELD, K.C.M.G.
as GOVERNOR of VICTORIA

MONDAY, 14th MAY, 1934.

7. 0 a.m. R.M.S. "Maloja" berths at Station Pier, Port Melbourne
9. 0 a.m. The Premier will call on His Excellency the Governor-designate and Lady Huntingfield on board "Maloja".
- 9.15 a.m. His Excellency and Lady Huntingfield (accompanied by family and staff) will trans-ship, with the Premier, to Launch and proceed to St.Kilda pier.
- 9.40 a.m. Arrive at St.Kilda Pier. Salute of 17 guns on His Excellency's official landing.

Met by representative of His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, and State Ministers, Leader of the Opposition, Un-official Leader of the Legislative Council, District Naval Officer, Base Military Commandant, and representative of R.A.A.F., who will be presented to His Excellency by the Premier.

Naval Guard of Honor on Pier. His Excellency will inspect Guard.

Navy League Sea Cadets will line Pier from Naval Guard to Arch. At the Arch, the Premier will present the Officer-in-Charge to His Excellency.

At shore end of pier, the Premier will present His Worship the Mayor of St.Kilda. The Mayor will present Councillors and their wives. Bouquets will be presented to Lady Huntingfield and her two daughters.

An Address of Welcome will be presented to His Excellency by the Mayor and Councillors of St.Kilda and His Excellency will reply.

When His Excellency moves off from the point of reception towards his car, a choir of State School children will sing a song of welcome, accompanied by the St.Kilda City Band.

When His Excellency reaches his car, the National Anthem will be sung.

10. 0 a.m. His Excellency and Lady Huntingfield will enter their car and move off accompanied by a Military Escort. Members of the Official Party in their cars will follow.

Procession will proceed along Lower Esplanade in an easterly direction, returning along the Upper Esplanade; turn into and proceed along Fitzroy Street.

Strong posts of State School children will be formed in front of St.Kilda Park School and at St.Kilda Junction (No. halts).

Procession will turn into St.Kilda Road and proceed along the centre track.

10.22 a.m Children of the Royal Victorian Institute for the Blind will assemble at Moubray St. Bouquet will be presented to Lady Huntingfield. (Stop for one minute. His Excellency and Lady Huntingfield will not leave their car).

Strong post of State School children will be formed at the corner of Commercial Rd. and St.Kilda Rd. (No halt).

10.30 a.m At Albert Road, cars will swing on to the western motor track, and stop for 5 minutes at the South African War Memorial. An Address of Welcome will be presented to His Excellency by His Worship the Mayor and Councillors of the City of South Melbourne. Strong post of State School children will be formed. (His Excellency will not leave his car).

10.35 a.m. Cars will proceed, returning to the centre track.

Ten thousand State School children will be assembled along St.Kilda Rd., south of City Rd. (No stop).

The procession will pass over Princes Bridge and continue along Swanston Street.

On crossing Collins St., the escort and the first three cars will swing over to the eastern side of Swanston St.

The remaining cars will turn to the right and proceed in an easterly direction along Collins St. to Parliament House, entering at Gisborne St. gate.

His Excellency's car will draw up outside the portico of the Melbourne Town Hall.

- 10.45 a.m. An address of welcome will be presented to His Excellency, in his car, by the Rt. Hon. the Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Councillors of the City of Melbourne. His Excellency will reply. (His Excellency will not leave his car).
- 10.50 a.m. His Excellency's car and escort, and cars Nos. 2 and 3, will leave Melbourne Town Hall and proceed by way of Bourke St. to Parliament House.

Proceedings at Parliament House.

- 10.40 a.m. The Hon. Sir Frederick Woolaston Mann, the Acting Chief Justice of the Supreme Court, will arrive at Parliament House and be received by the Usher and conducted to the South Library.
- 10.45 a.m. His Excellency the Lieut.-Governor and Lady Irvine, accompanied by Police Escort, having proceeded via Princes Bge., Swanston St and Bourke St. will arrive at Parliament House. His Excellency the Lieut.-Governor will inspect the Guard of Honor. His Excellency and Lady Irvine will be met by the Usher and the Serjeant-at-Arms and conducted to Queen's Hall where they will be received by Mr. President and Mr. Speaker, who will escort His Excellency to the Library and Lady Irvine to Mr. President's Room.
- 10.55 a.m. His Excellency the Governor-designate will arrive at parliament House. (His Excellency does not inspect Guard of Honor on arrival). State School children with their teachers will be assembled on the steps and will greet His Excellency and Lady Huntingfield as they pass.
- His Excellency and Lady Huntingfield will be met by the Usher and the Serjeant-at-Arms at the carriage-way and conducted to the Queen's Hall where they will be received by Mr. President and Mr. Speaker who will conduct His Excellency to meet the Lieutenant-Governor in the Library and Lady Huntingfield to Mr. President's Room.
- The Usher will conduct the ladies assembled in the President's Room to their seats in the Council Chamber.
- Ministers enter the Chamber from the back and occupy the front benches.
- The Serjeant-at-Arms will conduct the Judge to his seat in the Council Chamber.
- The Serjeant-at-Arms will conduct Mr. Speaker and the Usher will conduct Mr. President to their seats in the Council Chamber.
11. 7 a.m. His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, accompanied by his staff, and preceded by the Serjeant-at-Arms, will enter the Council Chamber. The Serjeant-at-Arms will announce His Excellency from the Bar of the House and conduct him to the Vice-Regal Chair on the dais.
- 11.10 a.m. His Excellency the Governor-designate, accompanied by his staff, and preceded by the Usher, will enter the Council Chamber. The Usher will announce His Excellency from the Bar of the House and conduct him to a seat on the right of the Vice-Regal Chair.

The Private Secretary will hand His Excellency's Commission to the Clerk of the Executive Council who will read the same.

His Honor the Acting Chief Justice will administer the Oaths of Office.

His Excellency will then take the Vice-Regal Chair which will be vacated by the Lieutenant-Governor.

The Proclamation announcing His Excellency's assumption of the office of Governor of Victoria will be signed by His Excellency and by the Honorable the Premier.

The orchestra will play the National Anthem and a salute of 17 guns will be fired immediately after the proclamation has been signed by His Excellency.

11.20 a.m.

His Excellency and Lady Huntingfield will then take up a position on the right of the dais and all those present will be presented to His Excellency in the following order:-

Members of the Legislative Council will be presented by the Honorable the President.

Members of the Legislative Assembly will be presented by the Honorable the Speaker.

Wives of Ministers will be presented by the Hon. the Premier.

All other guests will be presented by the private Secretary, and are requested to have their names clearly written, printed or typed on cards to facilitate the announcement of their names on presentation to His Excellency.

All guests in the Council Chamber and in the Galleries will remain in their places until they are requested by an official to proceed to the reception. After being presented guests will pass out of the Council Chamber and will then proceed to the Refreshment Rooms where morning tea will be served.

12 noon

His Excellency and Lady Huntingfield (with family and staff) leave Parliament House.

His Excellency will inspect the Guard of Honor.

The cars (3) and escort will proceed via Spring St, Collins St, Swanston St. and St.Kilda Rd. to Government House

12.20 p.m.

His Excellency and Lady Huntingfield arrive at Government House.

Boy Scouts will line the route from St.Kilda Rd to the new site of Government House Gates. Girl Guides will line the route from Government House Gates (new site) to Government House.

State School children, assembled on the lawns in front of the building, will welcome His Excellency and Lady Huntingfield.

NOTE: (a) A halt of one minute will be made at the Royal Victorian Institute for the Blind. Halts, each of five minutes, will also be made at the South African War Memorial and the Melbourne Town Hall.

(b) After entering their car at St.Kilda, His Excellency and Lady Huntingfield will not leave it until they arrive at Parliament House.


